




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Introduction and Purpose

Barnsley Council is continuing to change how we work together for a 'Better Barnsley'. We have ambitious plans to improve and grow as identified in our Corporate Plan for 2017-2020. Overall Population



Barnsley's population has been growing constantly since 2001. Since the 2011 Census, the resident population in Central ward has increased by 9.6%; almost double the rate of increase for Barnsley overall (4.9%). The increase in population is mainly due to more births than deaths and international migration. There are slightly more males compared with females within the ward.



In 2011, 1 in every 100 Central ward residents' main language was not English; equal to the rate for Barnsley overall.


The age profile of the population is changing both locally and nationally. Central ward has a higher proportion of 19-64 year olds than both Barnsley and England.

Barnsley's ethnic diversity continues to change. In the 2011 Census, 9 out of 100 people in Central ward were from a Black and Minority Ethnic (BME) group compared to 4 in every 100 people in Barnsley overall. The 2011 Census is the most up to date national data available on ethnicity.



Percentage of Central Ward LSOAs in the Bottom 10% in England by Domain








% of Pupils Achieving a Good Level of Development 2013 - 2018

% of Pupils Achieving the Expected Standard in the Phonics Screening Check at the End of Year 1 2015 - 2018






The percentage of pupils resident in Central ward achieving the expected standard in phonics screening increased in 2018 and is now above the Barnsley average and just below the national average.



% of Key Stage 1 Pupils Achieving the Expected Standard 2016 - 2018



Average Progress 8 Score at the End of Key Stage 4 2016 - 2017





The percentage of primary school pupils with special educational needs and disabilities in Central ward decreased in 2018 and is now below both the Barnsley and national averages.





Life Expectancy at Birth




Life expectancy at birth for women in Central ward is 0.6 years lower than for women in Barnsley. The current rate is the lowest since the period 2012-2014.

Under 18's Conceptions




Under 75 Mortality (rate per 100,000 population)



Central ward's under 75 cancer mortality rate (173.3 per 100,000) is higher than the Barnsley rate of 152.4 and is the highest during the period 2010-2012 through to 2015-2017.




Under 75 mortality rates from respiratory diseases in Central ward have fluctuated during the period 2010-2012 to 2015-2017. The current rate of 45.9 per 100,000 is higher than the overall Barnsley rate of 41.8 and is higher than all periods from 2011 - 2013.




Under 75 mortality rates from cardiovascular diseases in Central ward have fluctuated during the period 2010-2012 to 2015-2017. The current rate of 52.3 per 100,000 is significantly lower than the Barnsley rate of 87.0.

Excess weight




The proportion of 4-5 year olds in Central ward who are overweight or obese (19.7%) is higher than the proportion in Barnsley overall (18.0%).




64.7% of women in Central ward breastfeed their babies at birth; this is higher than the Barnsley rate of 55.6%.



Smoking



One in four adults in Central ward are smokers. Rates have been consistently higher than the Barnsley rates at each time point during the period 2013 to 2016. However, the current rate of 25.8% is the lowest since 2013.


Related Deaths per 100,000 (Over 35's)



Central ward's smoking related death rates have been consistently lower than the rates for Barnsley overall during the period 2011-2013 through to 2014-2016. The current rate of 332.4 per 100,000 (over 35's) is the lowest during the period.


The 2011 Census showed that 11.6% of households in Central ward contained residents aged 65+ years that were living alone and could be at risk of social isolation.










More than half of the properties in Central ward are owned with a mortgage or owned outright. This is lower than both the Barnsley and England rates.










Less than 1 in 5 properties in Central ward are social rented; lower than both Barnsley and England.


More than 1 in 4 properties in Central ward are privately rented. This is more than double the overall Barnsley rate and more than 10% higher than the England rate.

Properties are banded into one of eight valuation bands (A to H, with A being properties of lowest value to H being the highest). These are decided by the government's Valuation Office which determines the amount of council tax to be paid. The chart shows that there are more Central ward households in Bands A and B compared to Barnsley and England.



















There has been a continual notable reduction in the rate of Anti Social Behaviour (ASB) in Barnsley, as changes in crime recording practices implemented by South Yorkshire Police in October 2016 have steadily reduced the number of ASB incidents. Offences that would have previously been recorded as ASB are now recorded as criminal offences where applicable.

The ASB rate for Central ward is higher than both the Barnsley and England rates. The Central ward is an area of high density population and figures include the town centre and transport interchange.

All crime figures relate to the period January 2018 to December 2018.









Access to a Car or Van




Mortality Rate from Causes Considered Preventable (rate per 100,000 population)
