Introduction and Purpose

Barnsley Council is continuing to change how we work together for a 'Better Barnsley'. We have ambitious plans to improve and grow as identified in our Corporate Plan for 2017-2020. Overall Population



Barnsley's population has been growing constantly since 2001. Since the 2011 Census, the resident population in Dodworth has increased by 8.0% compared to 4.9% in Barnsley overall. The increase in population is mainly due to more births than deaths and international migration. There are slightly more females compared with males within the ward.




Age Profile and % of Total Population


Main Language is not English




- LSOAs not in 10% Most Deprived in England




None of the LSOAs in Dodworth were in the 10% most deprived in England for both IMD 2010 and IMD 2015.



The Seven Domains of Deprivation and how Dodworth Performs


Percentage of Dodworth LSOAs in the Bottom 10% in England by Domain




Index of Multiple Deprivation 2015 Dodworth LSOAs Relative to England (DCLG, 2015)





The percentage of pupils resident in Dodworth ward achieving a good level of development decreased in 2018 with outcomes remaining above the Barnsley average but now just below the national average.


% of Pupils Achieving the Expected Standard in the Phonics Screening Check at the End of Year 1 2015 - 2018






The percentage of pupils resident in Dodworth ward achieving the expected standard in phonics screening increased in 2018, remaining above both the Barnsley and national averages.

% of Key Stage 1 Pupils Achieving the Expected Standard 2016 - 2018






% of Key Stage 2 Pupils Achieving the Expected Standard in Reading, Writing and Maths Combined 2016 - 2018










Life Expectancy at Birth

Life expectancy at birth for males in Dodworth is 2.4 years higher than for men in Barnsley.


Female

Rate per 1,000 Population Aged 15-17 Years




Under 18 conception rates in Dodworth have been consistently lower than the overall Barnsley rates during the period 2011 to 2015.




Under 75 Mortality (rate per 100,000 population)



Dodworth's under 75 cancer mortality rate (127.1 per 100,000) is lower than the Barnsley rate of 152.4 and is the lowest during the period 2010-2012 through to 2015-2017.



Dodworth's under 75 mortality rate from respiratory diseases (23.4 per 100,000) is lower than the Barnsley rate of 41.8 and England rate of 34.3.




The current rate of 88.9 per 100,000 is the highest during the period 2010-2012 through to 2015-2017 and is now higher than the rate for Barnsley.


Excess weight

4-5 Year Olds



The proportion of 4-5 year olds in Dodworth who are overweight or obese (18.7%) is slightly higher than the proportion in Barnsley (18.0%). The rate has increased from 17.7% in 2016-2017.

10-11 Year Olds



The proportion of 10-11 year olds in Dodworth who are overweight or obese (31.6%) is lower than the proportion in Barnsley (32.1%). However, the rate has significantly increased from 26.4% in 2016-2017.

72.4% of women in Dodworth breastfeed their babies at birth; higher than the Barnsley rate of 55.6%.




Prevalence - Adults (over 18's)





No England data available for smoking prevalence as the Ward and Barnsley data has been calculated locally from GP records.

Local GP records 2013 - 2016

One in five adults in Dodworth are smokers. Rates have been consistently lower than the Barnsley rates at each time point during the period 2013 to 2016. The current rate of 20.5% is the lowest since 2013.


Related Deaths per 100,000 (Over 35's)



Dodworth's smoking related death rates have been consistently lower than the rates for Barnsley overall during the period 2011-2013 through to 2014-2016. The current rate of 222.3 is the lowest during the period.

Fewer than one in ten women in Dodworth smoke during pregnancy (9.5%); lower than the Barnsley rate of 16.8% and England rate of 10.8%.

Residents Living Alone and Aged 65+ Years



The 2011 Census showed that 15.9% of households in Barnsley contained residents aged 65+ years that were living alone and could be at risk of social isolation.

Housing Tenure

Owned



Three quarters of properties are owned with a mortgage or owned outright in Dodworth. Ownership is higher than both the Barnsley and England rates.

Social Rented



More than 1 in 7 properties in Dodworth are social rented; this is lower than both the Barnsley and England rates.

Private Rented



Dodworth has fewer private rented properties than both Barnsley and England.



Properties are banded into one of eight valuation bands (A to H, with A being properties of lowest value to H being the highest). These are decided by the government's Valuation Office which determines the amount of council tax to be paid. The chart shows that there are more Dodworth households in Band D compared to Barnsley and England.

Total Crime (rate per 1,000 population)





There has been a continual notable reduction in the rate of Anti Social Behaviour (ASB) in Barnsley, as changes in crime recording practices implemented by South Yorkshire Police in October 2016 have steadily reduced the number of ASB incidents. Offences that would have previously been recorded as ASB are now recorded as criminal offences where applicable.


The ASB rate for Dodworth is lower than both the Barnsley and England rates.

Take up of Fixed Broadband




Homes that do not meet Governments 10Mbps 'legal right'



Adults not been online within the last 3 months




Average Speed by Ward (Mbps)


