### **5. Planning Applications**

**a) 2008/1305** Residential Development (Outline) Land adj 4 The Walk, Birdwell, Barnsley, S70 5UA. After discussion it was observed that Footpath No 41 runs close by this planned development and should be noted.

**b) 2008/1334** Construction of an attenuation pond and hydrobrake manhole outlet, Wentworth Industrial Park, Wentworth Way, Tankersley. the PC feels that as a safety measure a fence could be installed around the pond and the nearby footpath made good. Clerk to write to Planning.

Clerk confirmed speaking with Joe Jenkinson, who would be happy to attend a future Parish Meeting to discuss Planning issues. TPC agreed to invite Mr Jenkinson to Oct 08 meeting.

Cllr Richard Garforth also confirmed a conversation with the same re the height levels on the Warehouse site at Plot B, DCUK, as they appear to be higher than agreed. Joe Jenkinson is to check the levels. Also Cllr Mrs Marjorie Clegg asked about the permitted working times at this site, as work is being carried out very early on a morning. Clerk to check with Planning Dept.

### **6. Parish Plan**

**a)Newsletter**, The current edition received from printers and is ready for distribution. This edition again printed in colour was well received by all councillors. Cllr Helen Reckless congratulated Cllr Richard Garforth for his efforts in production. Richard confirmed approx £200 raised in advertising features. Clerk to invoice local companies for their adverts. Agreed.

**Webpage**, Work in progress, Richard looking at developing the site further. Noted.

**b)Village Design Statement**, Nothing further to report.

**c)Tankersley Peace Garden** Clerk confirmed the new gates and archway have still not been fitted owing to the manufacturer having health problems, Clerk to pursue. Cllr Carol Smart tabled copies of original documents from Memorial Service dated 1921, in order to assist with wording on new plaque. Clerk to arrange for plaque in suitable materials, Cllr Terry Woods proposed spend to be no more than £250 seconded by Cllr Paul Reckless. Clerk asked the Council to confirm arrangements for the re-dedication ceremony on 10 November 2008. After discussion it was agreed that the Mayor would be asked to deliver a short address. John Hopkinson to be approached to play the Last Post. Also to invite Rev Keith Hale and Mrs Bonham, Headteacher at St Peters Primary for school involvement.

Cllr Helen Reckless raised the issue of the "Peace of Pilley" garden, which is in need of some attention, Helen asked if the Council would be in agreement for TPC to ask Neighbourhood Pride to carry out a general tidy up of the garden. This was agreed TPC agreed to pick up any cost incurred.

**d) Broad Ing Woodland** Clerk confirmed that a recent risk assessment had been carried out (13/09/2008) in the woodland and that there was no imminent risks found. Cllr Jock Jones pointed out that members of TPEG has recently been working in the woodland and had carried out a general tidy up of the area. Noted. Clerk also confirmed that Len Carr had marked up the trees on behalf of TPC, now awaiting estimates from various companies re the cost of thinning out the woodland. Noted.

## **7 Group Reports**

**a)Tankersley Community Association** Cllr Mrs M Clegg confirmed that TCA made approximately £900 at the Summer Gala. The date for next years Gala has been set as 4 July 2009. A coffee morning will take place on Saturday 20 September 2008, 10-12 am, proceeds to TCA. New blinds are to be fitted in the Senior Citizens Centre. The conservatory is almost complete, awaiting final furniture delivery. Bonfire arrangements are on going.

**Penistone East & West**, No representative from TPC available to attend the last meeting  
**Rockingham/Hoyland Milton**, This meeting clashes with TPC meeting, no representative available to attend.

**c)Forge Partnership** Cllr Paul Reckless reported on outcomes, including work at Rockingham Welfare Hall continues, drainage is to be sorted out first, the rest of the work should commence early in the new year. Paul also tabled a copy of a DVD issued by the Forge Partnership to highlight their activities. Noted

**d)Crime and Safety Partnership** Cllr Paul Simpkin attended the last meeting where dog fouling issues were discussed, as the new dog wardens were in attendance at this meeting. Next meeting is Thursday 18 Sept 2008.

**e)Leader Programme** Cllr Terry Wood attended the latest meeting and was able to confirm that £500,000 is available. The main theme being rural re generation. Skiers Spring Colliery Ground has been suggested.

**f)TPEG** The group has recently purchased a bench and would like to request that the Parish Council would accept responsibility for this the bench for insurance purposes only. TPC agreed to this, Clerk to write to Insurers with details of bench and replacement value of £400, requesting that

this bench be added to the Parish Council Inventory. TPEG will maintain the up keep of the bench. Agreed.

**g)Annual Bonfire** Date confirmed as Sat 1 November 2008. Cllr Richard Garforth will co ordinate wood collections on Friday 31 October 2008. Clerk to issue letters to local companies requesting wood donations.

### **10. Any Other Business**

1. Some Highways Issues remain o/s , Cllr Terry Woods pointed out that the missing “No Entry” sign at the Junction to Westwood New Road is still O/S and the road erosion at Hermitt Hill also still o/s. although Cllr Helen Reckless pointed out that it appears that some work is currently being carried out at this location. Clerk to remind Highways. Agreed
2. Cllr Richard Garforth will now be working towards the production of the next Newsletter. He is open to receiving any items to be included. Richard also made a suggestion that he may include competitions in future editions, i.e. local flower growing, or garden completions, this idea was well received by the council.
3. A6135, Cllr Andy Belk informed the Council that the joint steering Group formed between TPC and Wentworth PC is moving forward. The first meeting is Monday 22 September 2008, at the Mechanics Institute, Wentworth. Cllr Richard Garforth is to attend also. Cllr Andy Belk suggested that research has indicated that for a speed camera site to be approved all evidence will need to be documented, ie a petition. Also Andy pointed out that another serious accident occurred recently on Broadcarr Road, issues from this could also be included.
4. Cllr Paul Reckless raised the issue of a red car which on school days is regularly parked in a hazardous position outside St Peters Primary School. After discussion Cllr Paul Simpkin agreed to raise this with the Crime and Safety Group.
5. Road Signs still missing, Cllr Jock Jones pointed out that the Road sign at the top of Pilley Hills is still missing, also the arm on the signpost at the bottom of Pilley Green . Clerk to report again.

6. Cllr Mrs Marjorie Clegg asked if PC could ascertain the hours of working for Volvo UK, as a number of complaints have been received saying that loud music can be heard from their site during the early hours of the morning (2 am).
7. A61, Cllr Mrs Marjorie Clegg pointed out that vehicles are regularly pulling out of the junction of Tankersley Manor and turning right, across on coming vehicles (no right turn at this junction). Cllr Paul Simpkin will raise with Crime and Safety Group.
8. Cllr Helen Reckless (Chair) brought to the attention of the Council the fact that a Youth Opportunities Grant is available for identified youth projects. The Principle Grant to be awarded is up to £125K. Helen has suggested that the work on the Tennis courts may be something that could be considered. Helen has spoken to Jo Birch re the estimates which were provided for the project, she also needs to find young peoples groups who could be involved in the bidding, deadline is 27 October 2008. Helen is to co ordinate with Youth Participation Worker. TPC agreed that they would support application for this grant.
9. Jo Birch has confirmed that Pilley Pocket Park has recently been assessed by the parks inspectors, Jo Birch will have a report available to TPC for the next Parish Meeting.
