




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Introduction and Purpose

The data within this report are from the latest available as of May 2018. It compares the Area Council with Barnsley and that of England where possible.


This information is intended to support Area Councils to identify some of their strategic priorities and commission services to meet these challenges.

Demographics


Overall Population



Barnsley's population has been growing constantly since 2001. Since the 2011 Census, the resident population of the North East area has increased by 5.2%, whereas across Barnsley there was a 4.9% increase. These increases were mainly due to more births than deaths and international migration.




Age Profile and % of Total Population




In 2011, less than 1 in every 100 North East area residents' main language was not English.



Proportion of North East Lower Super Output Areas (LSOAs) in 10% Most Deprived in England


LSOAs in 10% Most Deprived in England LSOAs not in 10% Most Deprived in England





% of Pupils Achieving a Good Level of Development 2013 - 2018





% of Pupils Achieving the Expected Standard in the Phonics Screening Check at the End of Year 1 2015 - 2018




The percentage of pupils resident in the North East area achieving the expected standard in 2018 decreased and is now below both the Barnsley and national averages.




% of Key Stage 1 Pupils Achieving the Expected Standard 2016 - 2018

Average Progress 8 Score at the End of Key Stage 4 2016 - 2018






The percentage of secondary school pupils eligible for and claiming a free school meal in the North East area increased slightly in 2018 and remained above both the Barnsley and national averages.

% of Pupils with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities 2018















Under 75 Mortality (rate per 100,000 population)








Just over half of women in the North East area (52.9%) breastfeed their babies at birth; slightly lower than the Barnsley rate of 55.6%.

Smoking




Just over one in four adults in the North East area are smokers. Rates have been consistently higher than the rates for Barnsley at each time point during the period 2013 to 2016. The current rate of 25.5% is the lowest since 2013.



The North East area's smoking related deaths rate (346.2 per 100,000 aged 35+) is lower than the Barnsley rate of 353.0 and is the lowest during the period 2011-2013 to 2014-2016.


Residents Living Alone and Aged 65+ Years





More than 6 in every 10 properties are owned with a mortgage or owned outright in the North East area. Ownership is about the same for Barnsley overall and slightly above the national rate.



In 2011 there were more than 1 in 5 social rented homes in the North East area; slightly above the Barnsley rate and significantly higher than nationally.

In 2011, more than 1 in 10 properties within the North East area were private rented; slightly below the Barnsley rate and significantly below the national.







There has been a continual notable reduction in the rate of Anti Social Behaviour (ASB) in Barnsley, changes in crime recording practices implemented by South Yorkshire Police in October 2016 have steadily reduced the number of ASB incidents. Offences that would have previously been recorded as ASB are now recorded as criminal offences where applicable.




Average Speed by Wards (Mbps) in the North East area


Country of Birth






There were slightly fewer road traffic collisions in 2017 compared to 2016, but 27 people were killed or seriously injured. There are no regional or national data for comparison.
