Re: Request for Information – Freedom of Information Act 2000

I wish to confirm that the council has completed its search for the information which you requested.

The information requested and our findings are as follows: -

For the period from 1 July 2025 to the latest date for which records are held at the time of your search (please state the end date used), please provide:

1. Total recorded spend incurred by the Council for repainting roundabouts (including planned maintenance and reactive works), broken down where held by: staff time/recharge rates, contractor costs, vehicles/plant/materials, traffic management, disposal/waste, overtime.

The costs incurred by the Council for the removal of graffiti from the highway in relation to roundabout assets between 01 July 2025 and 12 November 2025 is approximately £6,000. The costs can be considered as “contractor costs” for the purpose of this response.

1a. The number of jobs/incidents where roundabouts were repainted, with date and ward or postcode sector for each (no exact addresses required).

Unlicenced graffiti has been removed from 13 locations across the Borough. Details below.

2. The job/incident category codes and cost centre/recharge codes used for these works (e.g. road markings/white lining/circulatory carriageway/roundabout).

Category code used is limited to “highway graffiti”.

3. The current schedule of rates (or equivalent) used by the Council and/or its contractor(s) for road-marking/white-lining works specifically applicable to roundabouts (e.g. per metre/per m² rates, mobilisation, traffic management).

We have determined that providing any information regarding third party contractors linked to this request would present a real risk to the safety and wellbeing of the individuals involved. There is concern that revealing who delivers works for BMBC regarding the removal of any attachments could cause them to be targeted with abuse, threats or violence. The council does not believe there is legitimate public interest in knowing who carries out the works or the specific rates being used. As such, the potential for harm outweighs the public interest in disclosure in this instance. Therefore, under Section 38(1) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 this information is exempt from disclosure.

4. Any policy/guidance/SOP in force during the period for inspection, prioritisation and repainting of roundabout markings and associated surfacing, including the legal basis (e.g. Highways Act 1980 s41 duty to maintain; Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016; Traffic Signs Manual – Chapter 5 (Road Markings); UKRLG “Well-managed Highway Infrastructure”).

Under the Highways Act 1980, the Highway Authority has statutory powers to maintain the highway and ensure its safe use. Section 132 makes it an offence for any person, without consent of the Highway Authority or other lawful authorisation, to paint, inscribe, or affix any picture, letter, sign, or other mark upon the surface of a highway or on any tree, structure, or works within the highway. This provision underpins the removal of unauthorised items such as flags, banners, or signage attached to highway assets. In addition, Section 149 empowers the Authority to remove any object deposited on the

Section 178 further prohibits the attachment of any apparatus or object to highway structures such as lighting columns without consent, reinforcing the Authority's ability to remove unauthorised flags or similar items. These powers operate alongside the Town and Country Planning (Control of Advertisements) (England) Regulations 2007, which regulate the display of advertisements and require consent for signage or displays that could affect amenity or public safety. Together, these provisions form the legal basis for policies and standard operating procedures governing the identification and removal of unauthorised flags from highway assets.

If you do not hold a discrete “roundabout” category, please extract cases recorded under road markings/white lining/traffic signs & lines where the free-text notes contain “roundabout”, “RB”, “circulatory”, “island” or any likely similar keyword for the period.
