Introduction and Purpose

Barnsley Council is continuing to change how we work together for a 'Better Barnsley'. We have ambitious plans to improve and grow as identified in our Corporate Plan for 2017-2020. Overall Population

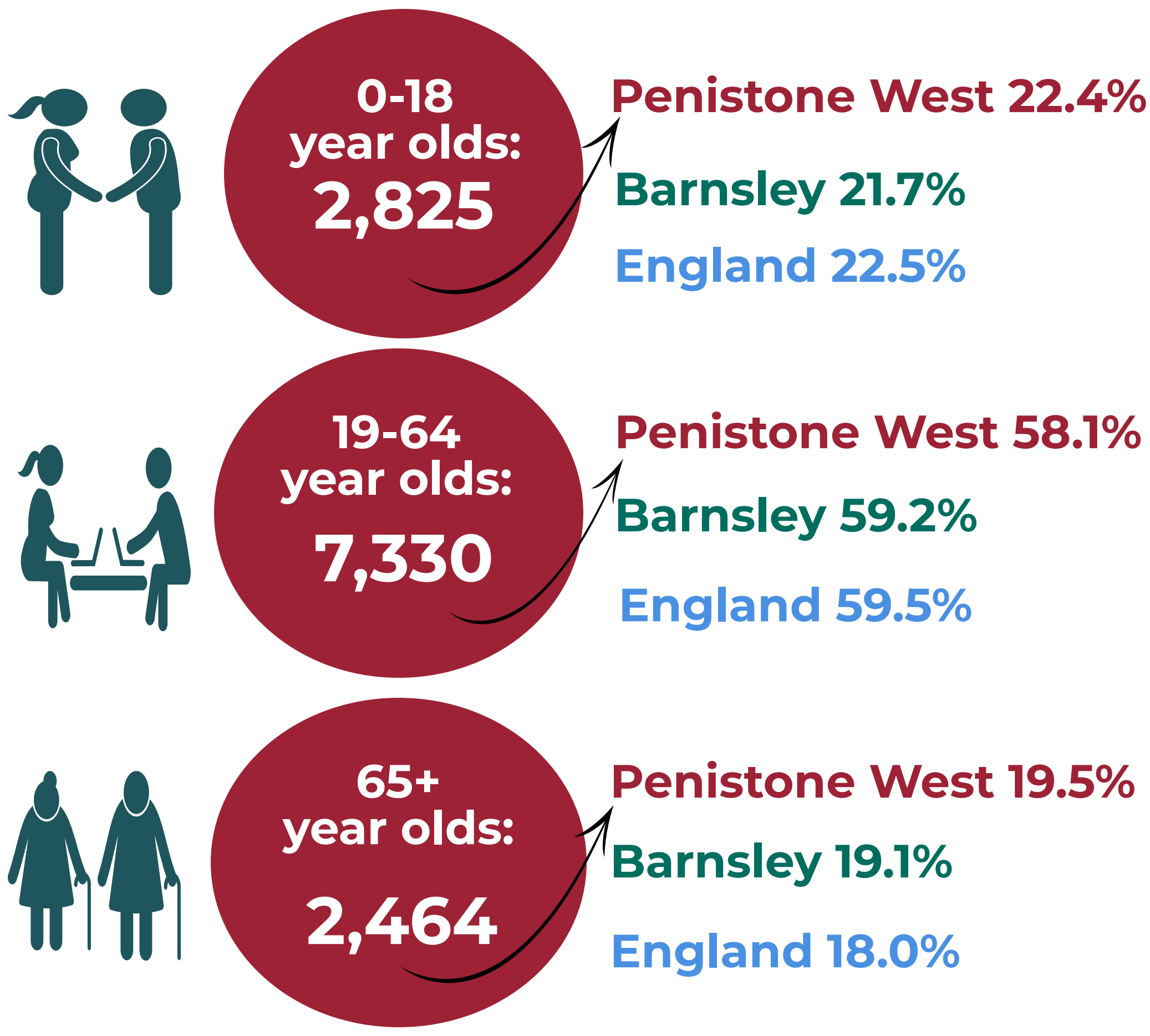

Barnsley's population has been growing constantly since 2001. Since the 2011 Census, the resident population in Penistone West has increased by 11.2%; more than double the rate of increase for Barnsley overall (4.9%). The increase in population is mainly due to more births than deaths and international migration. There are slightly more females compared with males within the ward.



