This information is intended to support Area Councils to identify some of their strategic priorities and commission services to meet these challenges.

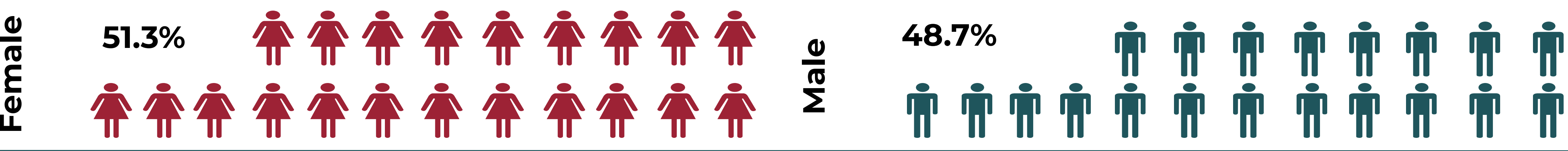
# Demographics

## Overall Population

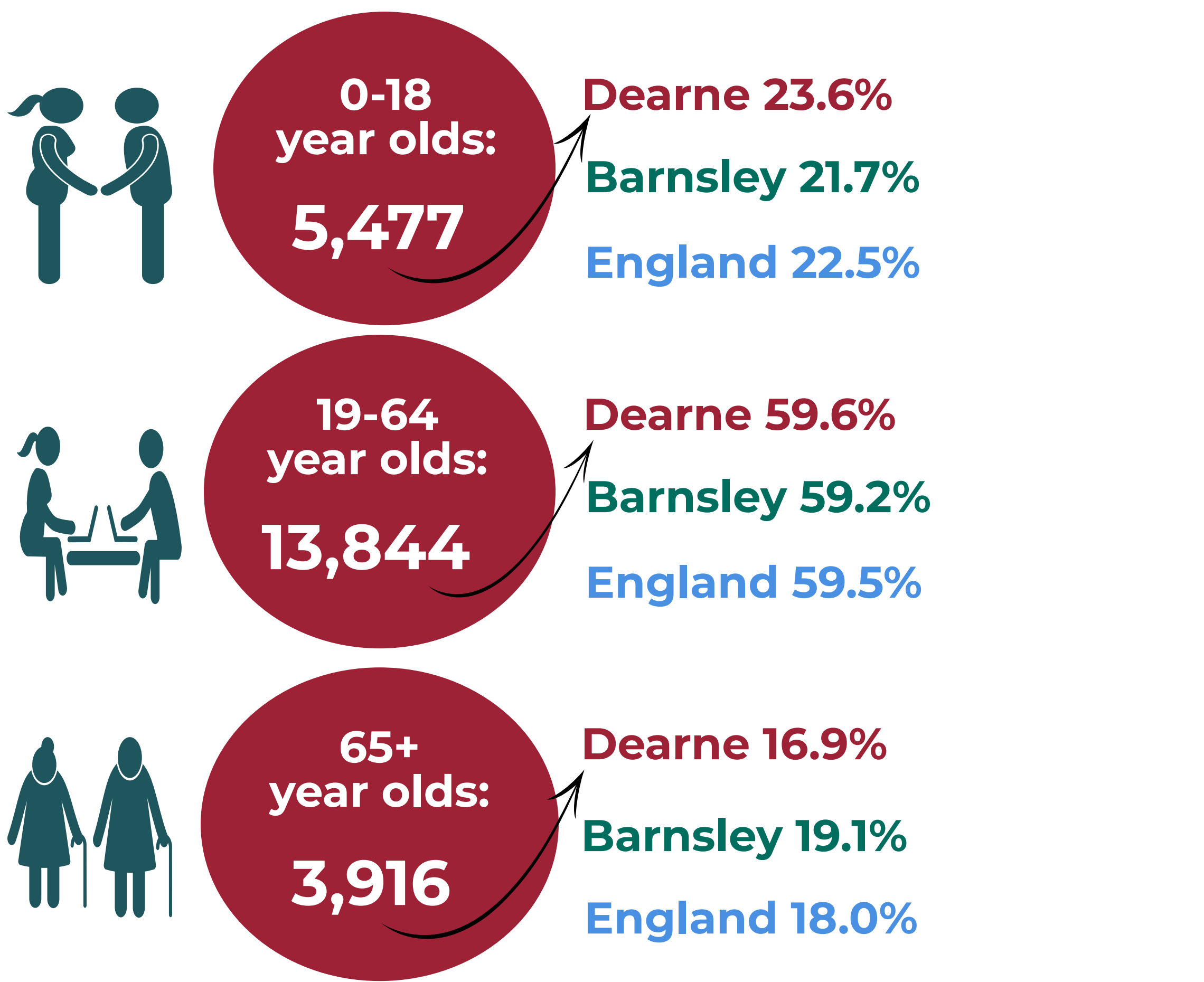

Barnsley's population has been growing constantly since 2001. Since the 2011 Census, the resident population of the Dearne has increased by 3.5%, whereas across Barnsley there was a 4.9% increase. These increases were mainly due to more births than deaths and international migration.

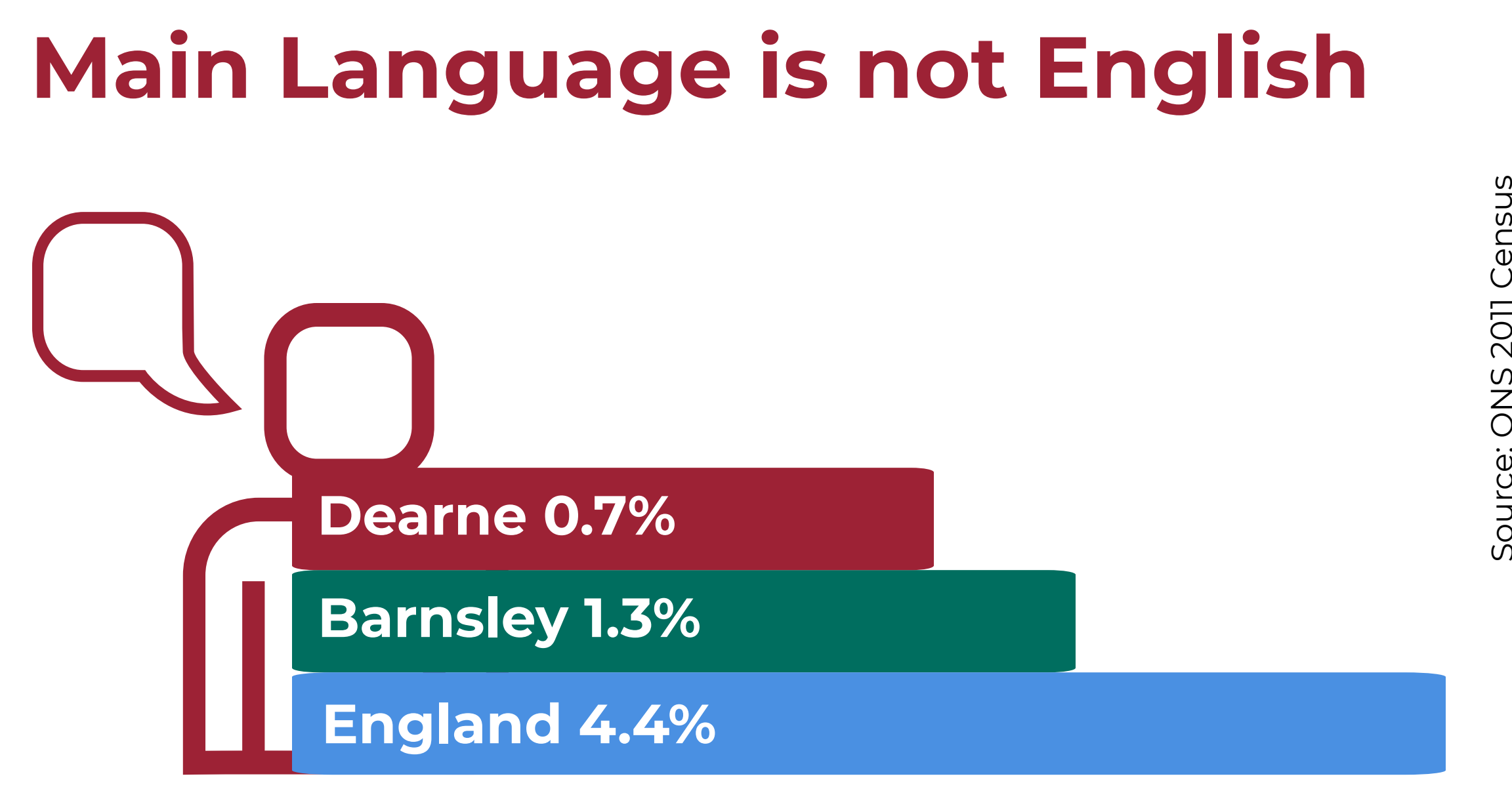


## Age Profile and % of Total Population



The age profile of the population is changing both locally and nationally due to the rising number of people aged 65+ years. The resident population of the Dearne consists of more young people (under 19 years), a similar proportion of those of working age and slightly fewer people of pensionable age when compared to Barnsley and nationally.

