We still feel that these areas warrant greater attention, emphasis, and possibly resources, to influence other areas of activity and make the greatest impact overall.



The data within this report are from the latest available as of May 2018. It compares the Area Council with Barnsley and that of England where possible.


This information is intended to support Area Councils to identify some of their strategic priorities and commission services to meet these challenges.

Demographics


Overall Population



Barnsley's population has been growing constantly since 2001. Since the 2011 Census, the resident population of the South area has increased by 4.2%; similar to the increase for Barnsley overall (4.9%). These increases were mainly due to more births than deaths and international migration.



Age Profile and % of Total Population




In 2011, less than 1 in every 100 South area residents' main language was not English.



This is calculated based on seven domains of deprivation, which in turn are composed of a number of indicators that are scored and ranked to produce an overall domain score.


Proportion of South Lower Super Output Areas (LSOAs) in 10% Most Deprived in England





% of Pupils Achieving a Good Level of Development 2013 - 2018







The percentage of pupils resident in the South area achieving the expected standard in 2018 increased with outcomes now above both the Barnsley and national averages.




% of Key Stage 1 Pupils Achieving the Expected Standard 2016 - 2018






The percentage of secondary school pupils eligible for and claiming a free school meal in the South area increased slightly and remained above the national average but below the Barnsley average in 2018.

% of Pupils with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities 2018





Life Expectancy at Birth







Under 18's Conceptions







Under 18 conception rates in the South area have been lower than the rates in Barnsley for the last three time points. The 2015 rate of 32.3 is the lowest since 2011.


Under 75 Mortality (rate per 100,000 population)



The South area's cancer mortality rate for persons aged under 75 years has decreased since 2010-2012 but remains significantly higher than the Barnsley and England rate.




The South area's under 75 mortality rate from respiratory diseases (43.1 per 100,000) is higher than the Barnsley rate of 41.8 per 100,000. Rates have fluctuated during the period 2012-15 to 2014-17.




The South area's under 75 mortality rates from cardiovascular diseases have been consistently higher than the rates in Barnsley during the period 2010-2012 to 2015-2017. However, rates have reduced at each time point and the current rate of 90.3 per 100,000 is the lowest during the period.

The proportion of 4-5 year olds in the South area who are overweight or obese (20.3%) is higher than the proportion in Barnsley overall (18.0%). The current rate is consistent with the previous year.






Just over half of women in the South area (55.6%) breastfeed their babies at birth; equivalent to the Barnsley rate.



Just over two in five adults in the South area are smokers. The current rate of 23.2% is slightly lower than the


Related Deaths per 100,000 (Over 35's)


Residents Living Alone and Aged 65+ Years

Private Rented




In 2011 there were 12.8% of properties within the South area which were private rented; the same as the Barnsley rate and significantly below the national rate.








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
% of properties by Council Tax band





Crime (rate per 1,000 population)






There has been a continual notable reduction in the rate of Anti Social Behaviour (ASB) in Barnsley, changes in crime recording practices implemented by South Yorkshire Police in October 2016 have steadily reduced the number of ASB incidents. Offences that would have previously been recorded as ASB are now recorded as criminal offences where applicable.


The ASB rate for the South area is lower than the overall rate for Barnsley, but higher than the national rate.






Average Speed by Wards (Mbps) in the South area



Country of Birth







Mortality Rate from Causes Considered Preventable (rate per 100,000 population)






The mortality rate from causes considered preventable in the South area is higher than those of Barnsley and England.


Excess Winter Deaths Index