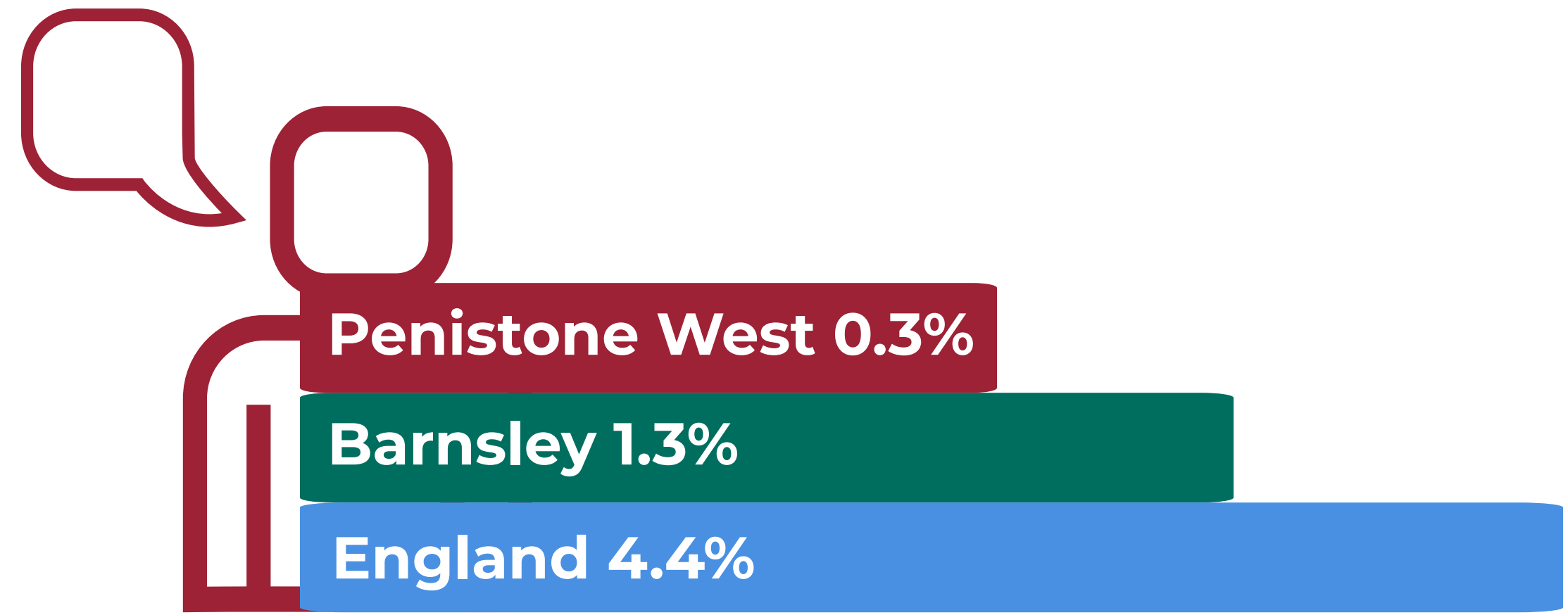
Age Profile and % of Total Population

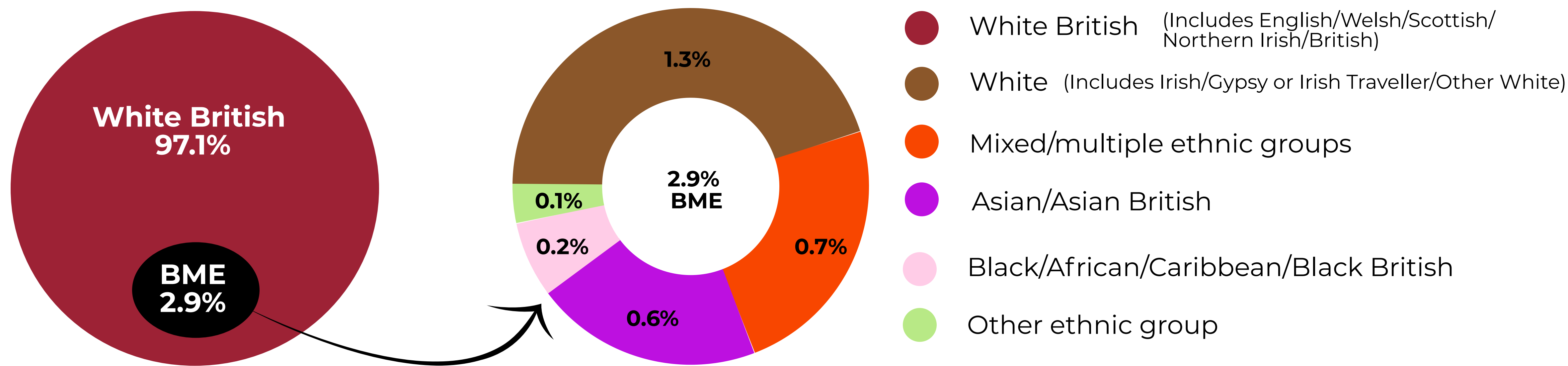

Barnsley's ethnic diversity continues to change. In the 2011 Census, 3 out of 100 people in Penistone West were from a Black and Minority Ethnic (BME) group compared to 4 in every 100 people in Barnsley overall. The 2011 Census is the most up to date national data available on ethnicity.

