

### Introduction and Purpose

Barnsley Council is continuing to change how we work together for a 'Better Barnsley'. We have ambitious plans to improve and grow as identified in our Corporate Plan for 2017-2020. # Demographics

#### **Overall Population**

10,864

Up 1.5% since 2011

Barnsley's population has been growing constantly since 2001. Since the 2011 Census, the resident population in Darton East has increased by 1.5%; less than half the rate of increase for Barnsley overall (4.9%). The increase in population is mainly due to more births than deaths and international migration. There are slightly more females compared with males within the ward.




In 2011, 1 in every 100 Darton East residents' main language was not English; equal to the rate for Barnsley overall.


### Demographics

Percentage of Darton East LSOAs in the Bottom 10% in England by Domain













### % of Pupils Achieving the Expected Standard in the Phonics Screening Check at the End of Year 1 2015 - 2018




The percentage of pupils resident in the Darton East ward achieving the expected standard increased in 2018 with outcomes remaining above both the Barnsley and national averages.



#### % of Key Stage 1 Pupils Achieving the Expected Standard 2016 - 2018







#### % of Pupils with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities 2018




The percentage of primary school pupils with special educational needs and disabilities in the Darton East ward was unchanged in 2018, remaining below both the Barnsley and national averages.




The percentage of secondary school pupils with special educational needs and disabilities in the Darton East ward increased in 2018 and is now above the national average but equal to the Barnsley average.

#### Life Expectancy at Birth




Life expectancy at birth for women in Darton East is 0.2 years higher than for women in Barnsley.

#### **Under 18's Conceptions**




The under 18 conception rate in Darton East is lower than the overall Barnsley rate, and is the lowest during the period 2011 to 2015.


#### Under 75 Mortality (rate per 100,000 population)



Darton East's under 75 cancer mortality rates have been consistently lower than the overall rates for Barnsley at each time point during the period 2010-2012 through to 2014-2016 but is higher than the previous period.




Darton East's under 75 mortality rates from respiratory diseases were consistently lower than the overall rates for Barnsley at each time point during the period 2010-2012 through to 2014-2016. However, the current rate is now higher than the Barnsley rate.




Darton East's under 75 mortality rates from cardiovascular diseases have been consistently lower than the overall rates for Barnsley at each time point during the period 2010-2012 through to 2015-2017. However, the current rate of 75.9 per 100,000 is higher than it was in 2010-2012.

#### **Excess weight**







67.3% of women in Darton East breastfeed their babies at birth; higher than the Barnsley rate of 55.6%.



Almost one in five adults in Darton East are smokers. The current rate of 19.6% is lower than the Barnsley rate of 23.4%, and the lowest since 2013.


#### Related Deaths per 100,000 (Over 35's)



Darton East's smoking related death rates have been consistently lower than the rates for Barnsley overall during the period 2011-13 through to 2014-16. The current rate of 301.1 per 100,000 (over 35's) is the lowest during the period.


The 2011 Census showed that 12.0% of households in Darton East contained residents aged 65+ years that were living alone and could be at risk of social isolation.










Three quarters of properties are owned with a mortgage or owned outright in Darton East. Ownership is higher than both the Barnsley and England rates.










One in eight properties in Darton East are social rented; this is lower than both Barnsley and England.

#### **Private Rented**








Darton East has fewer private rented properties than both Barnsley and England.

#### **Council Tax Band**





Properties are banded into one of eight valuation bands (A to H, with A being properties of lowest value to H being the highest). These are decided by the government's Valuation Office which determines the amount of council tax to be paid. The chart shows that there are more Darton East households in Bands B, C, D and E compared to Barnsley.

#### Total Crime (rate per 1,000 population)






















There has been a continual notable reduction in the rate of Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB) in Barnsley, as changes in crime recording practices implemented by South Yorkshire Police in October 2016 have steadily reduced the number of ASB incidents. Offences that would have previously been recorded as ASB are now recorded as criminal offences where applicable.






#### Access to a Car or Van




