## What is the Index of Multiple Deprivation?

The IMD is the official measure of relative deprivation for small areas in England (known as LSOAs). It focuses on income poverty as well as deprivation more broadly across 7 different 'domains' of deprivation.

#### What is the Index of Multiple Deprivation?


The IMD is a *relative* measure of deprivation. This means it measures how areas in England compare to each other. It is not an *absolute* measure of deprivation, so it doesn't tell us about the absolute numbers of people and households in poverty and how this has changed.


A new 2019 Index of Multiple Deprivation was released on 26<sup>th</sup> September 2019. Presented are some headline findings. More detailed analysis and a PowerBi dashboard will follow.



# So what's the story in 2019?

Barnsley is the 38th most deprived area in England according to the 'average score' measure. This averages the overall deprivation scores of LSOAs within a Local Authority.







## Has our position changed?

This depends on the measure used. Two of the headline measures indicate that, relative to other LAs, Barnsley is less deprived in 2019 than it was in 2015. The average score measure indicates that Barnsley is slightly more deprived.



Average rank (averages the rankings of each LSOA within all 317 local authorities)	37	38	+1
Average Score (averages the overall deprivation score of LSOAs within an LA)	39	38	-1
Rank of proportion of LSOAs in 10% most deprived nationally	32	35	+3

1= most deprived in England, 317=least deprived



## How does Barnsley perform on the seven domains?


Below are the rankings for Barnsley relative to the other 316 Local Authorities using the 'rank of average score' by domain (where 1=most deprived, 317=least deprived).





# Overall Index of Deprivation – Borough Map


This map shows each LSOA by National decile of deprivation, with the darkest areas being amongst the 10% most deprived LSOAs in England.



# **Education, Skills and Training**



Darker areas of the map indicate higher levels of deprivation. This is the domain in which Barnsley is *most* deprived, ranking **15/317** nationally in terms of average score.




# Barriers to housing and services



Darker areas of the map indicate higher levels of deprivation.


This is the domain in which Barnsley is *least* deprived ranking **311/317** nationally in



#### Income




Darker areas of the map indicate higher levels of income deprivation. Barnsley ranks **43/317** nationally in terms of average score.



# **Employment**


Darker areas of the map indicate higher levels of employment deprivation. Barnsley ranks **27/317** nationally in terms of average score.



#### **Health and Disability**




Darker areas of the map indicate higher levels of health deprivation. Barnsley ranks **22/317** nationally in terms of average score.



#### Crime




Darker areas of the map indicate higher levels of crime deprivation. Barnsley ranks **31/317** nationally in terms of average score.

Darker areas of the map indicate higher levels deprivation. Barnsley ranks **304/317** nationally in terms of average score.