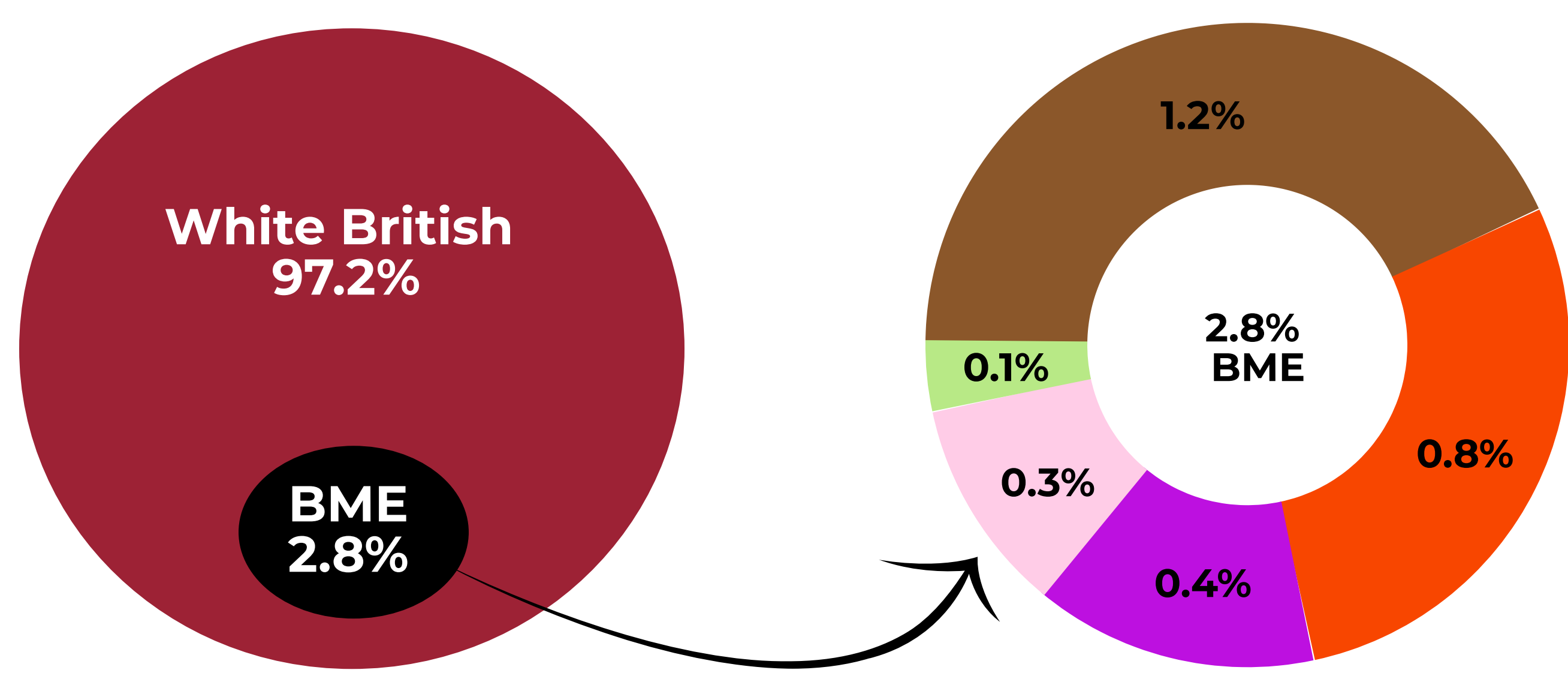

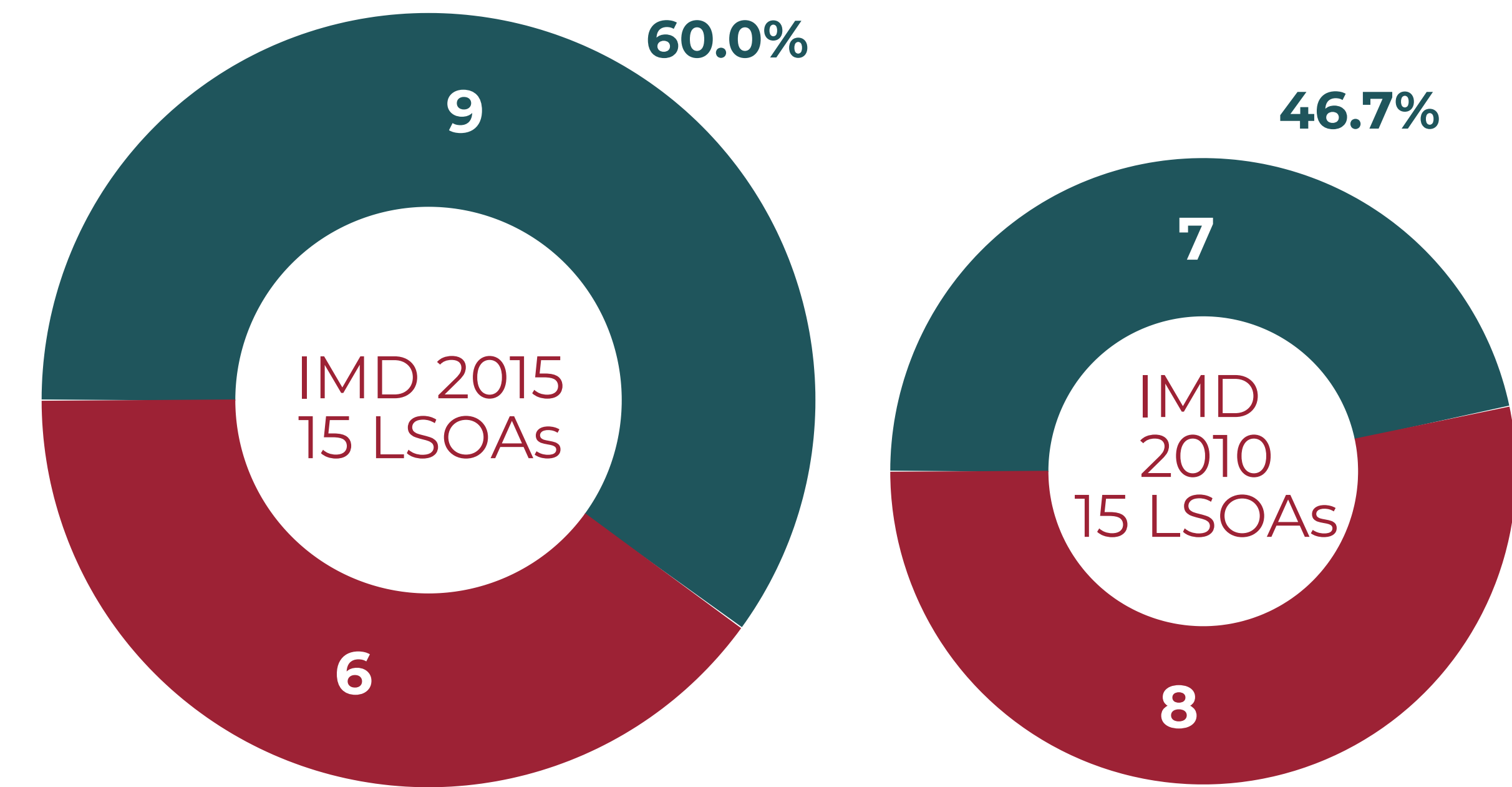

## Indices of Multiple Deprivation 2015

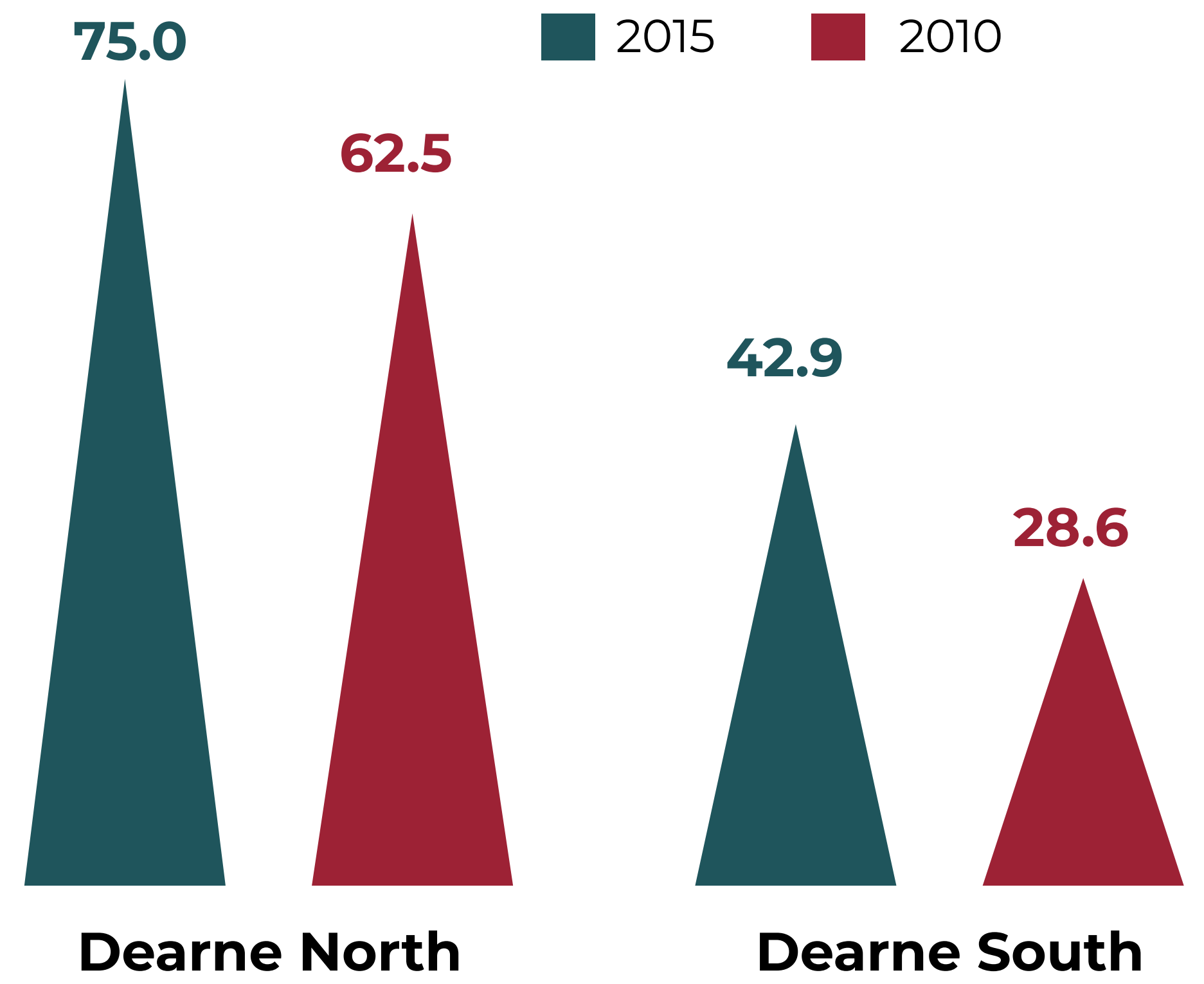
This is calculated based on seven domains of deprivation, which in turn are composed of a number of indicators that are scored and ranked to produce an overall domain score.

- LSOAs not in 10% Most Deprived in England



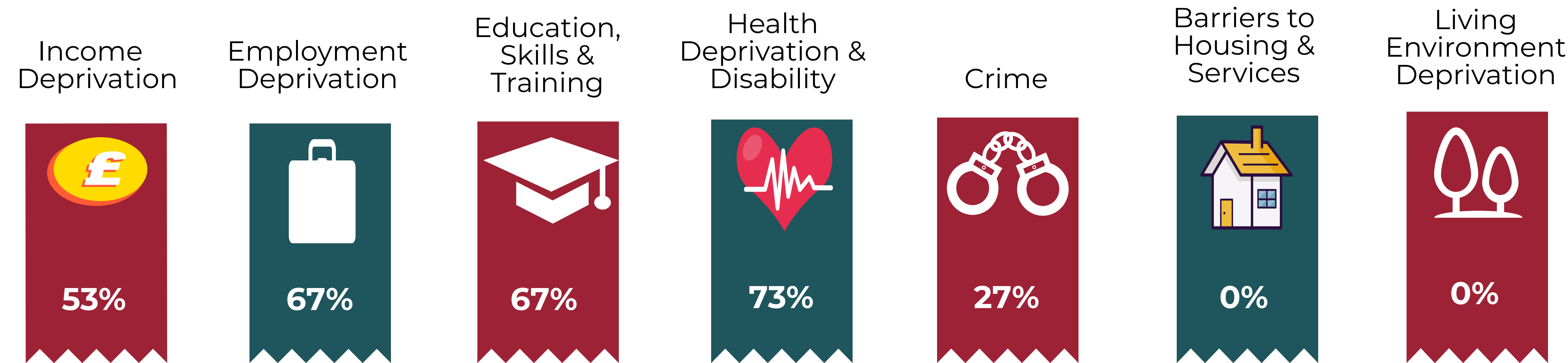
### The Proportion of LSOAs in the Bottom 10% in England by Ward

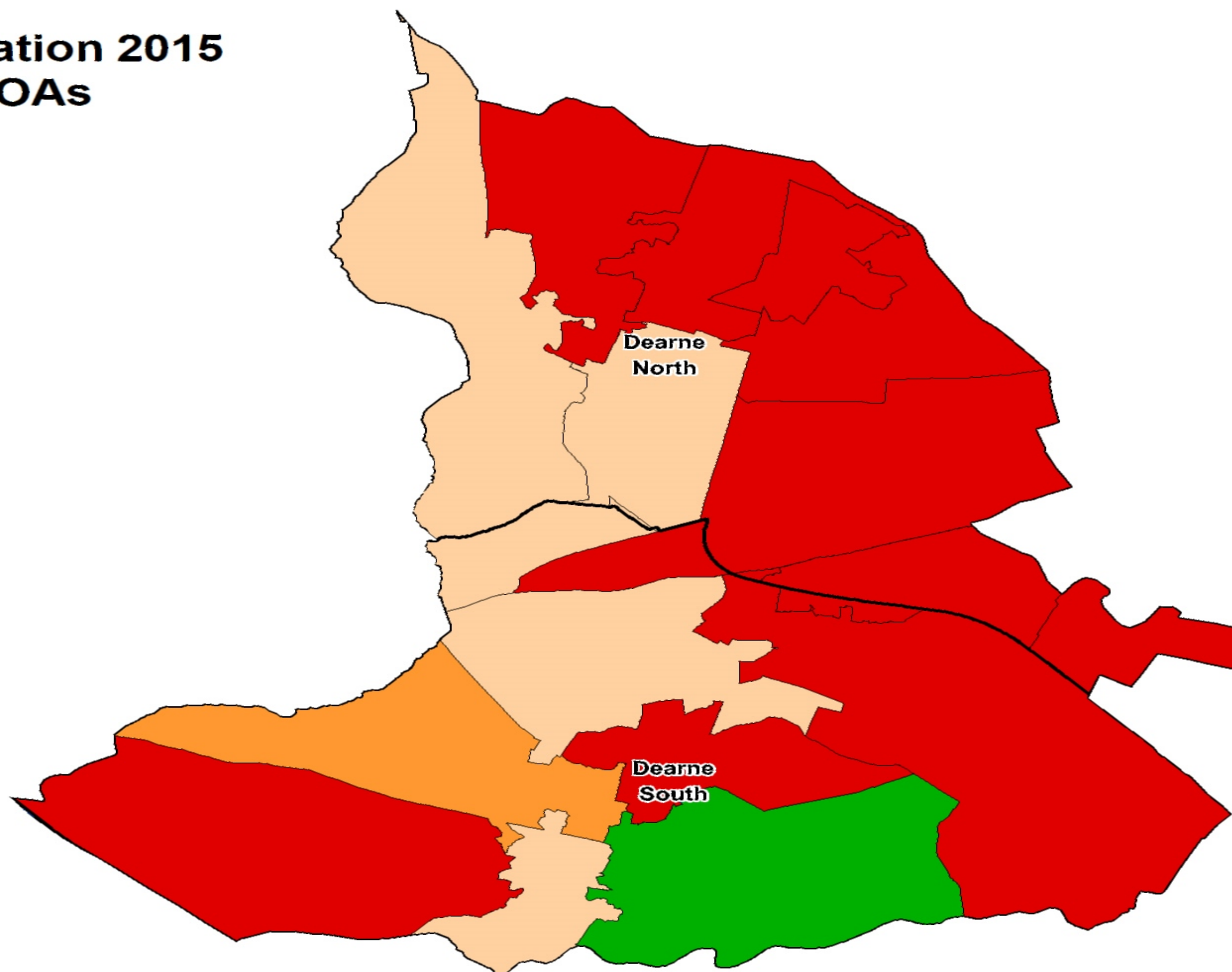
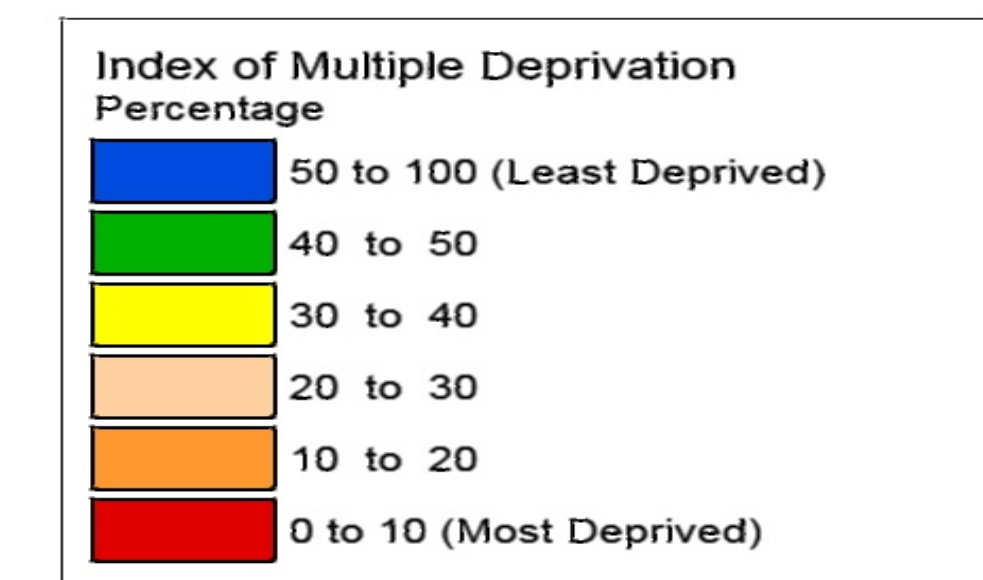
## The Seven Domains of Deprivation and how Dearne Performs

Percentage of Dearne area LSOAs in the Bottom 10% in England by Domain



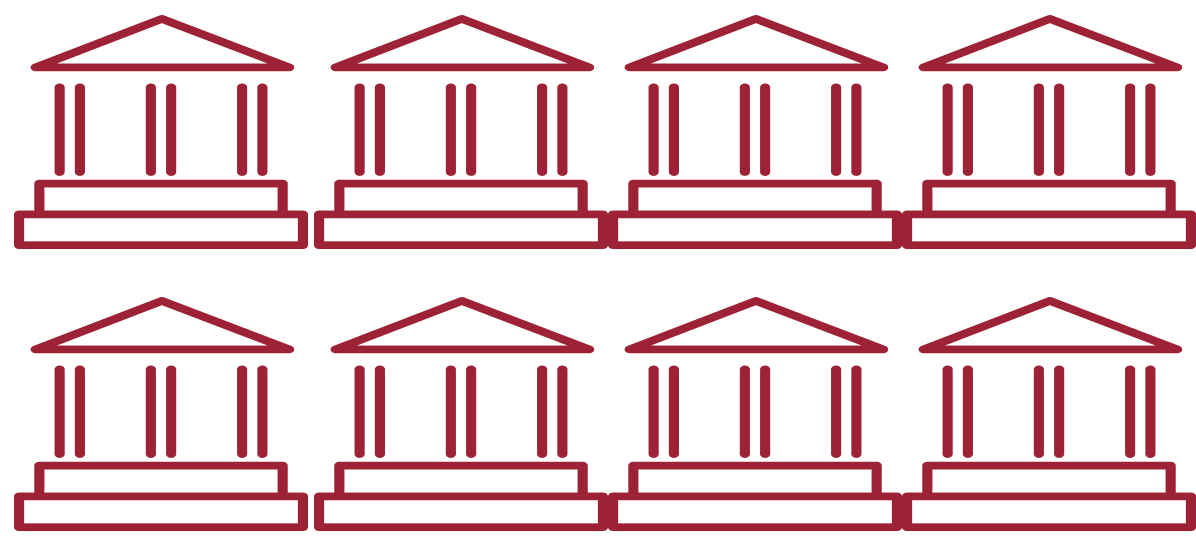
## Index of Multiple Deprivation 2015 Dearne Area Council LSOAs Relative to England (DCLG, 2015)

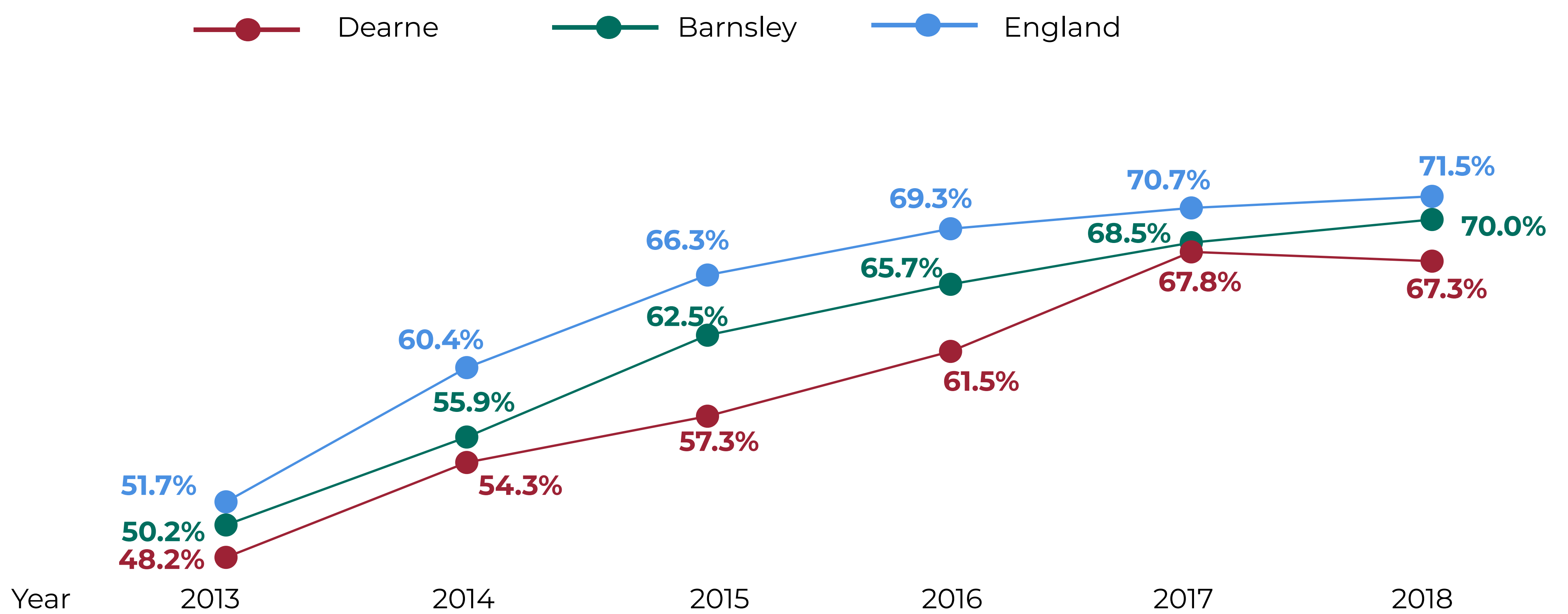
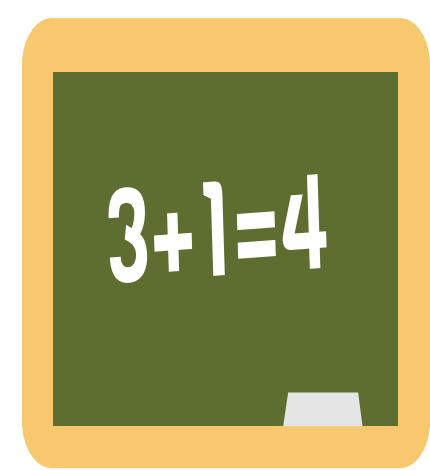