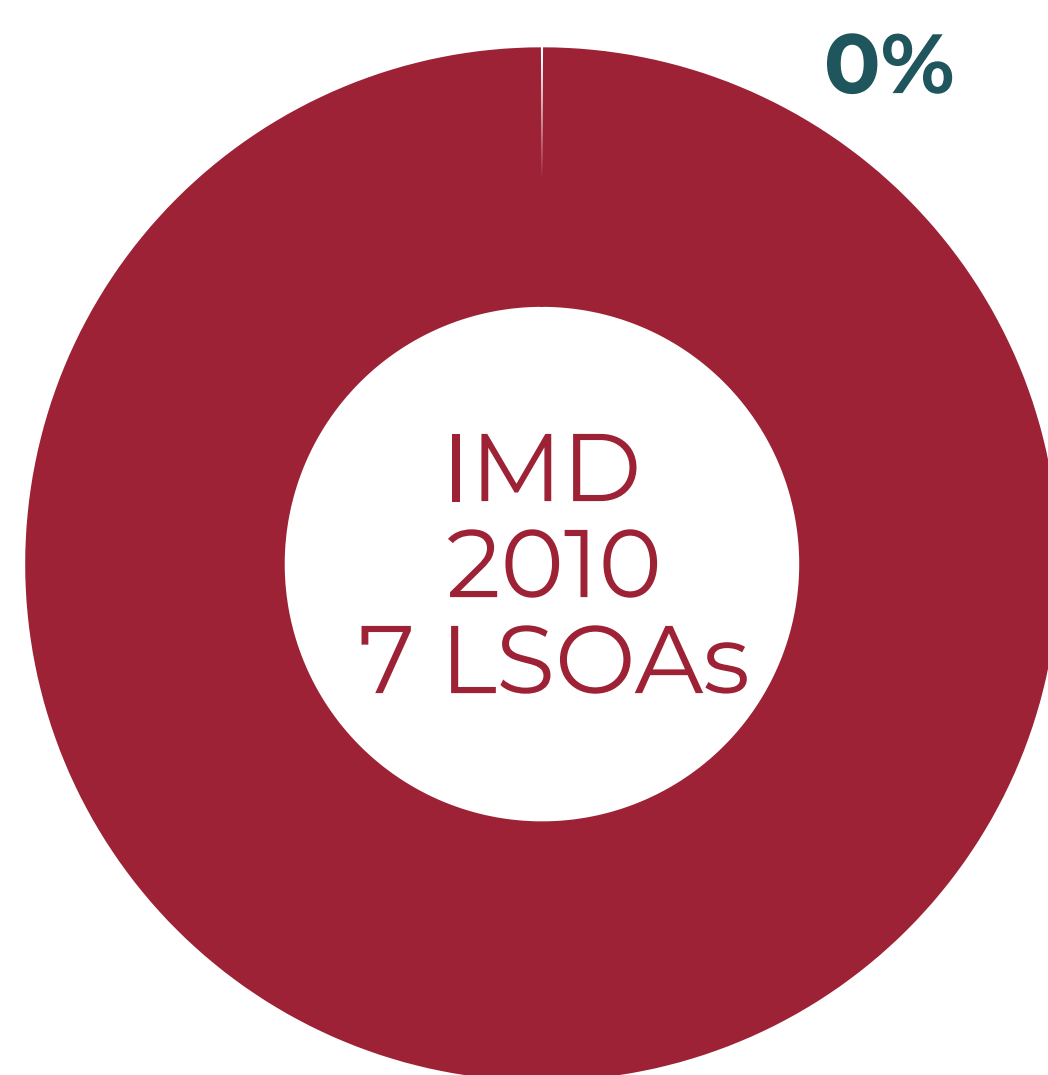
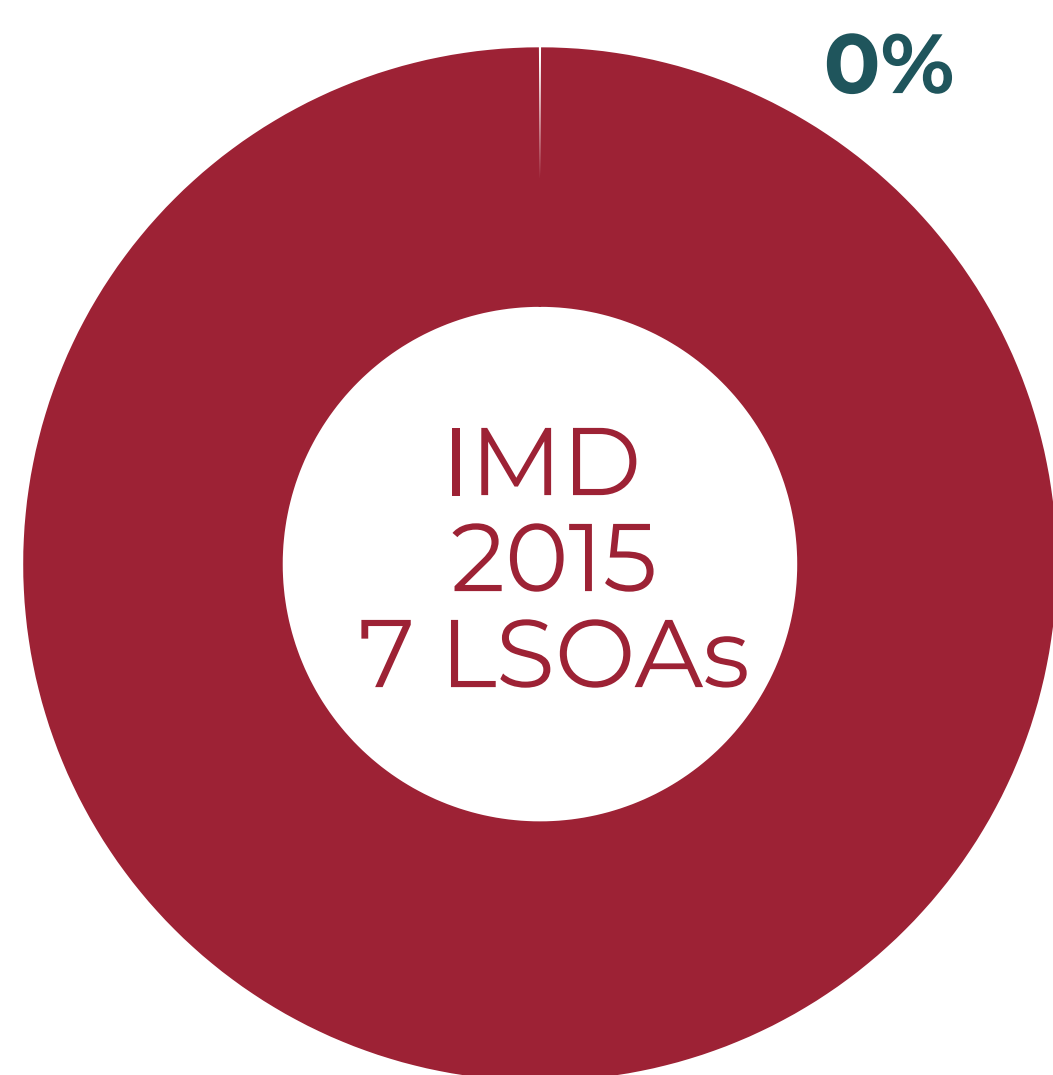

