

Introduction and Purpose

Barnsley Council is continuing to change how we work together for a 'Better Barnsley'. We have ambitious plans to improve and grow as identified in our Corporate Plan for 2017-2020. This profile compares the Ward with the overall Barnsley figure and that of England where possible.


Demographics

Overall Population

Up 8.3% since 2011

Barnsley's population has been growing constantly since 2001. Since the 2011 Census, the resident population in Stairfoot has increased by 8.3%; higher than the 4.9% increase in Barnsley overall. The increase in population is mainly due to more births than deaths and international migration. There are slightly more females than males within the ward.



In 2011, 1 in every 100 Stairfoot residents' main language was not English; equal to the rate for Barnsley overall.


The age profile of the population is changing both locally and nationally. Stairfoot has a slightly higher proportion of 0-18 year olds than both Barnsley and England.

Barnsley's ethnic diversity continues to change. In the 2011 Census, 5 out 10 people in Stairfoot were from a Black and Minority Ethnic (BME) group compared to 4 in every 10 people in Barnsley overall. The 2011 Census is the most up to date national data available on ethnicity.



This is calculated based on seven domains of deprivation, which in turn are composed of a number of indicators that are scored and ranked to produce an overall domain score.


Proportion of Stairfoot Lower Super Output Areas (LSOAs) in 10% Most Deprived in England


LSOAs in 10% Most Deprived in England

Percentage of Stairfoot LSOAs in the Bottom 10% in England by Domain







% of Pupils Achieving the Expected Standard in the Phonics Screening Check at the End of Year 1 2015 - 2018




The percentage of pupils resident in Stairfoot ward achieving the expected standard in phonics screening decreased in 2018 and is now below both the Barnsley and national averages.



% of Key Stage 1 Pupils Achieving the Expected Standard 2016 - 2018




The percentage of pupils resident in Stairfoot ward achieving the expected standard at the end of key stage I declined in all three subjects in 2018. Outcomes in reading are now below both the Barnsley and national averages whilst outcomes in writing are now below the national average but remain above the Barnsley average. Outcomes in mathematics remained above the Barnsley average and similar to the national average.







Life Expectancy at Birth




Life expectancy at birth for males in Stairfoot is 1.7 years lower than for men in Barnsley.



Life expectancy at birth for women in Stairfoot is 2.6 years lower than for women in Barnsley.






Under 75 Mortality (rate per 100,000 population)





Excess weight







Over half of women in Stairfoot (56.4%) breastfeed their babies at birth; higher than the Barnsley rate of 55.6%.




Related Deaths per 100,000 (Over 35's)




The proportion of women who smoke during pregnancy in Stairfoot (17.7%) is higher than the proportions in Barnsley (16.8%) and England (10.8%).



Residents Living Alone and Aged 65+ Years












The 2011 Census showed that 13.1% of households in Stairfoot contained residents aged 65+ years that were living alone and could be at risk of social isolation.

Housing Tenure











More than half of properties are owned with a mortgage or owned outright in Stairfoot. Ownership is lower than the Barnsley and England rates










Three in 10 properties in Stairfoot are social rented; this is higher than both Barnsley and England.

Private Rented










Properties are banded into one of eight valuation bands (A to H, with A being properties of lowest value to H being the highest). These are decided by the government's Valuation Office which determines the amount of council tax to be paid. The chart shows that there are more Stairfoot households in Band A compared to Barnsley and England.

Total Crime (rate per 1,000 population)























There has been a continual notable reduction in the rate of Anti Social Behaviour (ASB) in Barnsley, as changes in crime recording practices implemented by South Yorkshire Police in October 2016 have steadily reduced the number of ASB incidents. Offences that would have previously been recorded as ASB are now recorded as criminal offences where applicable.

The ASB rate for Stairfoot is higher than both the Barnsley and England rates.

All crime figures relate to the period January 2018 to December 2018.






Access to a Car or Van




Mortality Rate from Causes Considered Preventable (rate per 100,000 population)