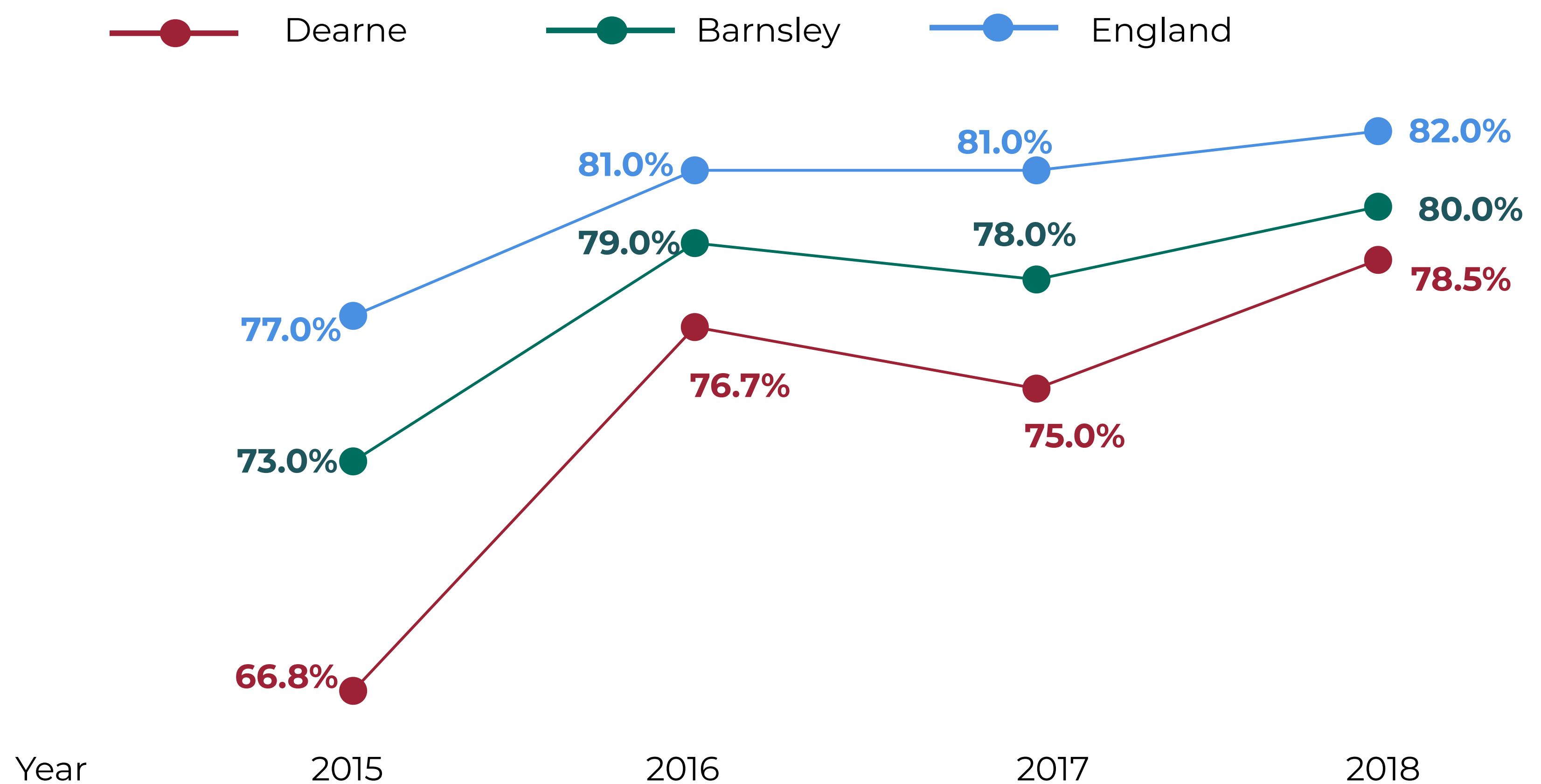

The percentage of pupils resident in the Dearne area achieving a good level of development decreased in 2018 with outcomes remaining below both the Barnsley and national averages.

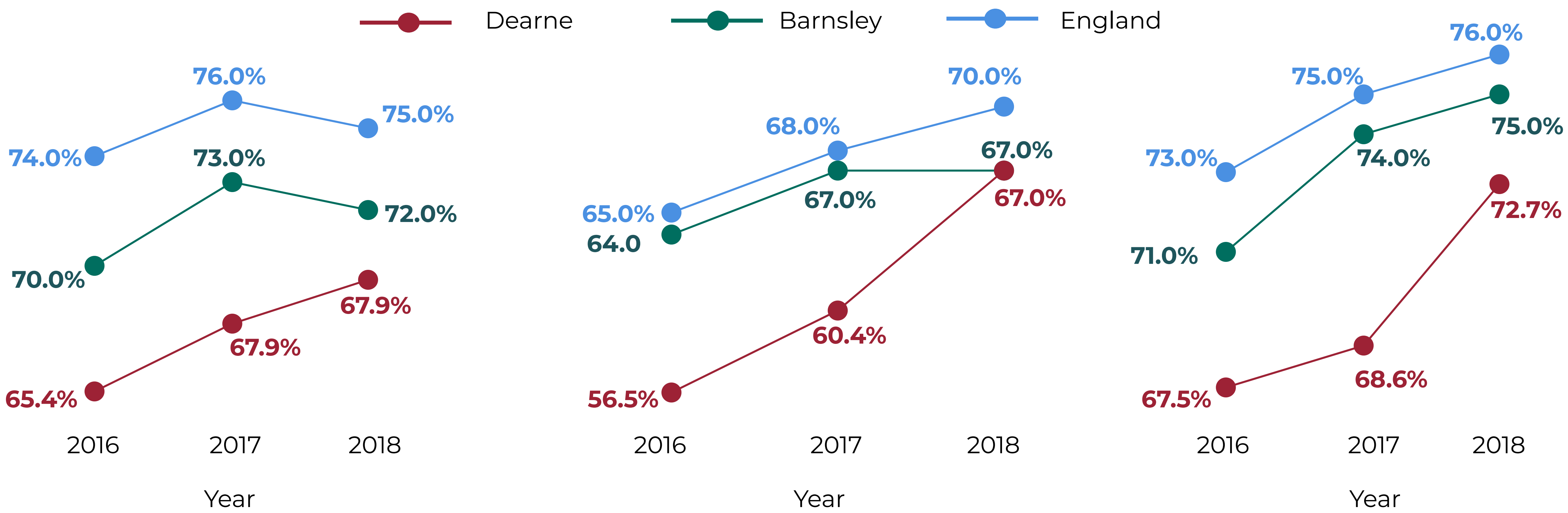
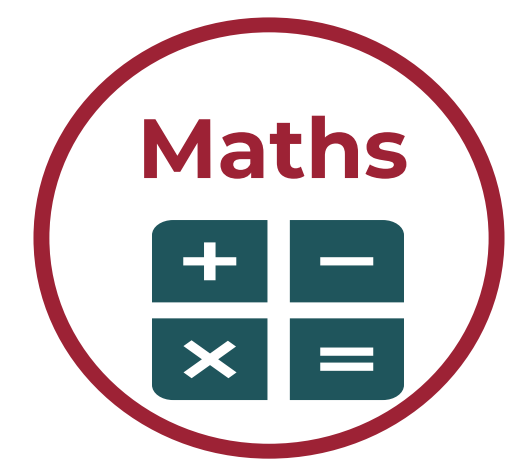
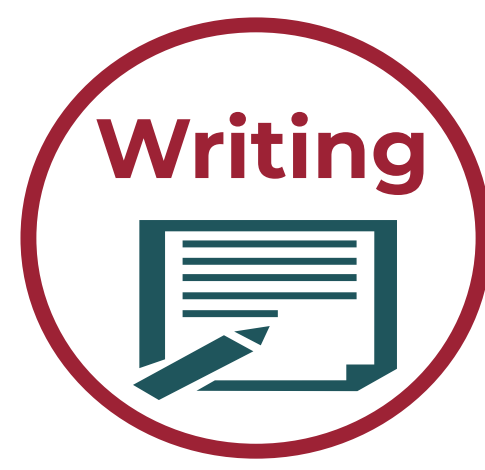
## % of Pupils Achieving the Expected Standard in the Phonics Screening Check at the End of Year 1 2015 - 2018



The percentage of pupils resident in Dearne area achieving the expected standard increased in 2018 but remained below both the Barnsley and national averages.

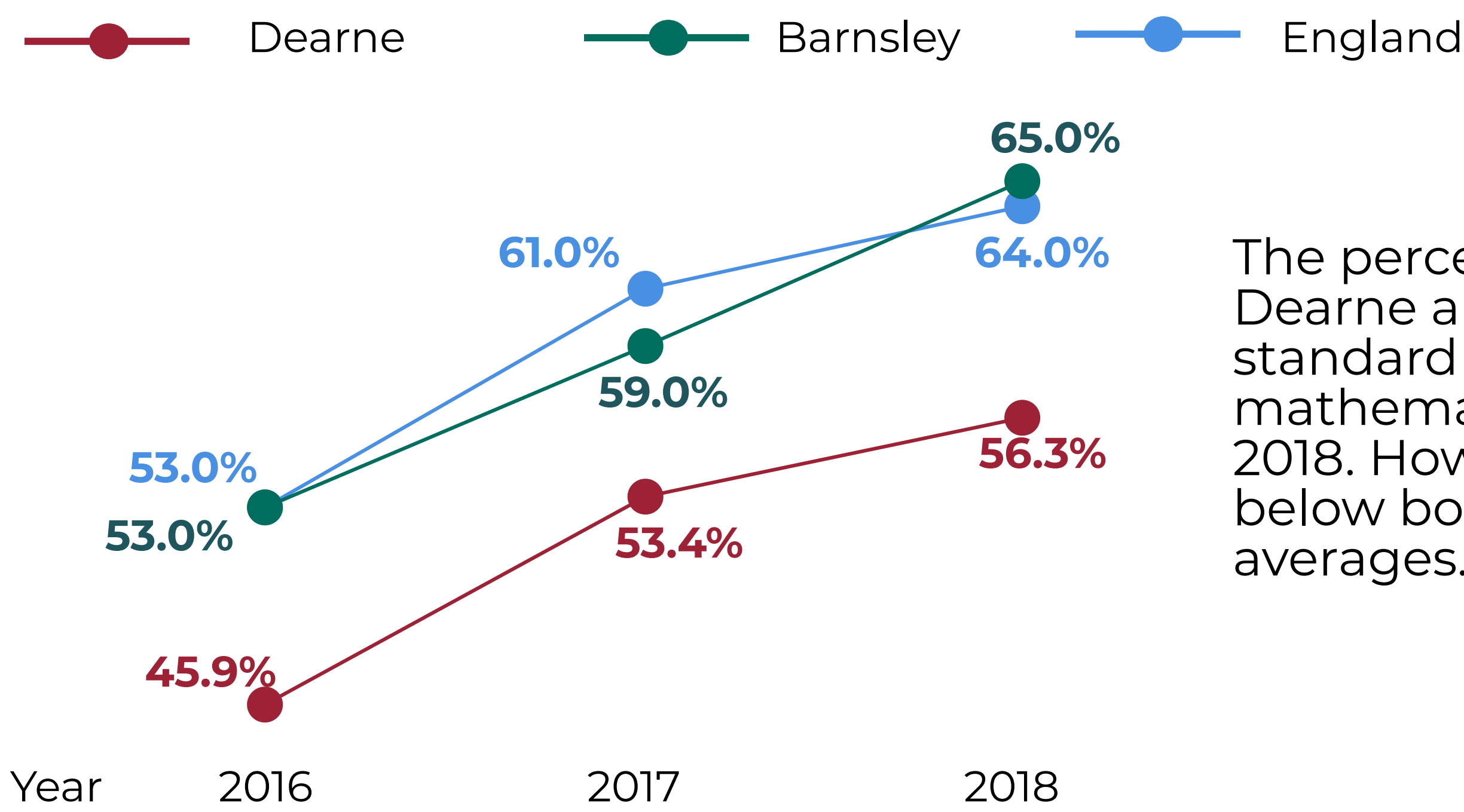
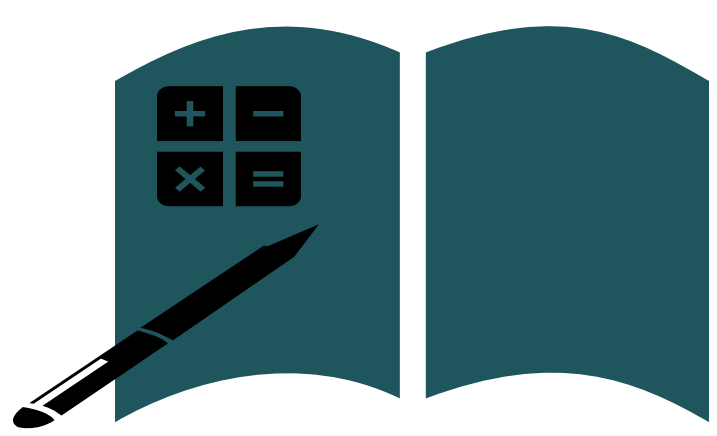

## % of Key Stage 1 Pupils Achieving the Expected Standard 2016 - 2018



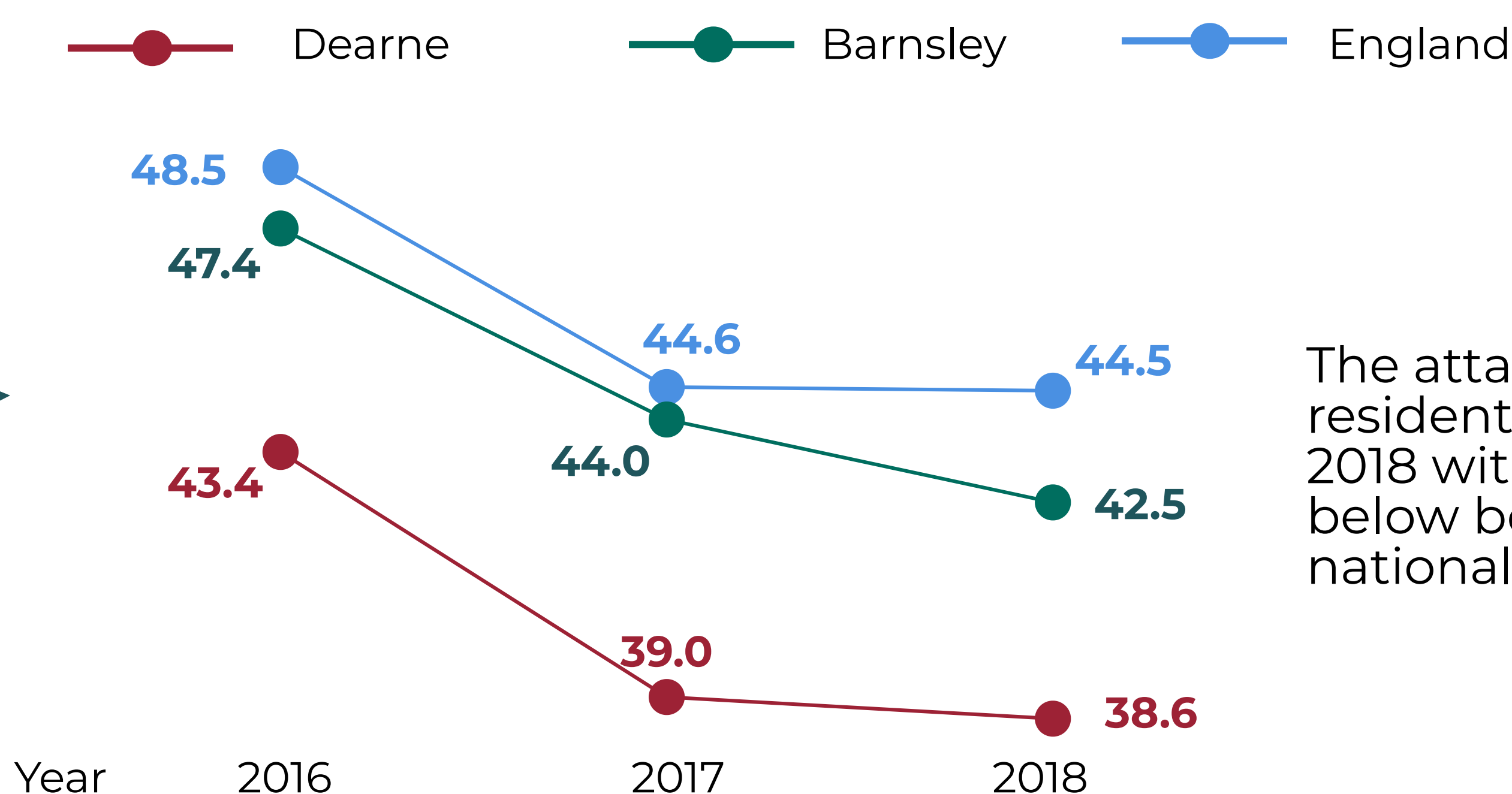

Outcomes remained below the national average in all subjects and below the Barnsley average in reading and mathematics. Outcomes in writing are now equal to the Barnsley average.