Proportion of Penistone West Lower Super Output Areas (LSOAs) in 10% Most Deprived in England

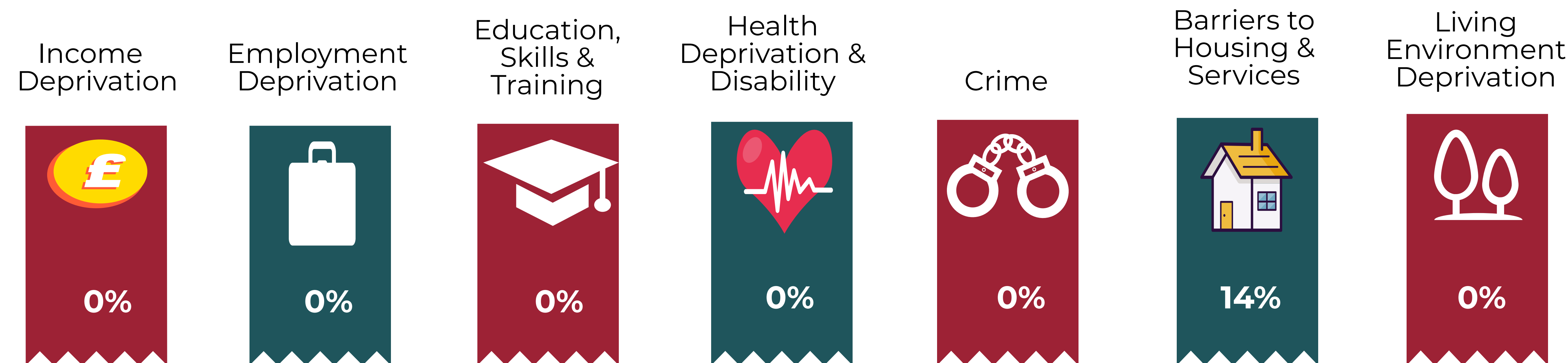
- LSOAs in 10% Most Deprived in England
- LSOAs not in 10% Most Deprived in England



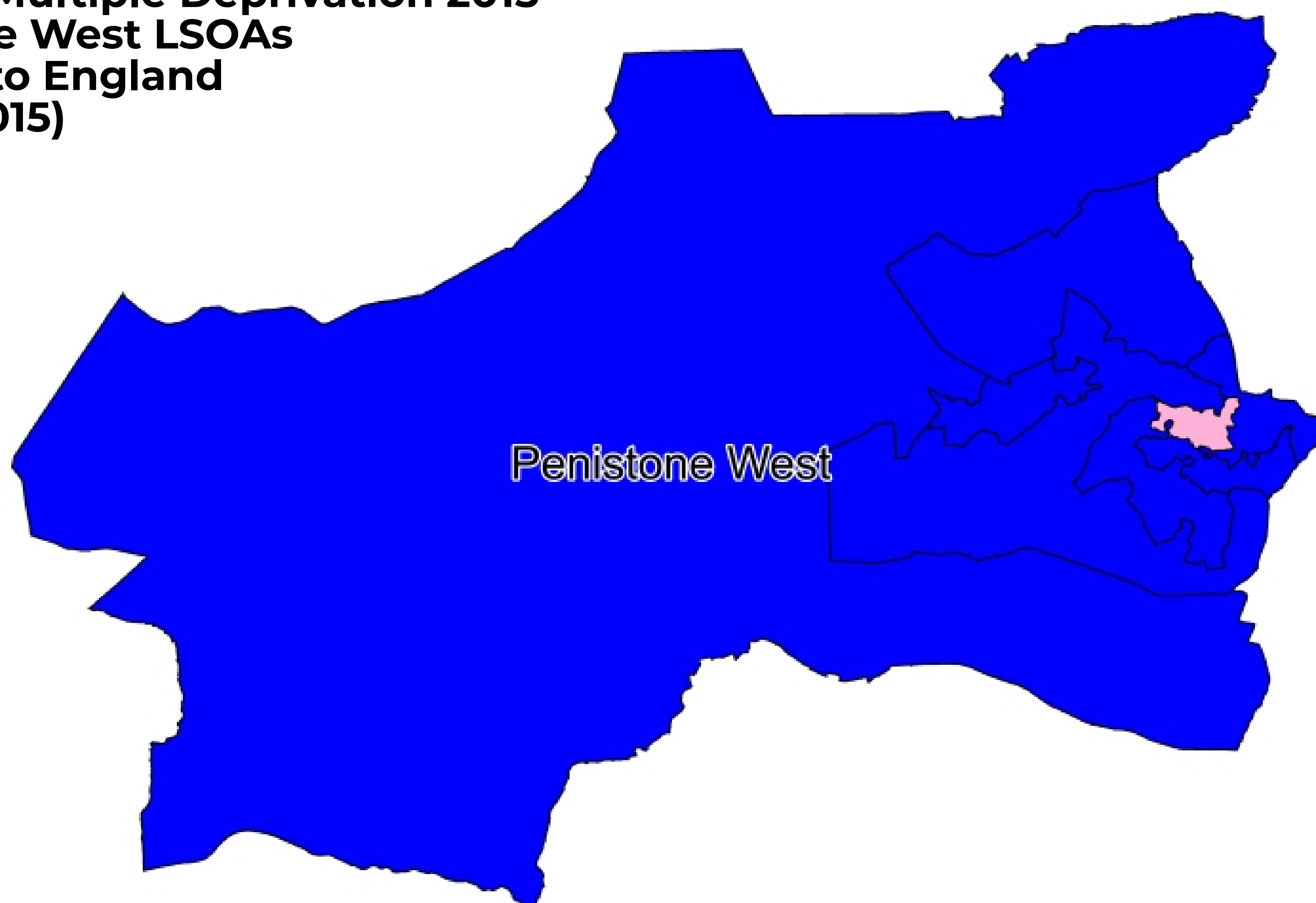
None of the LSOAs in Penistone West were in the 10% most deprived in England for both IMD 2010 and IMD 2015.

