On-going Learning Experiences for Toileting/Hand washing 24-36 Months



Promoting how children may learn:

Playing and exploring:

Showing curiosity about events

Active learning:

Growing independence Persisting with activities when challenges occur Showing satisfaction in meeting their own goals

Key learning opportunities for this area: Unique Child

PSED and CL: Support children with and note their progress with developing relationships and their communication with adults and peers:

Understand simple sentences (16-26) Developing understanding of simple concepts (16-26)

Using single words (8-20)

Beginning to put two words together (16-26) Learn new words rapidly, uses gestures sometimes with limited talk (22-36) Uses a variety of questions, uses simple sentences (22-36)

Physical:

Can actively co-operate with nappy changing (lies still, helps hold legs up) (8-20)

Clearly communicates wet or soiled nappy or pants (16-26)

Shows some awareness of bladder and bowel urges (16-26)

Shows awareness of what a potty or toilet is used for (16-26)

Shows a desire to help with

dressing/undressing and hygiene routines (16-26)

Clearly communicates their need for potty or toilet (22-36)

Helps with clothing e.g. puts on hat, unzips zipper on jacket, takes off unbuttoned shirt (22-36)

Beginning to be independent in self-care, but still often needs adult support (22-36)

Mathematics:

Associates a sequence of actions with daily routines (16-26)

What the adult will do: Positive relationships

Talk to the children
Sing songs/rhymes
Name objects/pictures in the room
that children point out
Repeat children's words and
phrases
Provide facial expression to signify
warmth and care
Comfort them when they are upset
Meet their individual needs
Support children to wash and dry
their hands
Support children to manage

What the adult will provide: Enabling Environments

Resources

Basic Provision

Child sized sinks & toilets, waste paper bin, paper towels, soap.
Nappy changing area. Pictures, photographs, mobiles for children to look at.

Resources to enhance

Regularly change the pictures/photographs/mobiles to provide interest to the children

Organisation

Key adults try as much as possible to change own key children's nappies

Key Vocabulary and Questions

toileting

Nappy, change, wipes, songs/rhymes, child's name, key adult's name, listen, sing, wiggle, toes, fingers, head, feet, hands, arms, legs, tummy, bottom, wash, dry, soap, paper towels, clean, dirty, bin, clothing names (for example trousers, pants etc.), sink, toilet, flush, taps, water, on, off, rub, rinse

This week's enhancements/resources

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Beginning to understand that things might happen 'now' (16-26) Anticipates specific time-based events (22-36)