The percentage of pupils resident in Dearne area achieving the expected standard in reading, writing and mathematics combined increased in 2018. However outcomes remained below both the Barnsley and national averages.

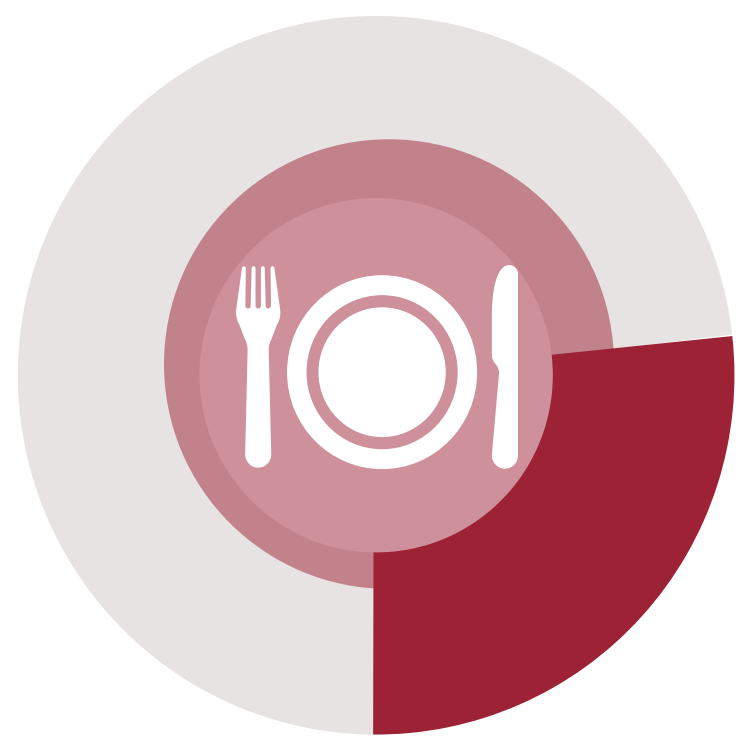

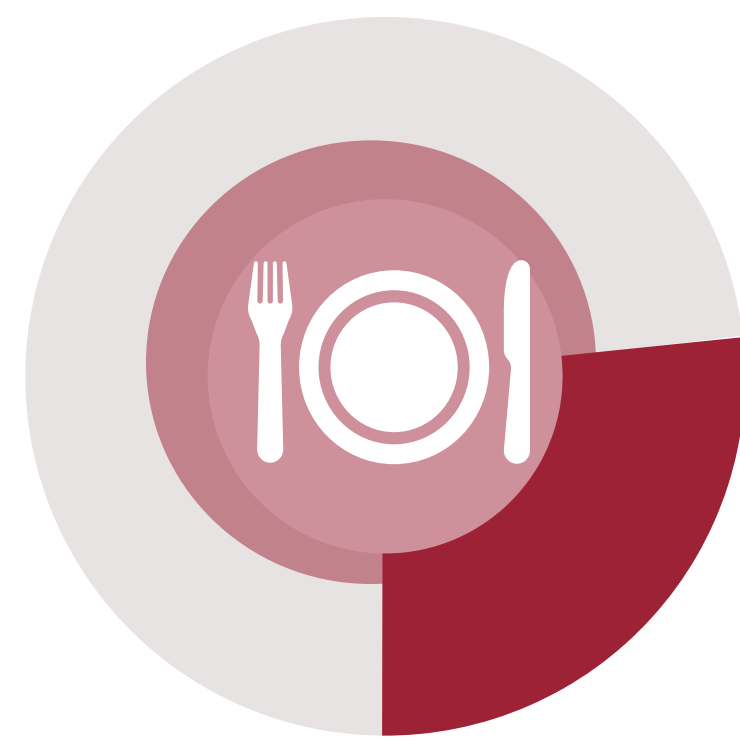

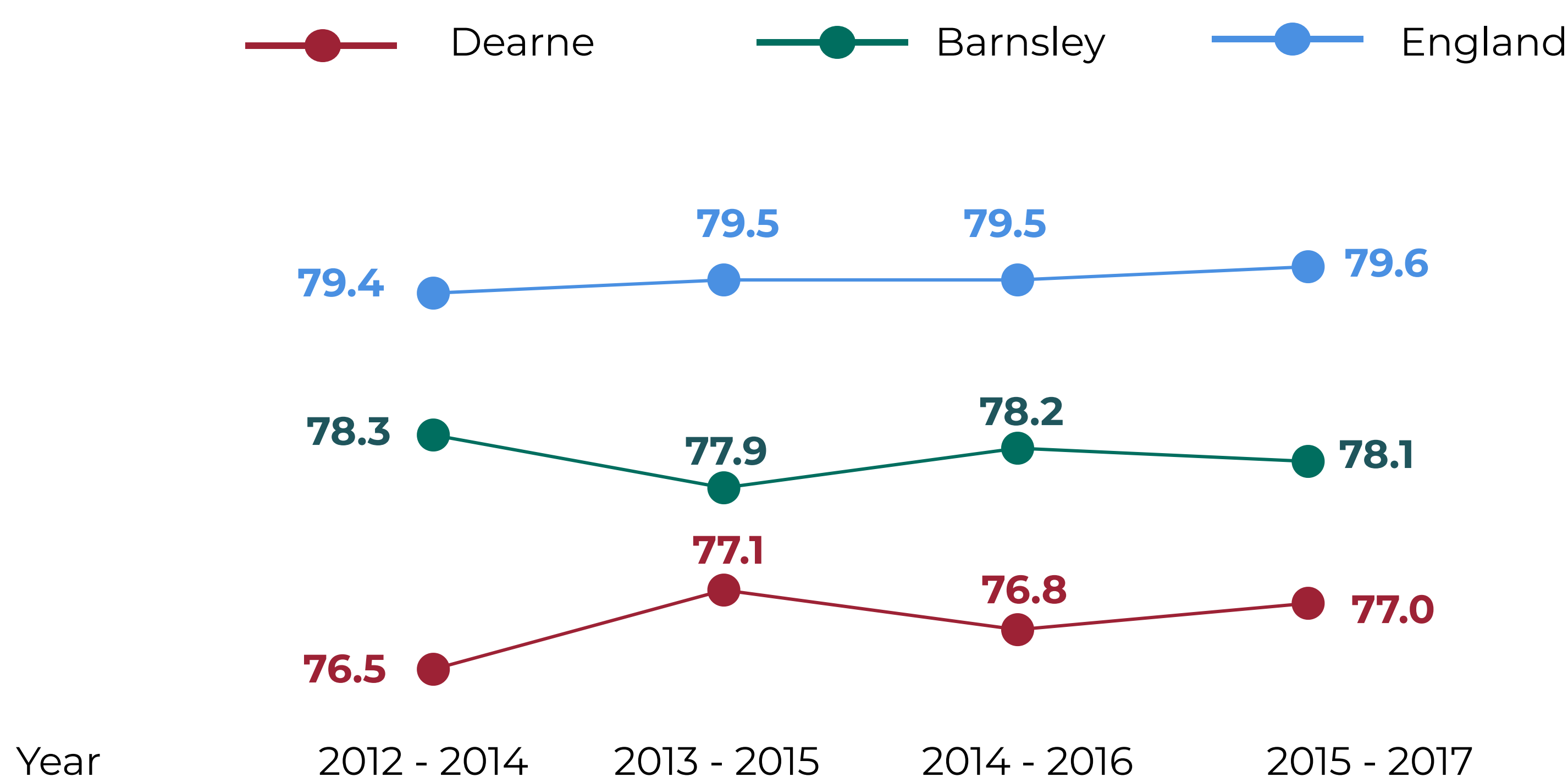

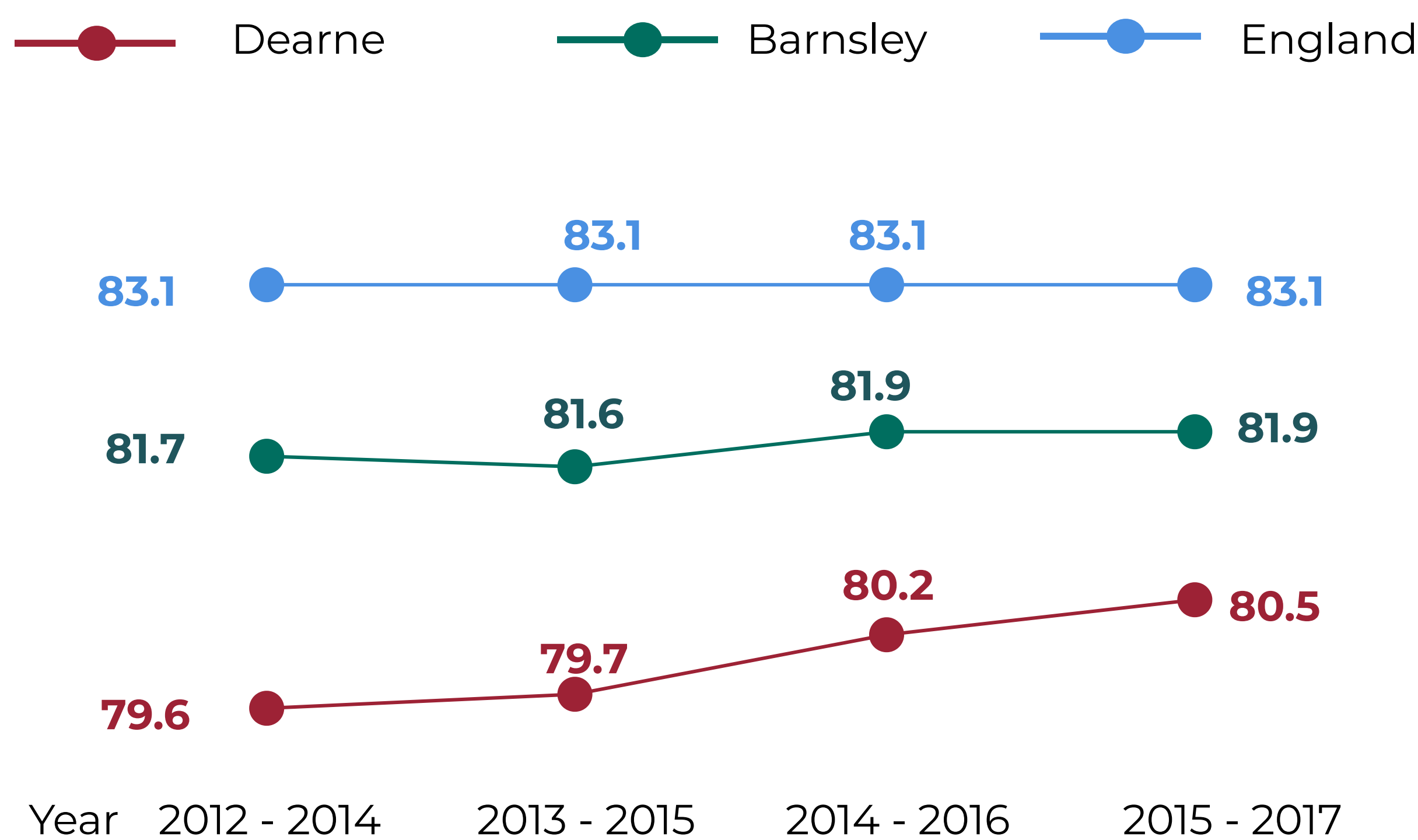
## Life Expectancy at Birth

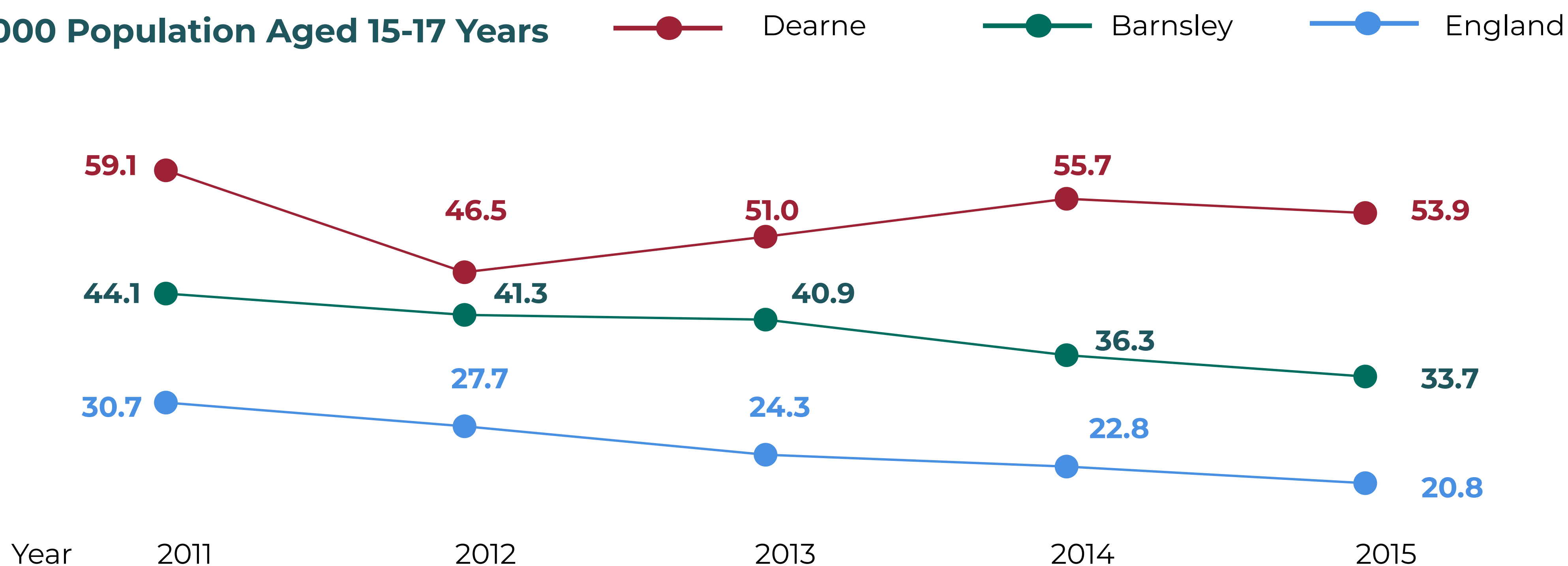
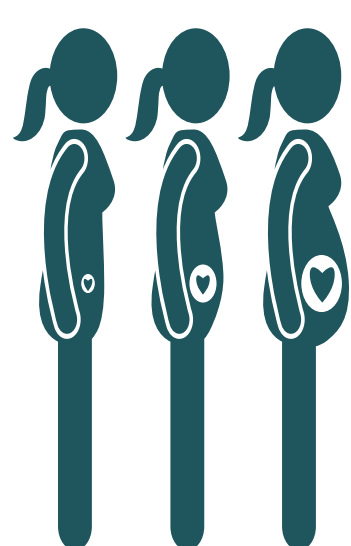
Female

