1 <u>Aim of the Report</u>

2 Main Points

The Barnsley Governors Association has been in existence since 2010 with the first AGM being held in 2011. The BGA is an independent, democratic and non-political association of school governing bodies in Barnsley. It makes no distinction between the Academy sector or maintained schools. The primary aim of the Association is to support, promote and improve school governance. As an organisation we aim to be inclusive and transparent and welcome feedback from our members and others and encourage active participation in our work.

Entering our 10th year, we remain committed to these aims. Given the changing face of governance and the greater challenge facing schools of all kinds, we believe this work to be as important as ever.

We continue to organise and provide **training courses** for governors in conjunction with the Local Authority. An Autumn Conference and AGM is to be held on Tuesday 22nd October 2019 from 6pm – 8.30pm at the Holiday Inn in Dodworth. Please put this date in your diary and plan to attend. The conference will deal with business such as: resolutions; changes to the constitution and membership of the executive committee and this will

be followed by a huge debate and discussion about the new OFSTED Framework which takes effect in September 2019. We would like as many as possible to join in this discussion, so please <u>Book your place online</u>.