The Seven Domains of Deprivation and how Penistone West Performs

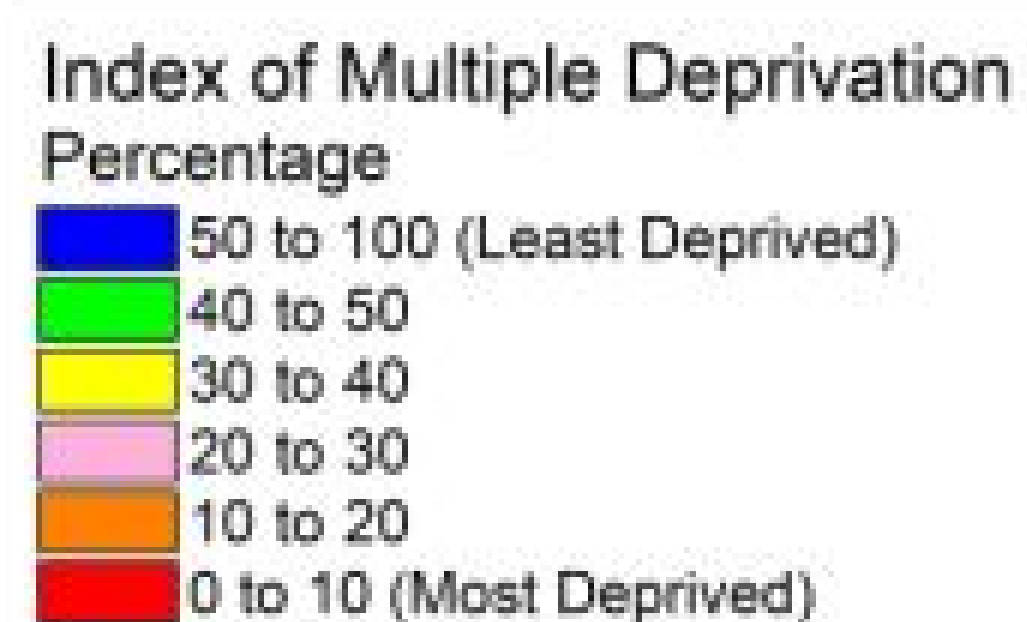
Percentage of Penistone West LSOAs in the Bottom 10% in England by Domain



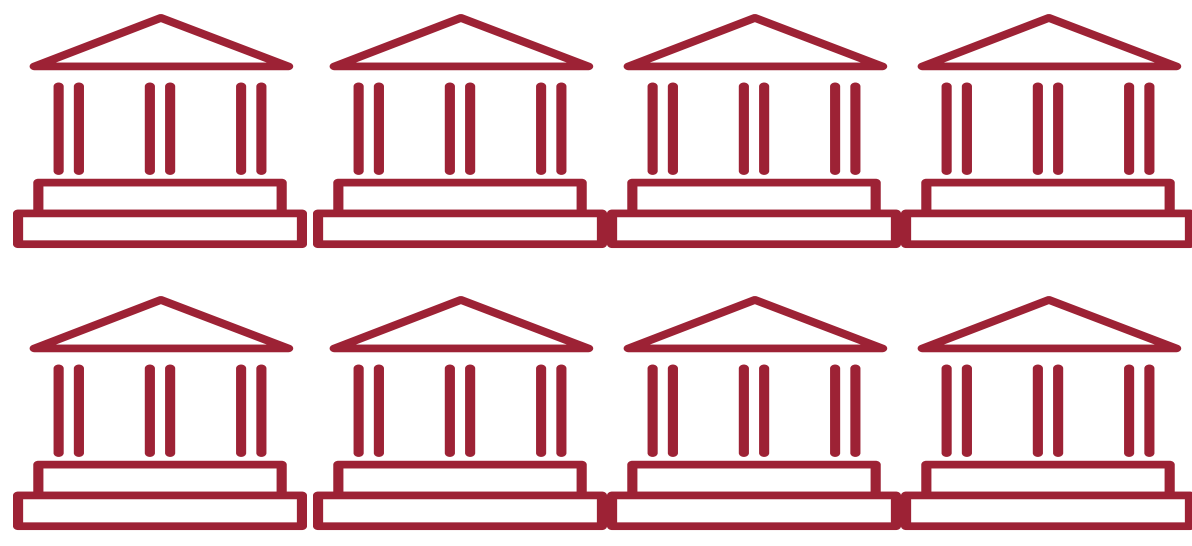
Index of Multiple Deprivation 2015 Penistone West LSOAs Relative to England (DCLG, 2015)