Rate per 1,000 Population Aged 15-17 Years



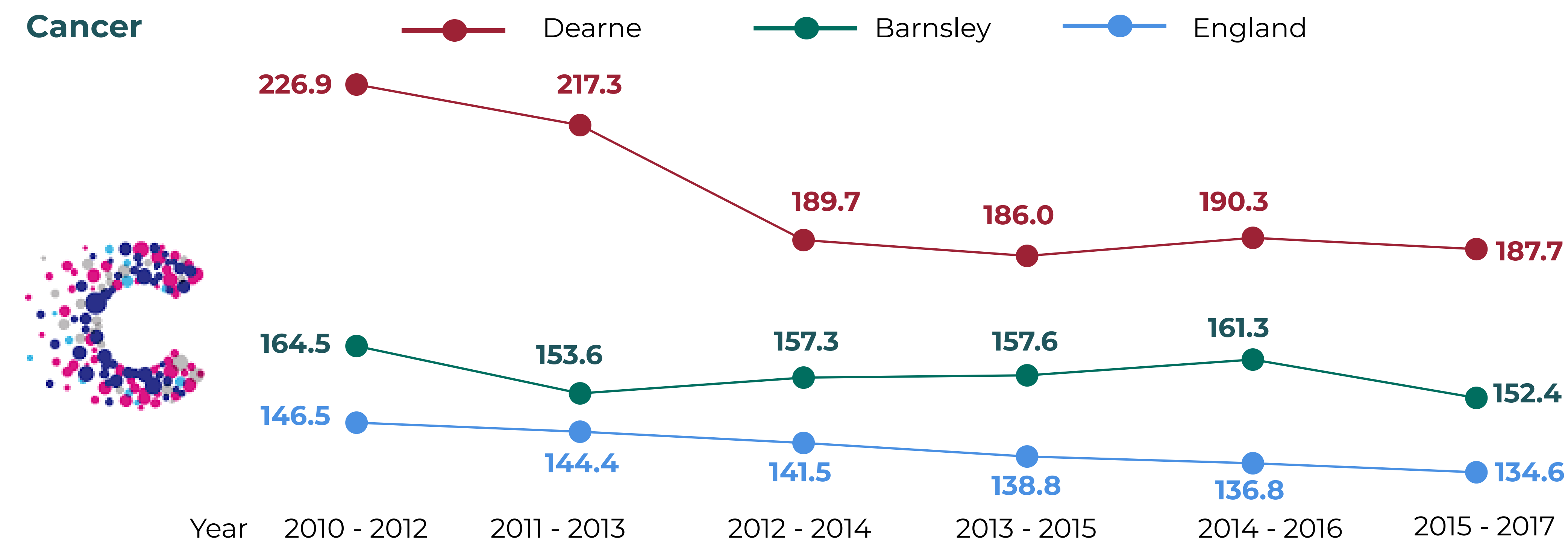
Under 18 conception rates in the Dearne area have been consistently higher than the rates in Barnsley and England during the period 2011 to 2015.

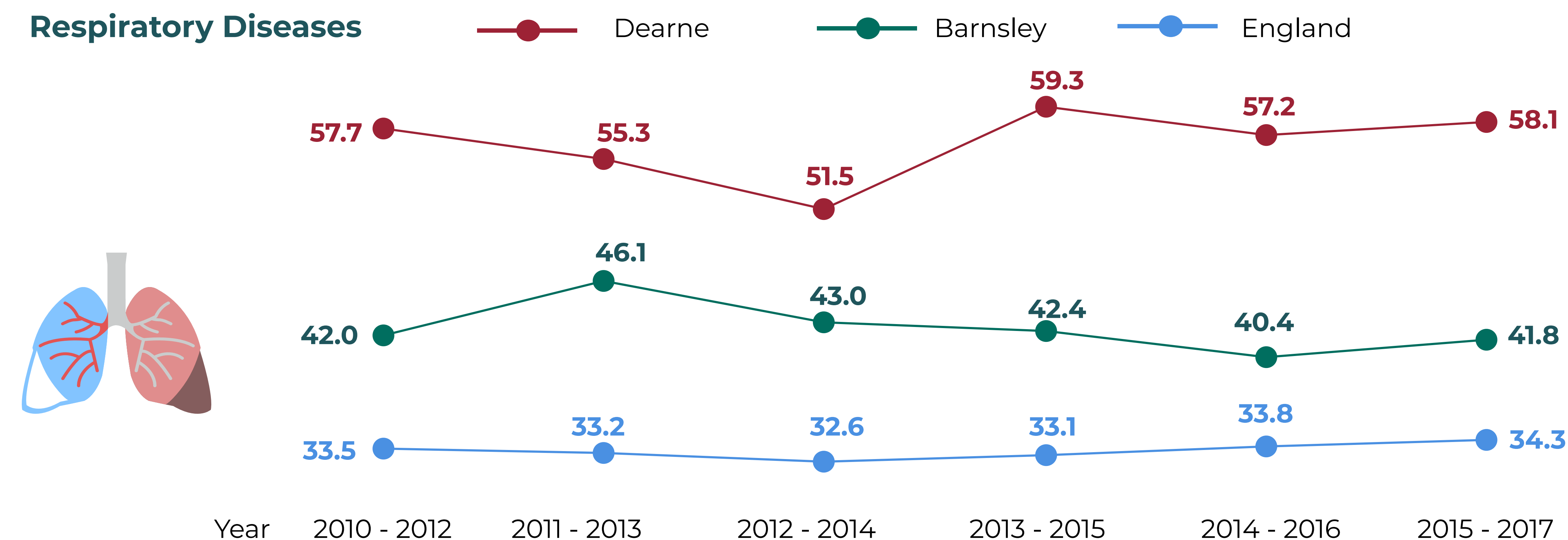

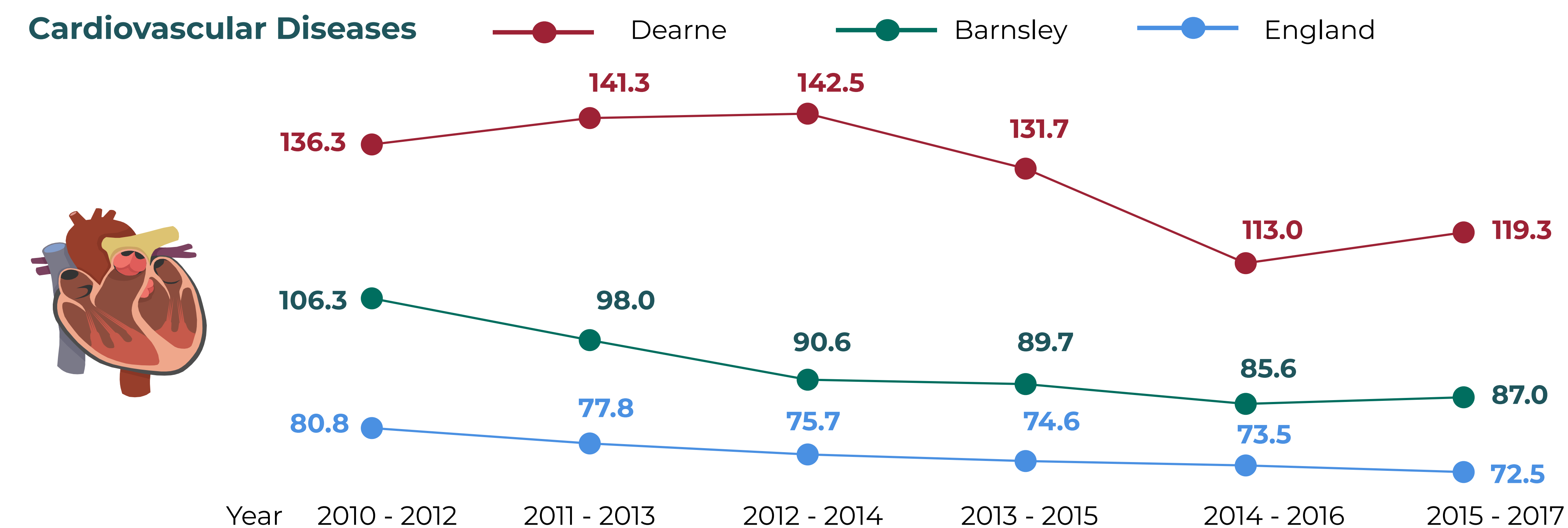
## Under 75 Mortality (rate per 100,000 population)

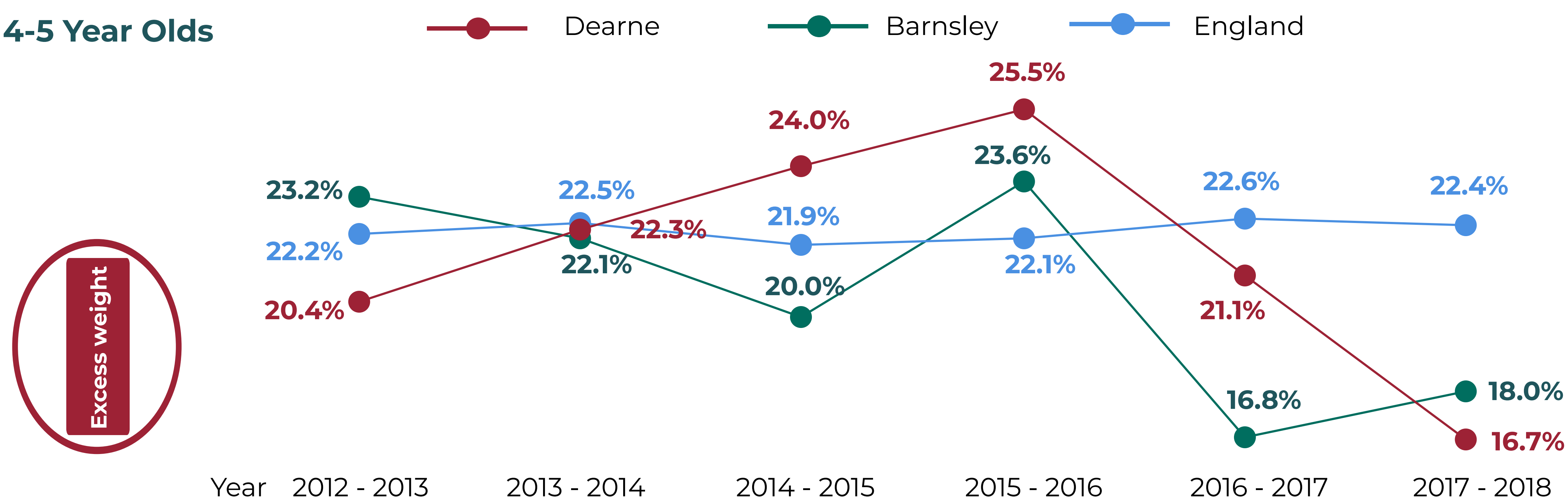

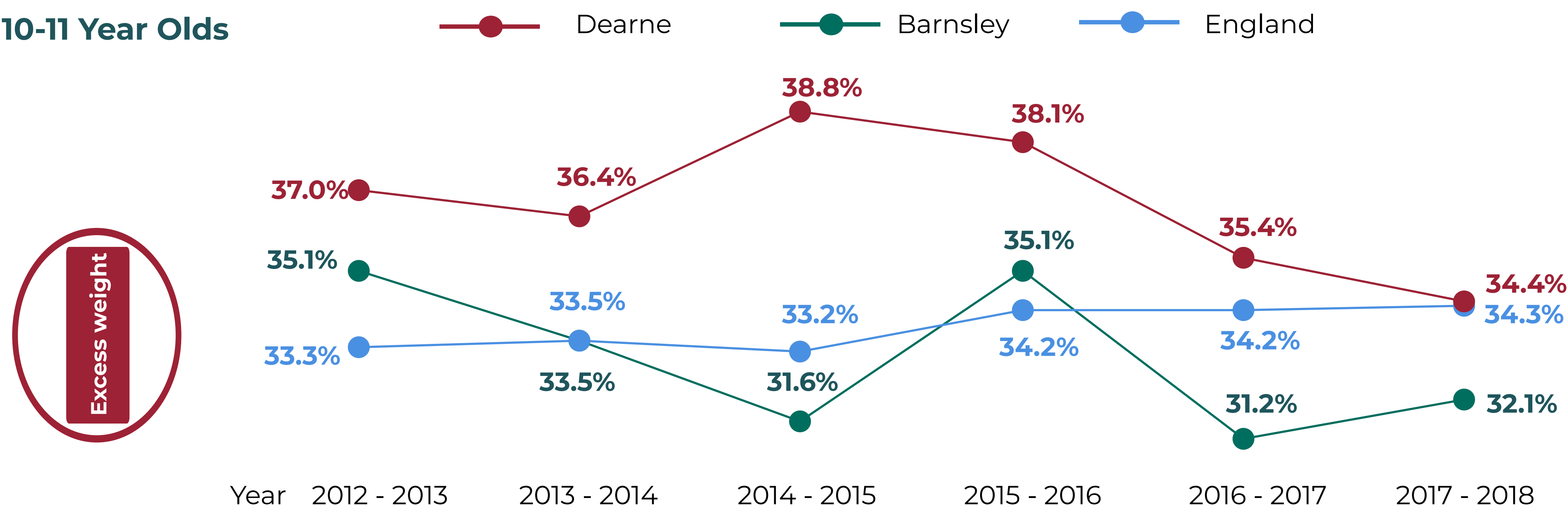
## Excess weight

The proportion of 4-5 year olds in the Dearne area who are overweight or obese (16.7%) is lower than the proportion in Barnsley overall (18.0%).

