



Improvement in life satisfaction (% change), UK countries and regions, from the year ending March 2013 to the year ending March 2019







Personal well-being in the UK: April 2018 to March 2019

Estimates of life satisfaction, feeling that the things done in life are worthwhile, happiness and anxiety at the UK, country, regional, county and local authority level.

Participants were asked the following questions:

- Life Satisfaction Question: Overall, how satisfied are you with your life nowadays? Where 0 is 'not at all satisfied' and 10 is 'completely satisfied'.
- Worthwhile Question: Overall, to what extent do you feel the things you do in your life are worthwhile? Where 0 is 'not at all worthwhile' and 10 is 'completely worthwhile'.
- Happiness Question: Overall, how happy did you feel yesterday?
 Where 0 is 'not at all happy' and 10 is 'completely happy'.
- Anxiety Question: Overall, how anxious did you feel yesterday?
 Where 0 is 'not at all anxious' and 10 is 'completely anxious'.

The sample size for Barnsley in 2018/19 was 720.

High Score Definitions

- High Life Satisfaction: The percentage of respondents scoring 7-10 to the question "Overall, how satisfied are you with your life nowadays".
- High Worthwhile: The percentage of respondents scoring 7-10 to the question "Overall, to what extent do you feel the things you do in your life are worthwhile?
- High Happiness: The percentage of respondents scoring 7-10 to the question "Overall, how happy did you feel yesterday?"
- High Anxiety: The percentage of respondents scoring 7-10 to the question "Overall, how anxious did you feel yesterday?".

Life Satisfaction


Life Satisfaction:

- Barnsley's 2018/19 average life satisfaction score (7.73) is slightly better than the England score of 7.71 but not significantly.
- Compared to statistical neighbours, Barnsley's rate is the joint second highest, and the joint fourth highest within the Y&H group.
- Of the four South Yorkshire authorities, Barnsley's rate is the same as Sheffield's, and better than Doncaster and Rotherham (significantly better than Rotherham).
- The rate has increased significantly from the 2011/12 rate of 7.26.


High Life Satisfaction:

- More than three quarters (79.69%) of Barnsley respondents had a high life satisfaction score in 2018/19; slightly lower than the Y&H and England rates of 81.14% and 82.3% respectively.
- Compared to statistical neighbours, Barnsley's rate is the 7th highest, and in the second best quartile.
- Compared to other Y&H authorities, Barnsley's rate is the 7th lowest, and in the second worst quartile.
- Of the four South Yorkshire authorities, Barnsley's rate is the second highest (after Sheffield).
- The rate has increased from the 2011/12 rate of 71.87%.


Life Satisfaction: Barnsley compared with statistical neighbours




Life Satisfaction: Barnsley compared with Yorkshire and the Humber







Worthwhile


Worthwhile:

- Barnsley's 2018/19 average score (8.00) is slightly better than the England score of 7.88 but not significantly.
- Barnsley's rate is the second highest within both the statistical neighbours and the Y&H groups.
- Of the four South Yorkshire authorities, Barnsley's rate is the best, but not significantly better.
- The rate has **increased significantly** from the 2011/12 rate of 7.51.


High Worthwhile:

- More than four out of five (83.75%) of Barnsley respondents had a high worthwhile score in 2018/19; slightly higher than the Y&H rate of 83.24% and slightly lower that the England rate of 84.28%.
- Compared to statistical neighbours, Barnsley's rate is the 3rd highest, and in the second best quartile.
- Compared to other Y&H authorities, Barnsley's rate is the 5th highest, and in the second best quartile.
- Of the four South Yorkshire authorities, Barnsley's rate is the second highest (after Sheffield).
- The rate has increased from the 2011/12 rate of 75.37%.


Worthwhile: Barnsley compared with statistical neighbours




Worthwhile: Barnsley compared with Yorkshire and the Humber






High Worthwhile: Barnsley compared with statistical neighbours

Happiness


Happiness:

- Barnsley's 2018/19 average score (7.48) is slightly worse than the England score of 7.56 but not significantly.
- Barnsley's rate is mid-range within both the statistical neighbours and the Y&H groups.
- Of the four South Yorkshire authorities, Barnsley's rate is the highest, but not significantly.
- The rate has increased from the 2011/12 rate of 7.12, but not significantly.


High Happiness:

- Almost three quarters (74.38%) of Barnsley respondents had a high happiness score in 2018/19; slightly higher than the Y&H rate of 74.22% and slightly lower that the England rate of 76.46%.
- Compared to statistical neighbours, Barnsley's rate is the 8th highest, and in the second best quartile.
- Compared to other Y&H authorities, Barnsley's rate is the 6th highest, and in the second worst quartile.
- Of the four South Yorkshire authorities, Barnsley's rate is the second highest (after Sheffield).
- The rate has increased from the 2011/12 rate of 66.15%.


Happiness: Barnsley compared with statistical neighbours




Happiness: Barnsley compared with Yorkshire and the Humber






Happiness: Barnsley compared with statistical neighbours

Anxiety


Anxiety:

- Barnsley's 2018/19 average score (2.80) is slightly better than the England score of 2.87 but not significantly.
- Compared to statistical neighbours, Barnsley's rate is the sixth best, and the fourth best within the Y&H group.
- Of the four South Yorkshire authorities, Barnsley's rate is the best, but not significantly better.
- The rate has decreased significantly from the 2011/12 rate of 3.27


High Anxiety:

- More than two-thirds (34.9%) of Barnsley respondents had a high anxiety score in 2018/19; lower than the Y&H and England rates of 36.9% and 36.05% respectively.
- Compared to statistical neighbours, Barnsley's rate is the 7th highest, and in the second best quartile.
- Compared to other Y&H authorities, Barnsley's rate is the 3rd highest, and in the best quartile.
- Of the four South Yorkshire authorities, Barnsley's rate is the lowest.
- The rate has decreased from the 2011/12 rate of 40.68%.


Anxiety: Barnsley compared with statistical neighbours




Anxiety: Barnsley compared with Yorkshire and the Humber






High Anxiety: Barnsley compared with statistical neighbours