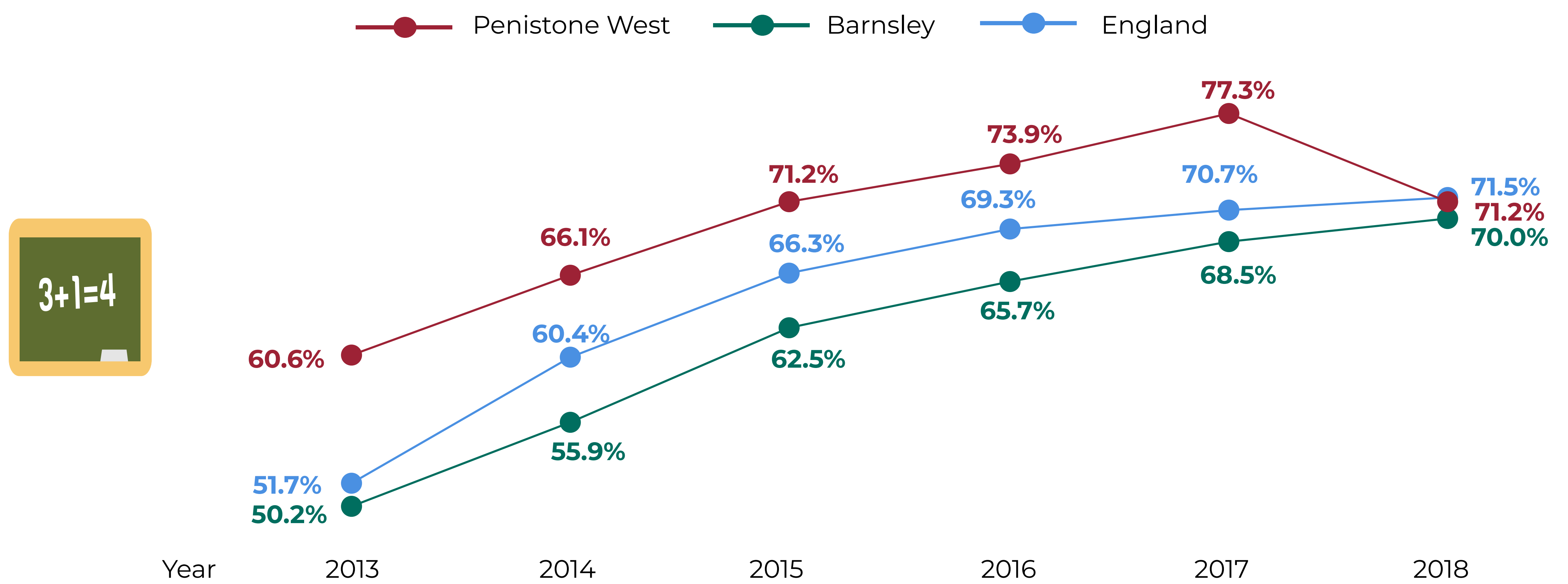

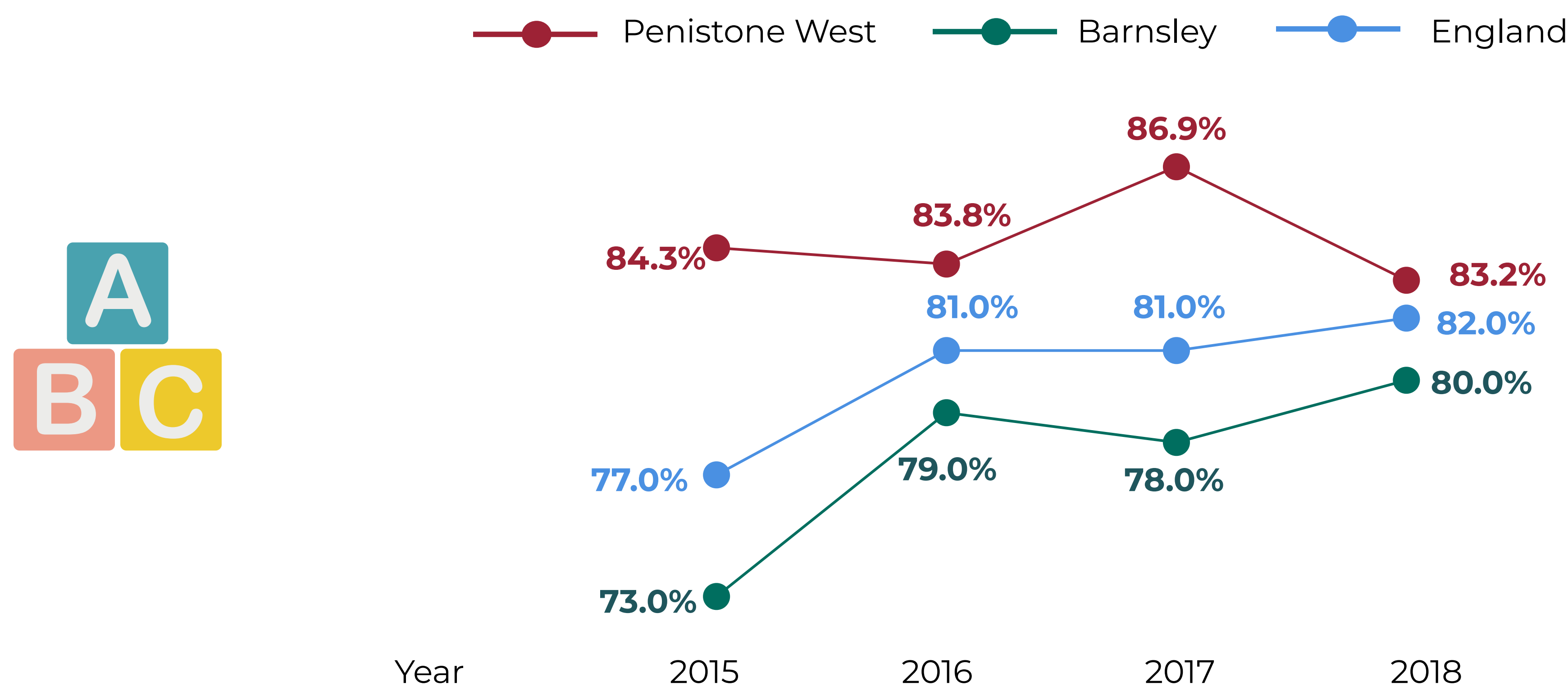

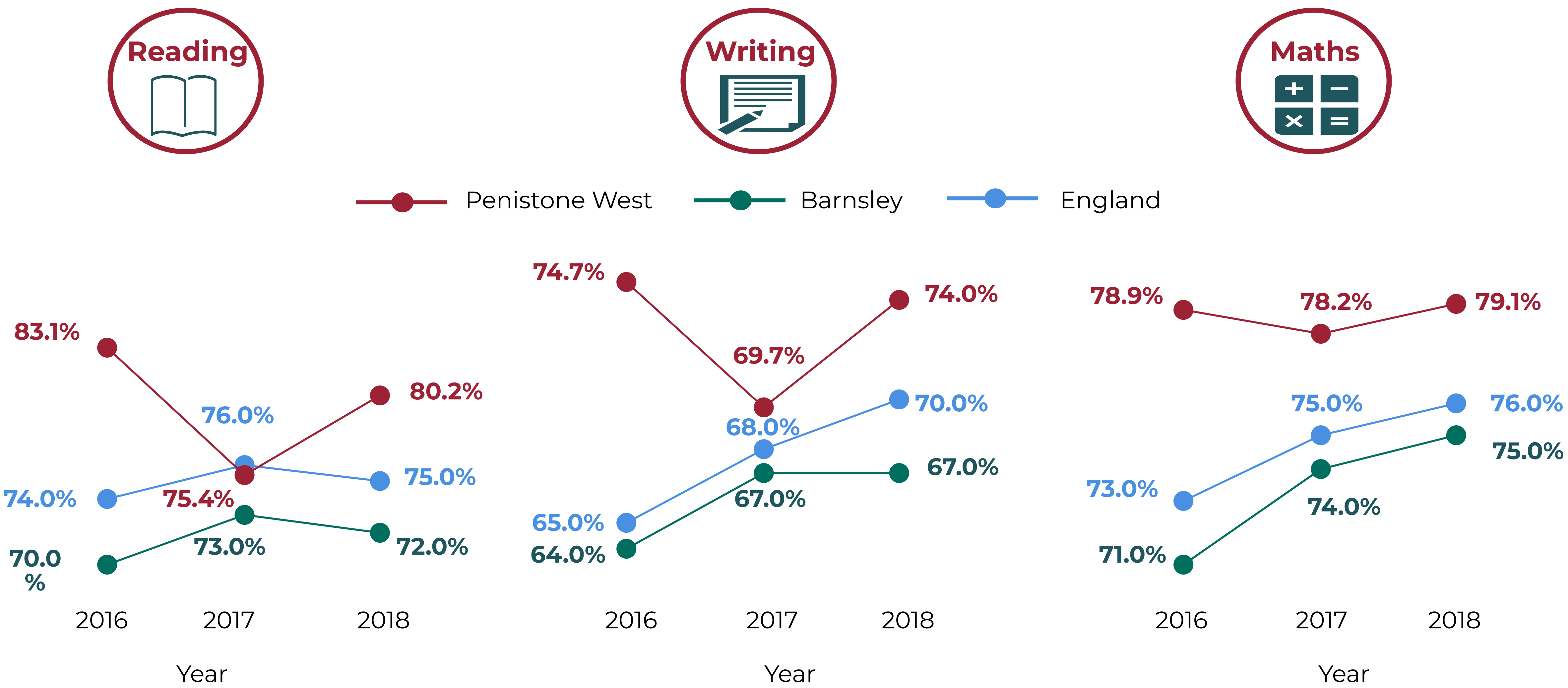
% of Pupils Achieving the Expected Standard in the Phonics Screening Check at the End of Year 1 2015 - 2018



The percentage of pupils resident in the Penistone West ward achieving the expected standard in 2018 decreased, although outcomes remained above both the Barnsley and national averages.