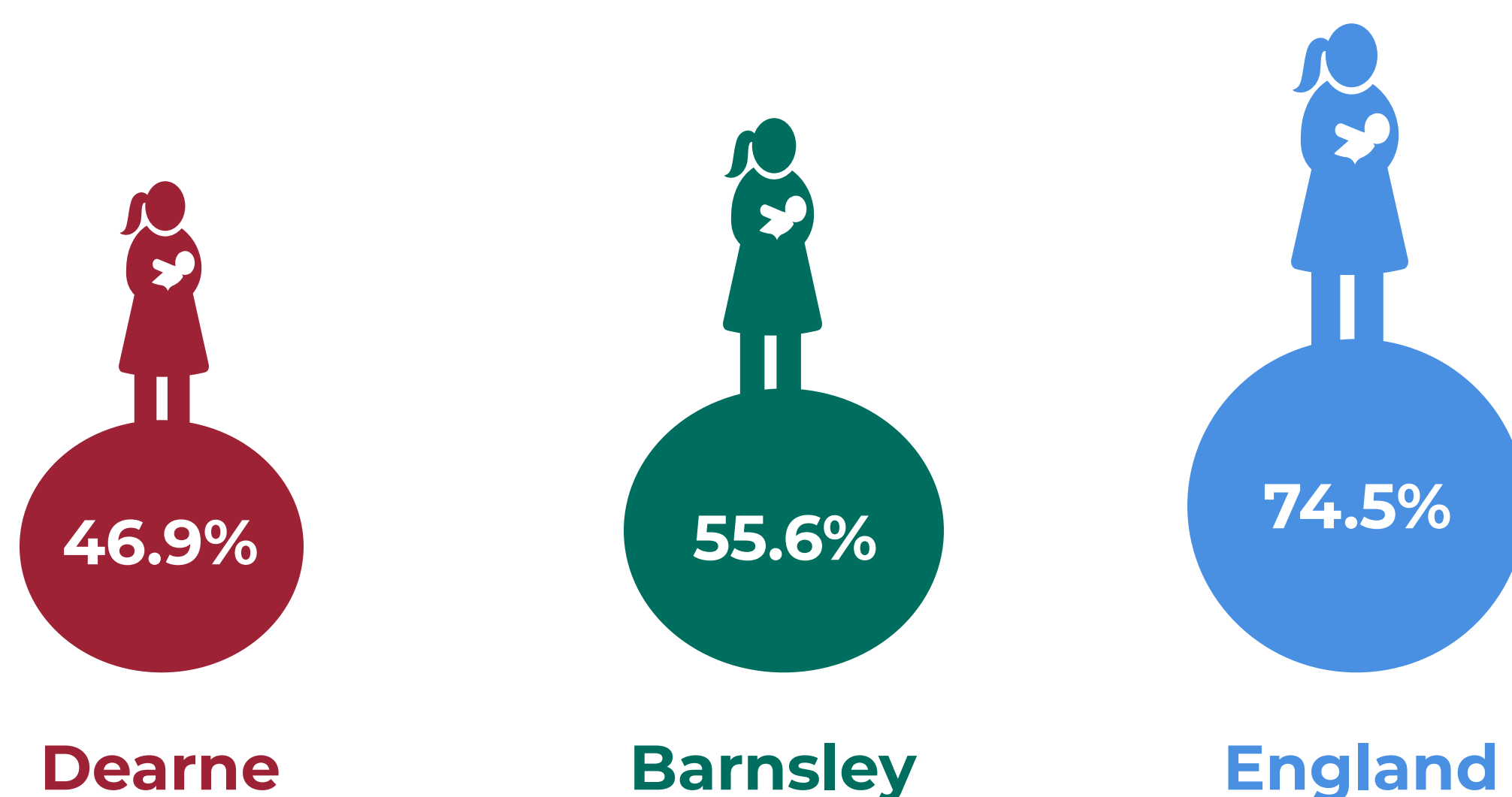
### 10-11 Year Olds

### Initiation



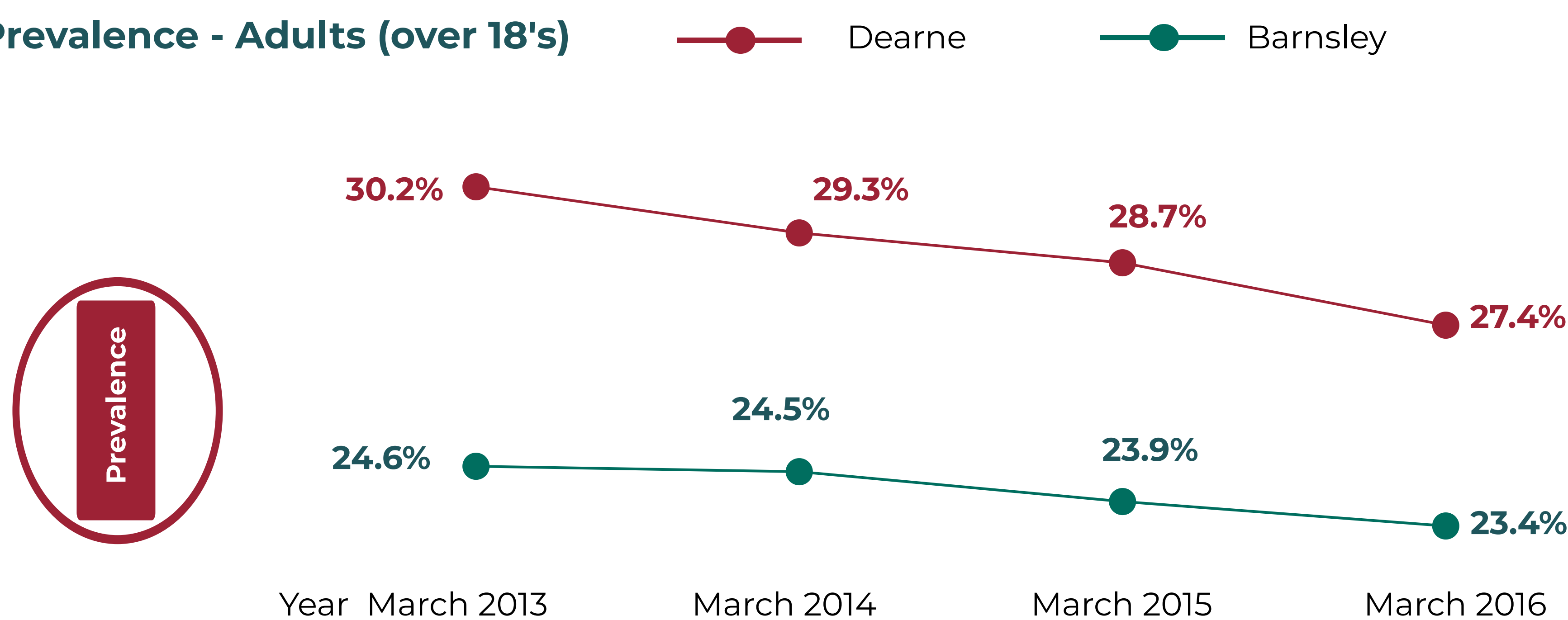
46.9% of women in the Dearne area breastfeed their babies at birth; lower than the Barnsley rate of 55.6%.

### Prevalence - Adults (over 18's)

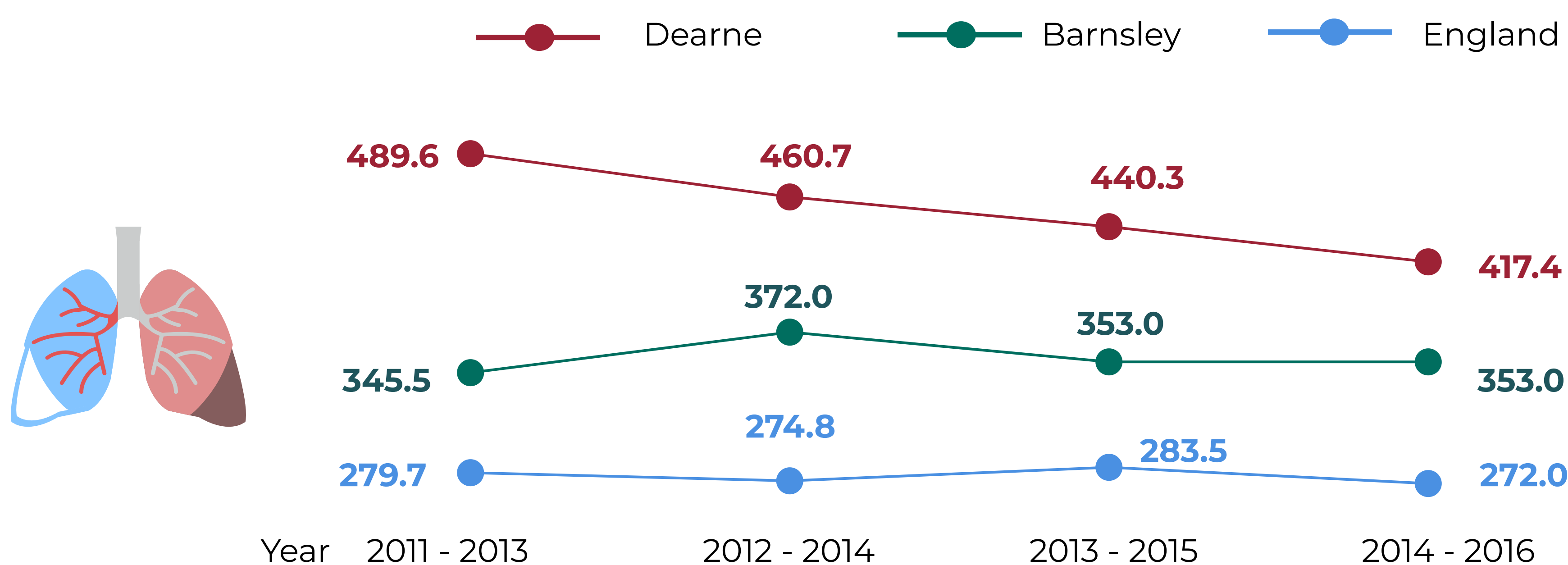


No England data available for smoking prevalence as the Area Council and Barnsley data has been calculated locally from GP records.

More than one in four adults in the Dearne area are smokers. Rates have been consistently higher than the Barnsley rates at each time point during the period 2013 to 2016. However, the current rate is the lowest since 2013.

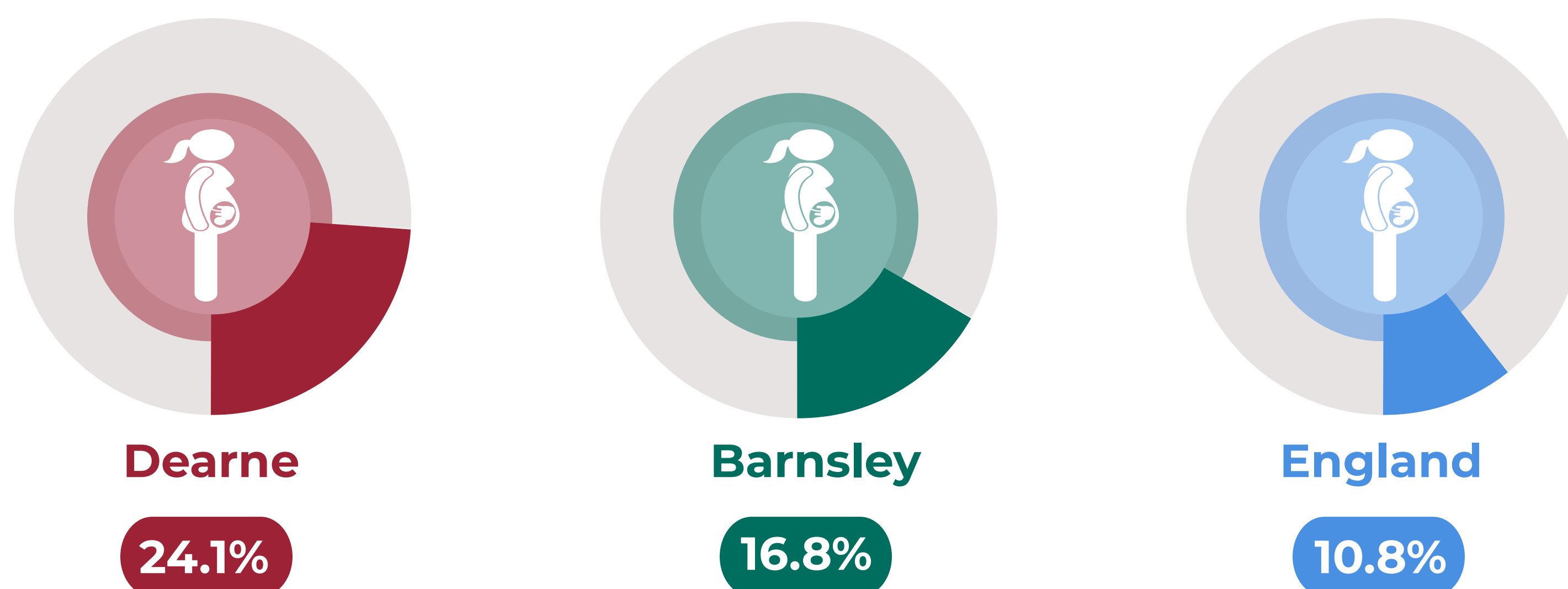
### Related Deaths per 100,000 (Over 35's)



Dearne Area's smoking related death rates have been consistently higher than the Barnsley rates at each time point during the period 2011-2013 to 2014-2016. However, the current rate of 417.4 per 100,000 (over 35's) is the lowest during the period.

# Households

## Residents Living Alone and Aged 65+ Years



The 2011 Census showed that 12.8% of the residents in the Dearne aged 65+ lived alone and could be at risk of social isolation. Rates are similar to those levels across Barnsley and nationally.

## Housing Tenure

### Owned



In the Dearne, a lower proportion of properties are owned either on a mortgage or outright when compared with Barnsley and England rates.

### Social Rented



In 2011 there were almost 1 in 4 social rented homes in the Dearne; slightly higher than Barnsley and significantly higher than nationally.

### Private Rented



In 2011 the proportion of all properties that were privately rented in the Dearne mirrored those nationally, but were slightly higher than those across Barnsley.

