We still feel that these areas warrant greater attention, emphasis, and possibly resources, to influence other areas of activity and make the greatest impact overall.





Age Profile and % of Total Population




Barnsley's ethnic diversity continues to change. In the 2011 Census, 4 out of 100 people in Darfield were from a Black and Minority Ethnic (BME) group; almost the same as Barnsley overall. The 2011 Census is the most up to date national data available on ethnicity.

Demographics **Indices of Multiple Deprivation 2015**

This is calculated based on seven domains of deprivation, which in turn are composed of a number of indicators that are scored and ranked to produce an overall domain score.

Proportion of Darfield Lower Super Output Areas (LSOAs) in 10% Most Deprived in England


LSOAs in 10% Most Deprived in England LSOAs not in 10% Most Deprived in England

The Seven Domains of Deprivation and how Darfield Performs


Percentage of Darfield LSOAs in the Bottom 10% in England by Domain



Index of Multiple Deprivation 2015 Darfield LSOAs Relative to England (DCLG, 2015)




% of Pupils Achieving a Good Level of Development 2013 - 2018












The percentage of pupils resident in the Darfield ward achieving a good level of development increased in 2018. Outcomes are now above both the Barnsley and national averages.

% of Pupils Achieving the Expected Standard in the Phonics Screening Check at the End of Year 1 2015 - 2018






The percentage of pupils resident in the Darfield ward achieving the expected standard in 2018 increased with outcomes now above both the Barnsley and national averages.




% of Key Stage 1 Pupils Achieving the Expected Standard 2016 - 2018









The percentage of secondary school pupils eligible for and claiming a free school meal in the Darfield ward increased and remained above both the Barnsley and national averages in 2018.


% of Pupils with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities 2018



The percentage of primary school pupils with special educational needs and disabilities increased slightly in the Darfield ward in 2018 and remained above both the Barnsley and national averages.


The percentage of secondary school pupils with special educational needs and disabilities increased in the Darfield ward and is now above both the Barnsley and national averages.

Life expectancy at birth for males in Darfield is 0.9 years higher than for men in Barnsley and 0.3 years higher than England




Under 18's Conceptions






The under 18 conception rate in Darfield is lower than the overall Barnsley rate, and is the lowest during the period 2011 to 2015.


Under 75 Mortality (rate per 100,000 population)



Darfield's under 75 cancer mortality rate (189.6 per 100,000) is higher than the Barnsley rate of 152.4 and is higher than the previous period.




Under 75 mortality from respiratory diseases in Darfield (53.4 per 100,000) is higher than the Barnsley rate of 41.8.




Under 75 mortality rates from cardiovascular diseases in Darfield have been consistently higher than the rates in Barnsley overall at each time point during the period 2010-2012 to 2015-2017. However, the current rate of 89.2 per 100,000 is the lowest during the period.

Excess weight








Over half of women in Darfield (57.8%) breastfeed their babies at birth; higher than the Barnsley rate of 55.6%.



More than one in five adults in Darfield are smokers. The current rate of 23.0% is slightly lower than the


Related Deaths per 100,000 (Over 35's)

Residents Living Alone and Aged 65+ Years




The 2011 Census showed that 12.0% of households in Darfield contained residents aged 65+ years that were living alone and could be at risk of social isolation.

More than 1 in 6 properties in Darfield are social rented; this is lower than both Barnsley and England.




Darfield has fewer private rented properties than England but more than Barnsley.



Properties are banded into one of eight valuation bands (A to H, with A being properties of lowest value to H being the highest). These are decided by the government's Valuation Office which determines the amount of council tax to be paid. The chart shows that there are more Darfield households in Band B compared to Barnsley and England.



Total Crime (rate per 1,000 population)





Crime (rate per 1,000 population)






There has been a continual notable reduction in the rate of Anti Social Behaviour (ASB) in Barnsley, as changes in crime recording practices implemented by South Yorkshire Police in October 2016 have steadily reduced the number of ASB incidents. Offences that would have previously been recorded as ASB are now recorded as criminal offences where applicable.


The ASB rate for Darfield is lower than the Barnsley rate but higher than the England rate.


Average Speed (Mbps) in Darfield











Mortality Rate from Causes Considered Preventable (rate per 100,000 population)
