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# Introduction and Purpose

Barnsley Council is continuing to change how we work together for a 'Better Barnsley'. We have ambitious plans to improve and grow as identified in our Corporate Plan for 2017-2020. # Demographics

## Overall Population


Up **8.6%** since 2011

Barnsley's population has been growing constantly since 2001. Since the 2011 Census, the resident population in Monk Bretton has increased by 8.6% compared to 4.9% in Barnsley overall. The increase in population is mainly due to more births than deaths and international migration. There are slightly more females than males within the ward.


## Age Profile and % of Total Population


## Main Language is not English



This is calculated based on seven domains of deprivation, which in turn are composed of a number of indicators that are scored and ranked to produce an overall domain score.


### Proportion of Monk Bretton Lower Super Output Areas (LSOAs) in 10% Most Deprived in England

- LSOAs not in 10% Most Deprived in England




### The Seven Domains of Deprivation and how Monk Bretton Performs


Percentage of Monk Bretton LSOAs in the Bottom 10% in England by Domain





The percentage of pupils resident in the Monk Bretton ward achieving a good level of development decreased in 2018 with outcomes remaining below both the Barnsley and national averages.


## % of Pupils Achieving the Expected Standard in the Phonics Screening Check at the End of Year 1 2015 - 2018



The percentage of pupils resident in the Monk Bretton ward achieving the expected standard in 2018 decreased and is now below both the Barnsley and national averages.



## % of Key Stage 1 Pupils Achieving the Expected Standard 2016 - 2018














## Life Expectancy at Birth

Life expectancy at birth for males in Monk Bretton is 1 year lower than for men in Barnsley.




Rate per 1,000 Population Aged 15-17 Years








## Under 75 Mortality (rate per 100,000 population)



Monk Bretton's under 75 cancer mortality rate (178.3 per 100,000) is higher than the Barnsley rate of 152.4 and is the highest rate since 2010-2012.




## Excess weight


### 10-11 Year Olds

Nearly half of women in Monk Bretton (49.3%) breastfeed their babies at birth; lower than the Barnsley rate of 55.6%.




## Smoking

Just over a quarter of adults in Monk Bretton are smokers. The current rate of 25.3% is higher than the Barnsley rate of 23.4%, but the lowest since 2013.


### Related Deaths per 100,000 (Over 35's)



Monk Bretton's smoking related death rates have been consistently higher than the rates for Barnsley and England during the period 2011-2013 through to 2014-2016. However, the current rate is the lowest during the period.


## Residents Living Alone and Aged 65+ Years


The 2011 Census showed that 14.6% of households in Monk Bretton contained residents aged 65+ years that were living alone and could be at risk of social isolation.





Almost 6 in every 10 properties are owned with a mortgage or owned outright in Monk Bretton. Ownership is lower than both the Barnsley and England rates.


### Social Rented

Monk Bretton has fewer private rented properties than both Barnsley and England.











There has been a continual notable reduction in the rate of Anti Social Behaviour (ASB) in Barnsley, as changes in crime recording practices implemented by South Yorkshire Police in October 2016 have steadily reduced the number of ASB incidents. Offences that would have previously been recorded as ASB are now recorded as criminal offences where applicable.


The ASB rate for Monk Bretton is higher than both the Barnsley and England rates.

All crime figures relate to the period January 2018 to December 2018.



## Barnsley Internet Speed




## Average Speed by Ward (Mbps)



## Access to a Car or Van


### No Cars or Vans in Household


## Mortality Rate from Causes Considered Preventable (rate per 100,000 population)