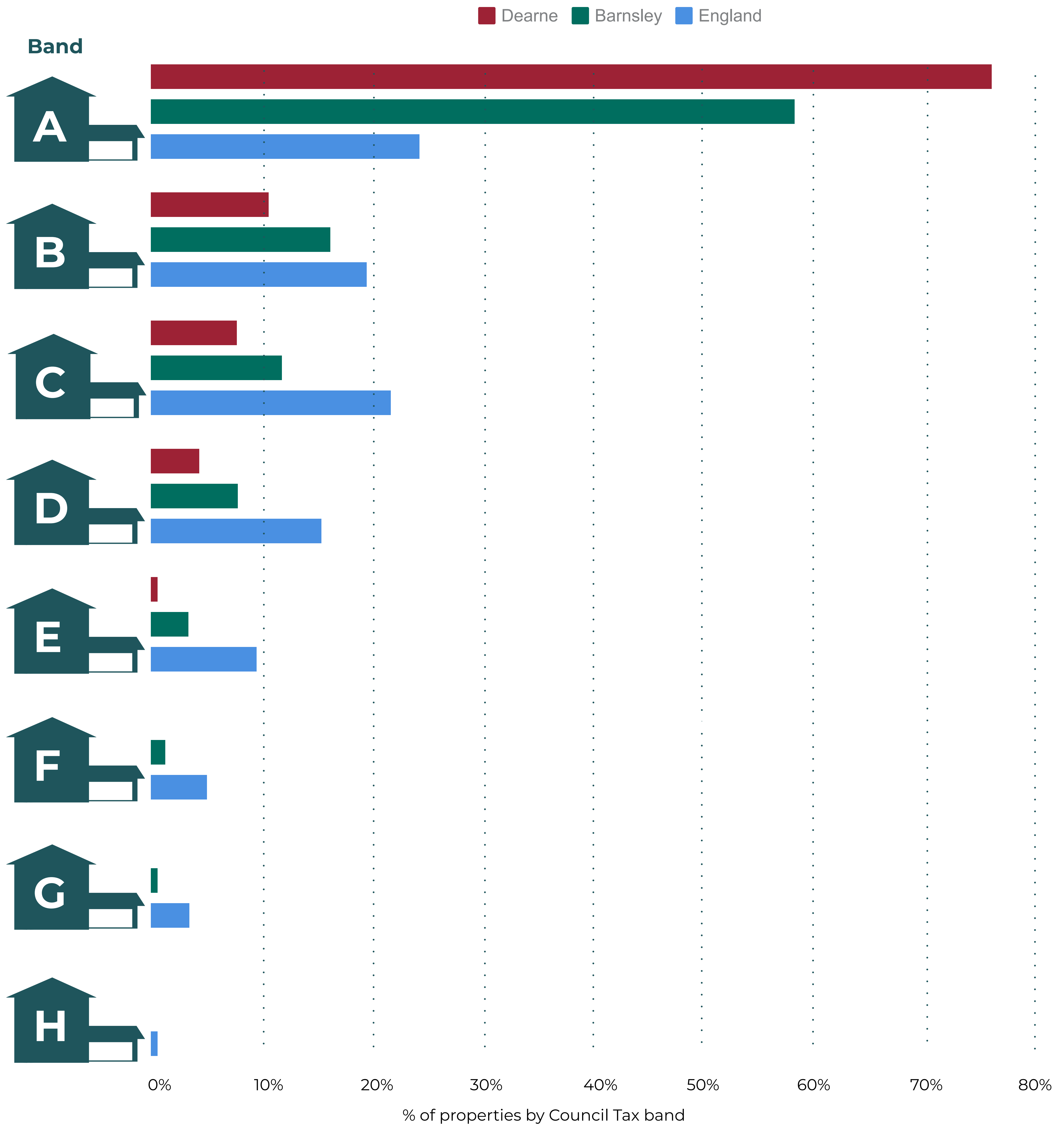

## Total Crime (rate per 1,000 population)



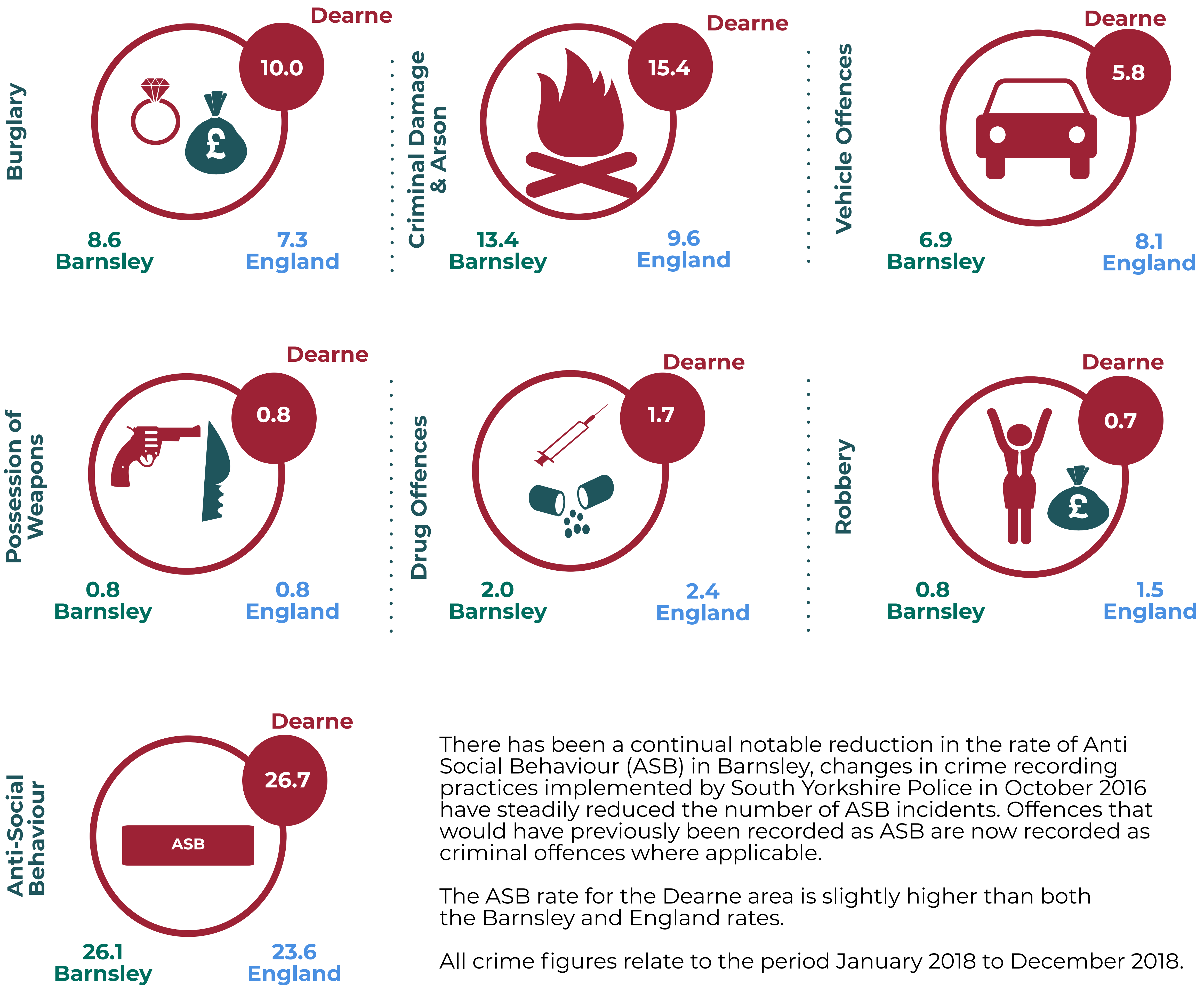

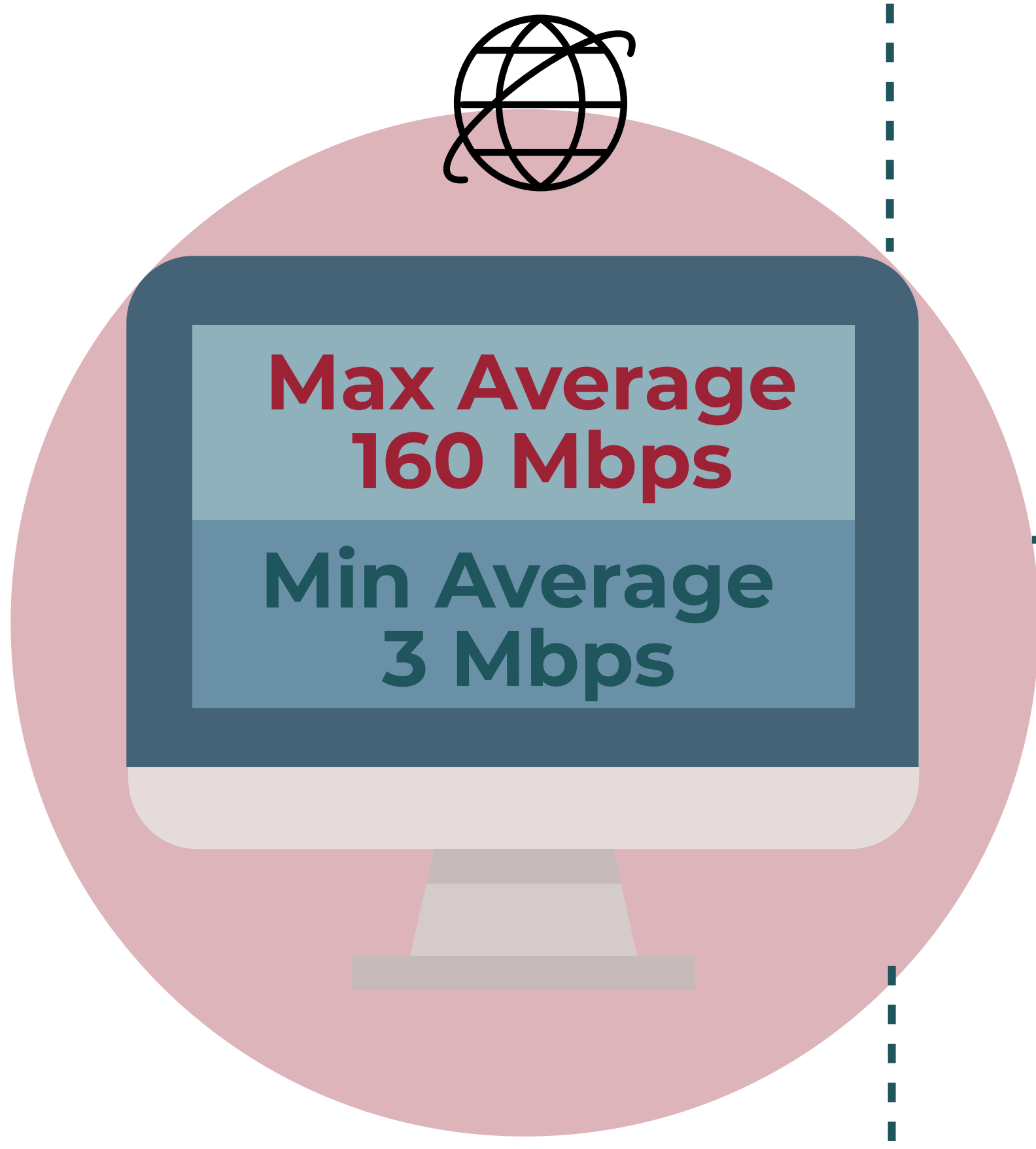

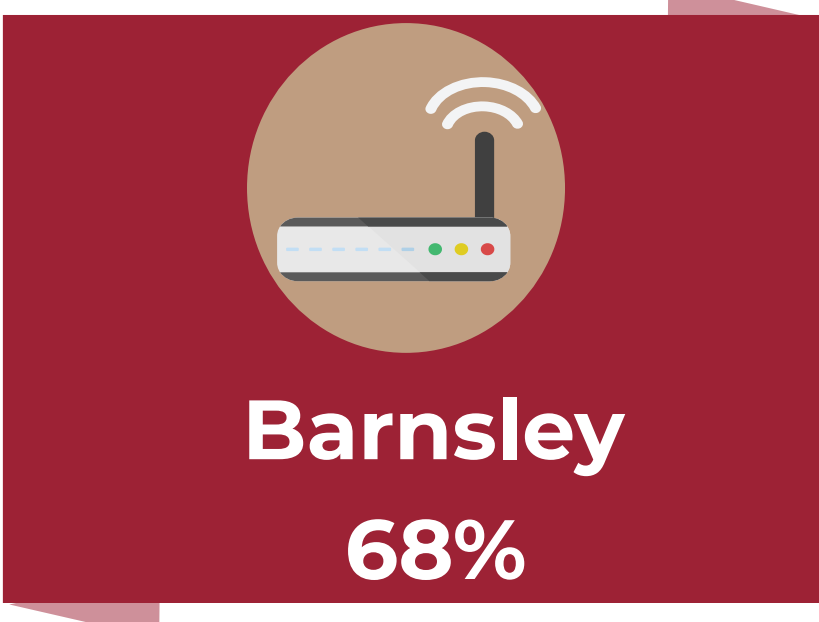

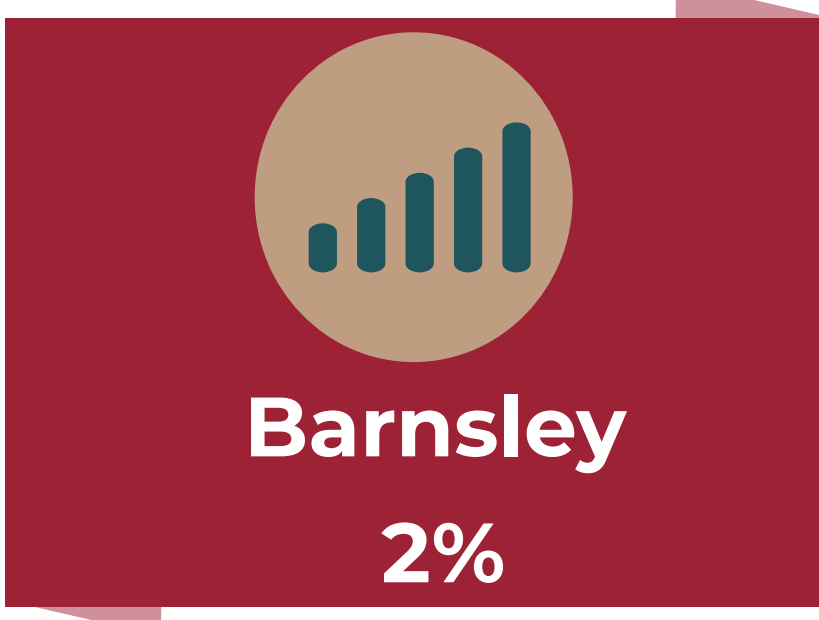
## Barnsley Internet Speed



Take up of Fixed Broadband



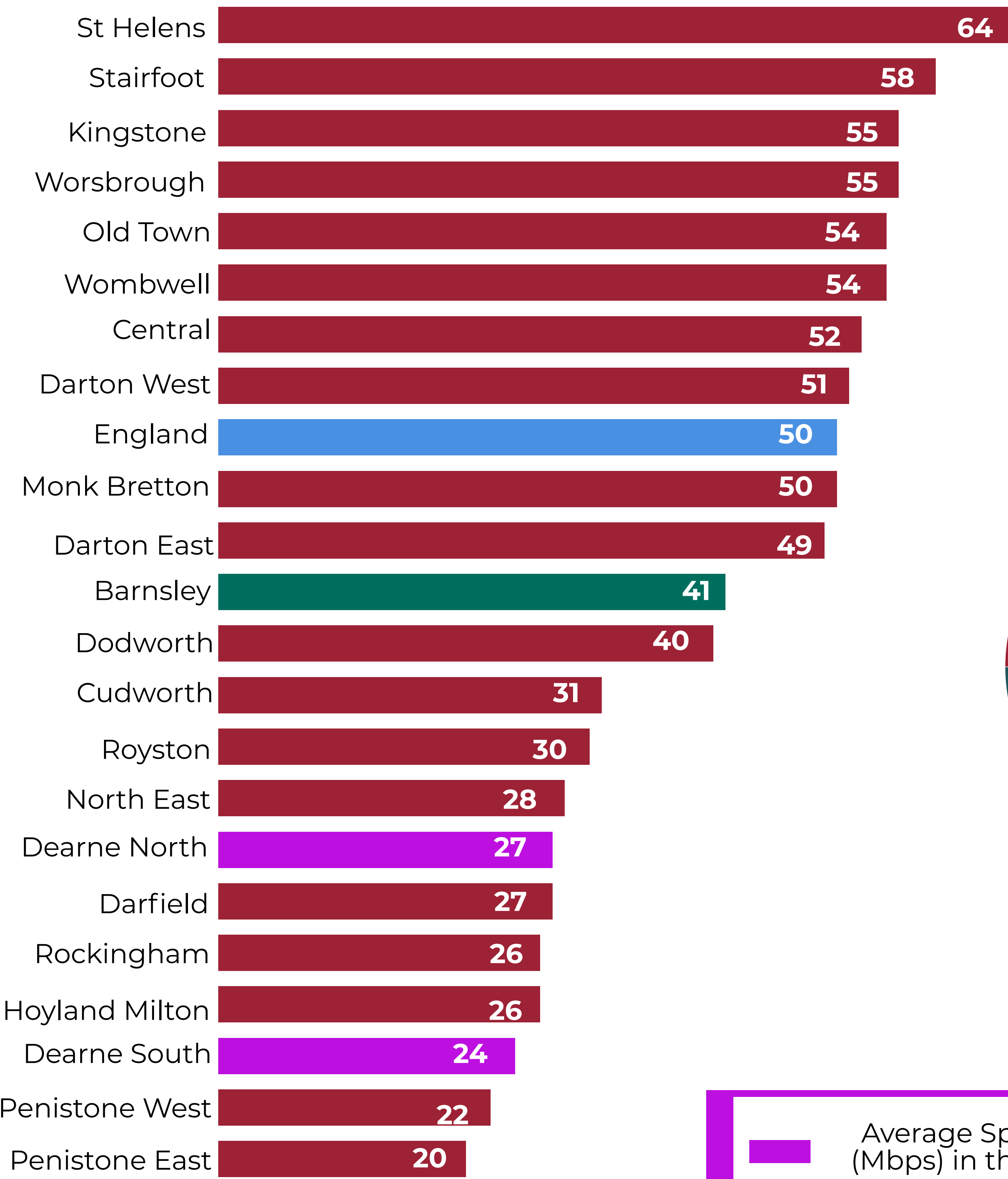
Homes that do not meet Governments 10Mbps 'legal right'



Adults not been online within the last 3 months



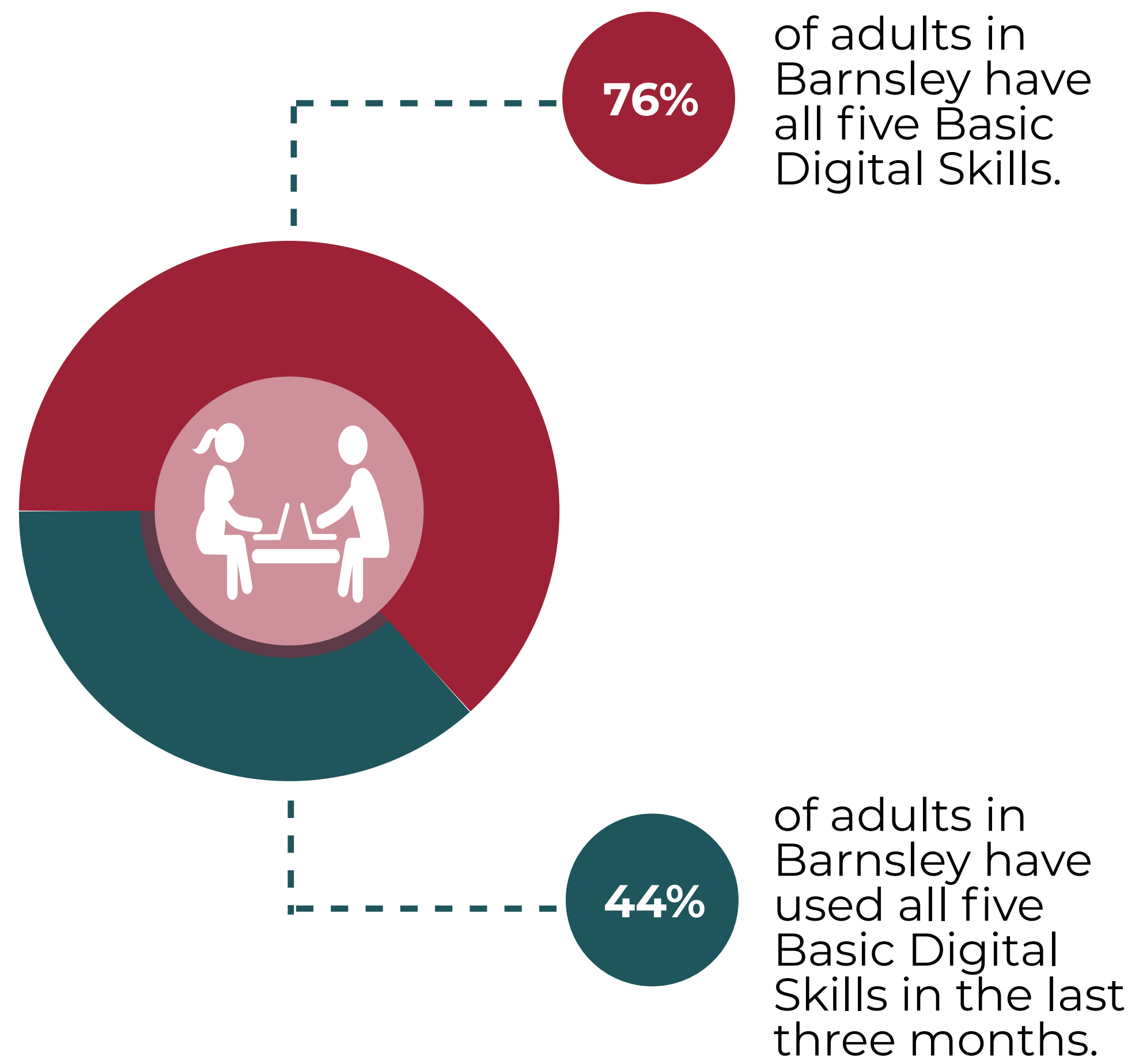
## Average Speed by Ward (Mbps)

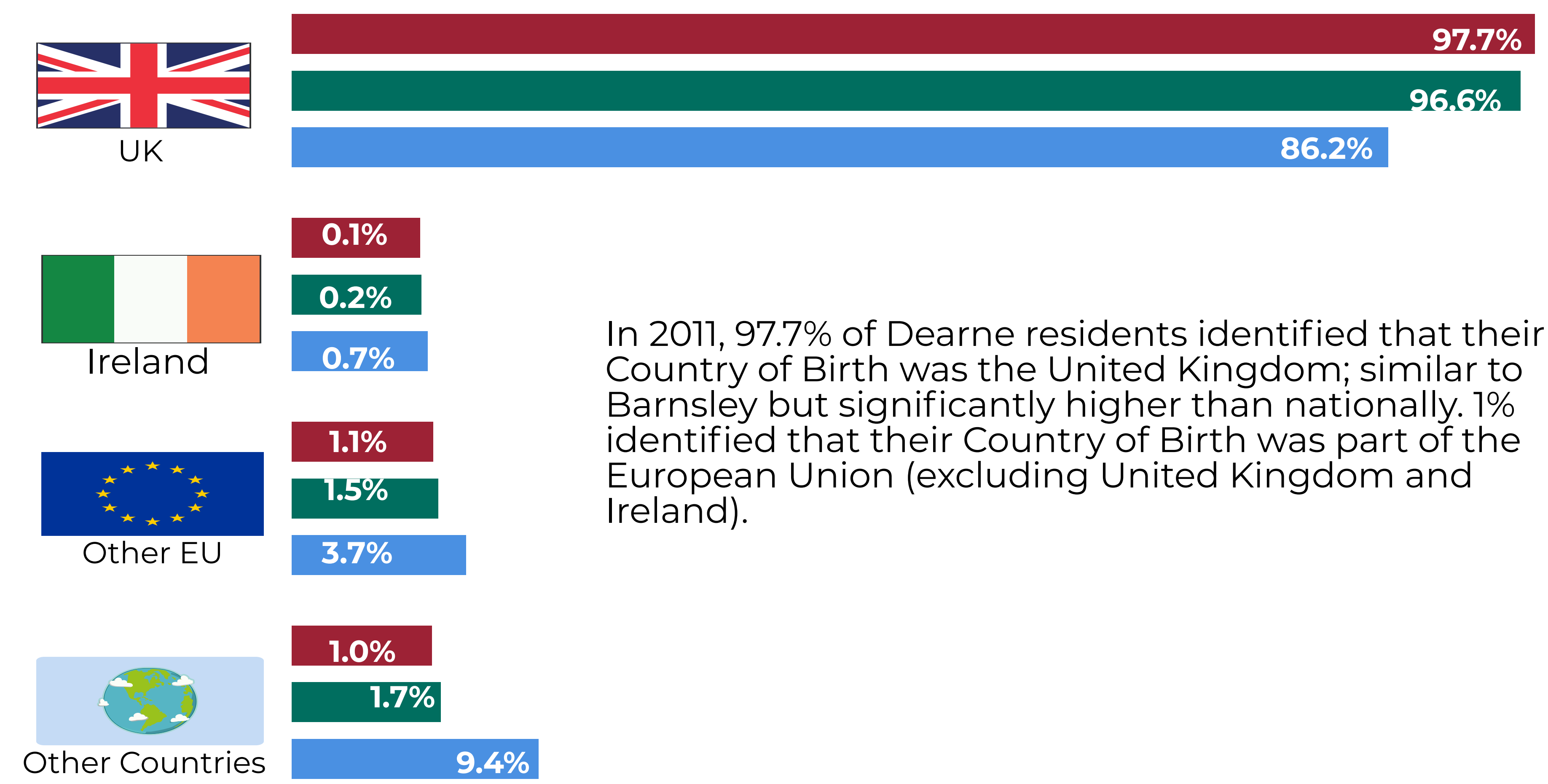
— Average Speed by Wards (Mbps) in the Dearne area

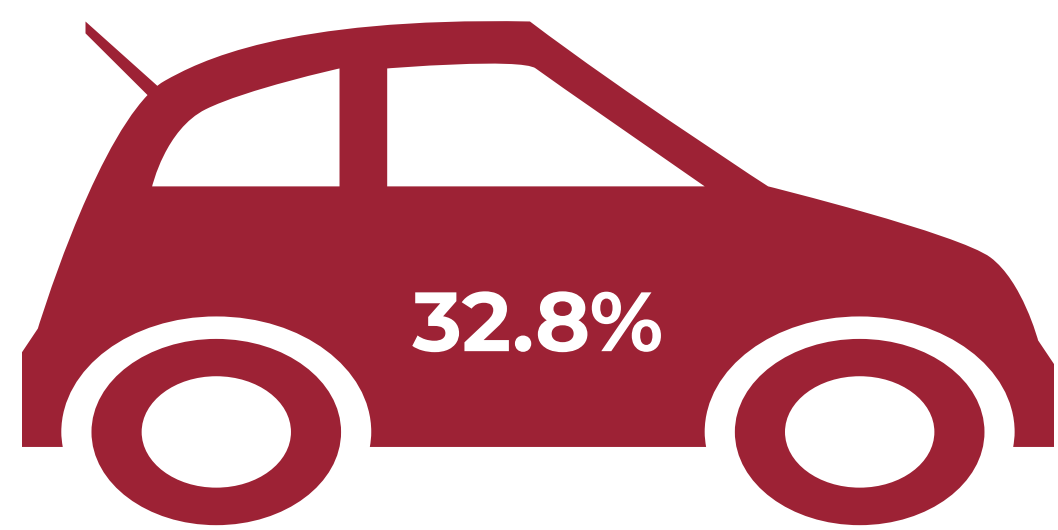

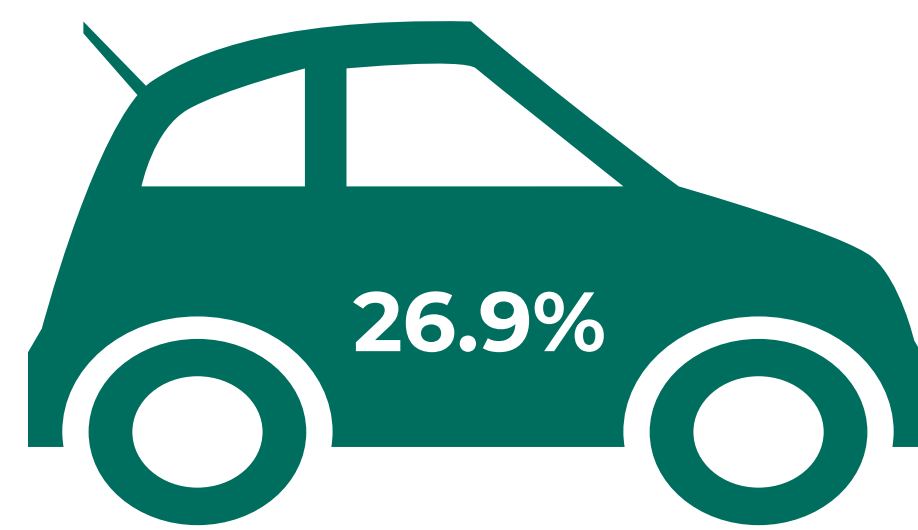

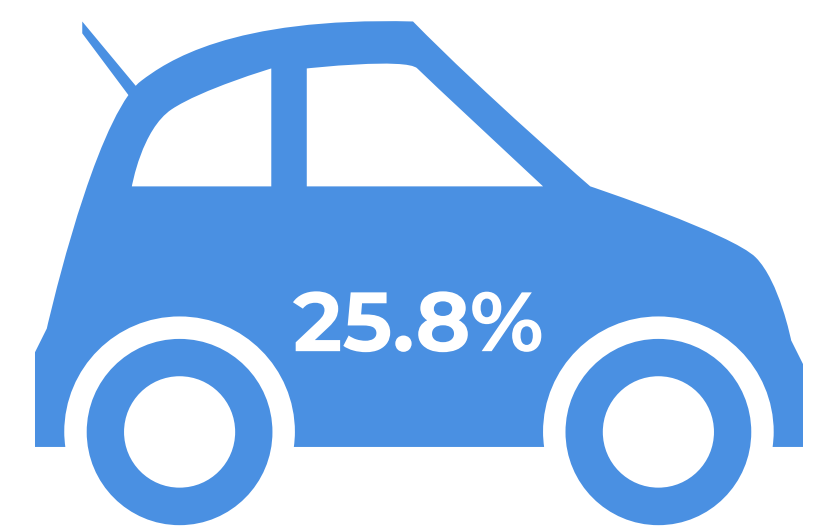
### No Cars or Vans in Household

## Excess Winter Deaths Index

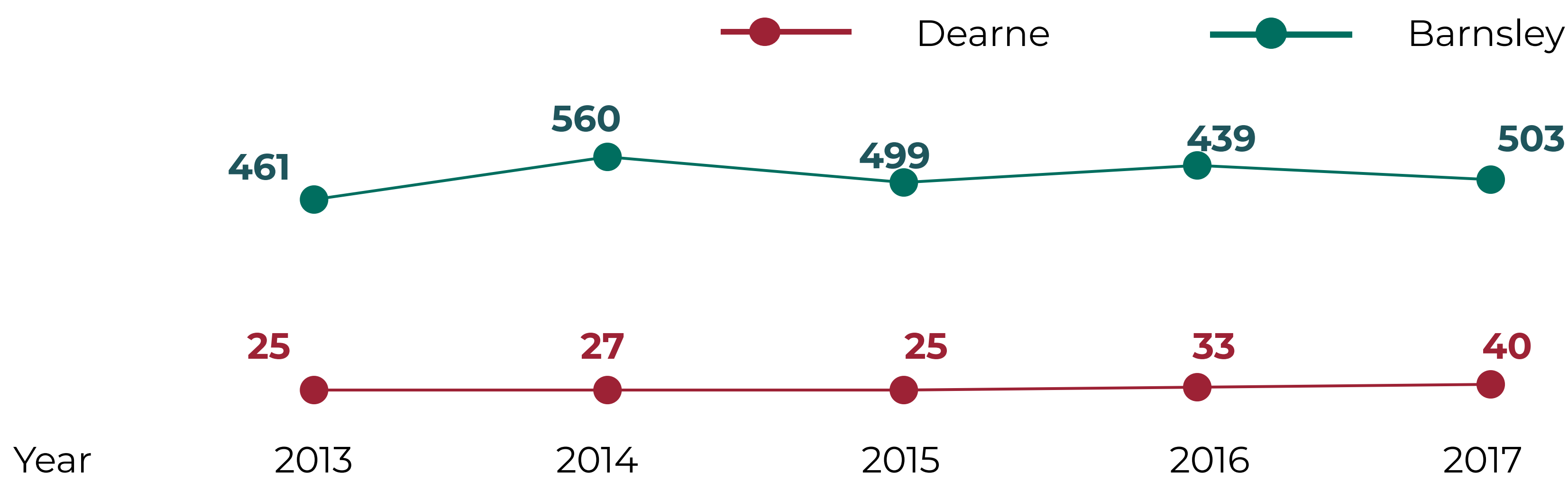


The Dearne area's Excess Winter Deaths rate is lower than those of Barnsley and England.

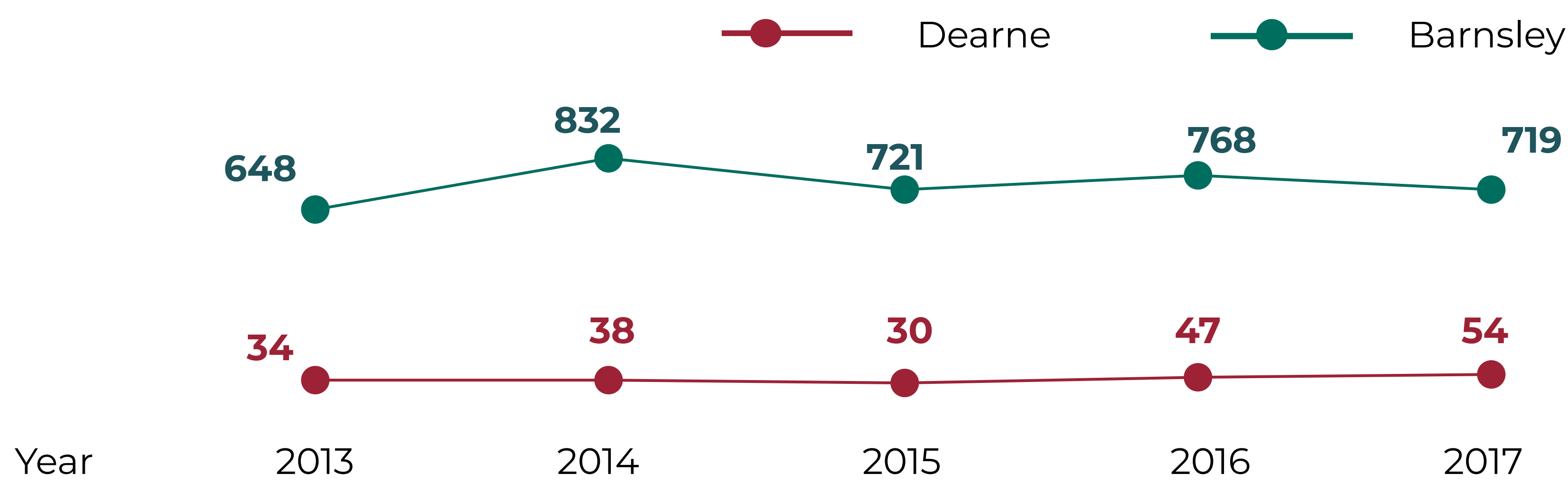