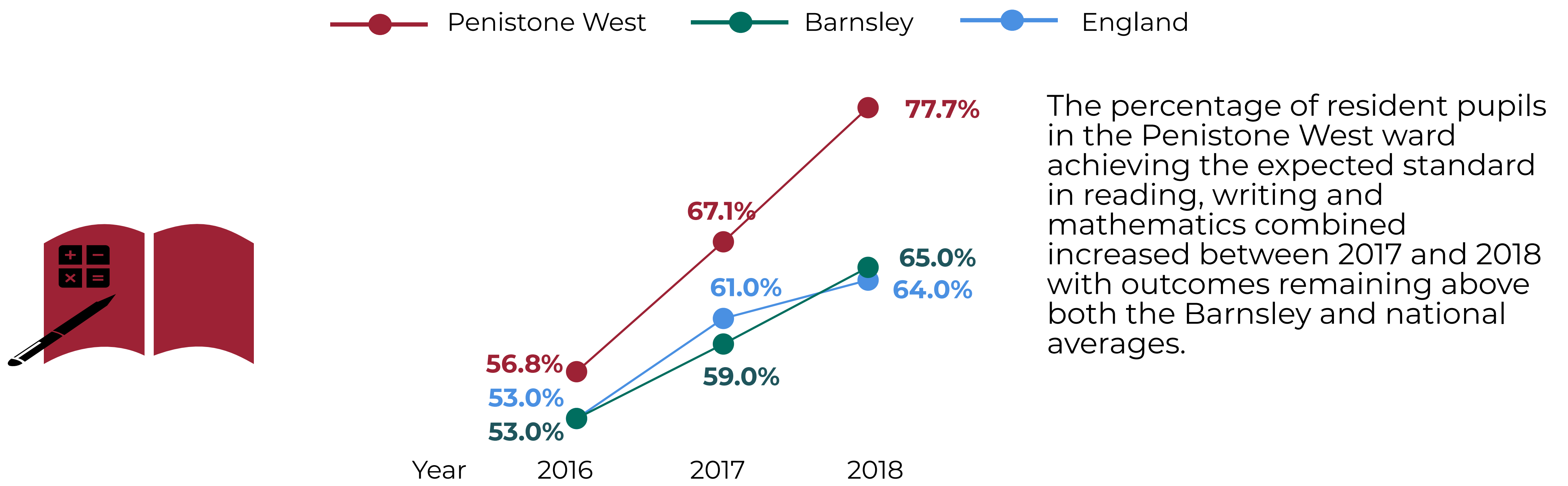

% of Key Stage 1 Pupils Achieving the Expected Standard 2016 - 2018



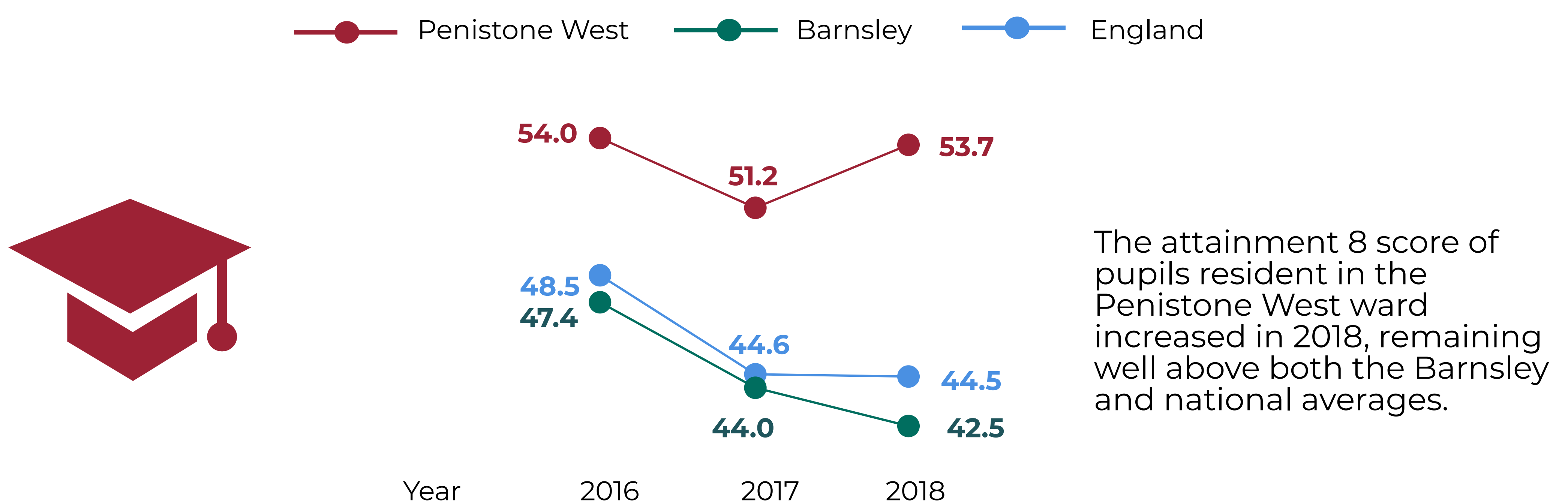
Attainment at the expected standard for pupils resident in the Penistone West ward increased in all three subjects in 2018 with outcomes now above both the Barnsley and national averages.

Average Progress 8 Score at the End of Key Stage 4 2016 - 2018

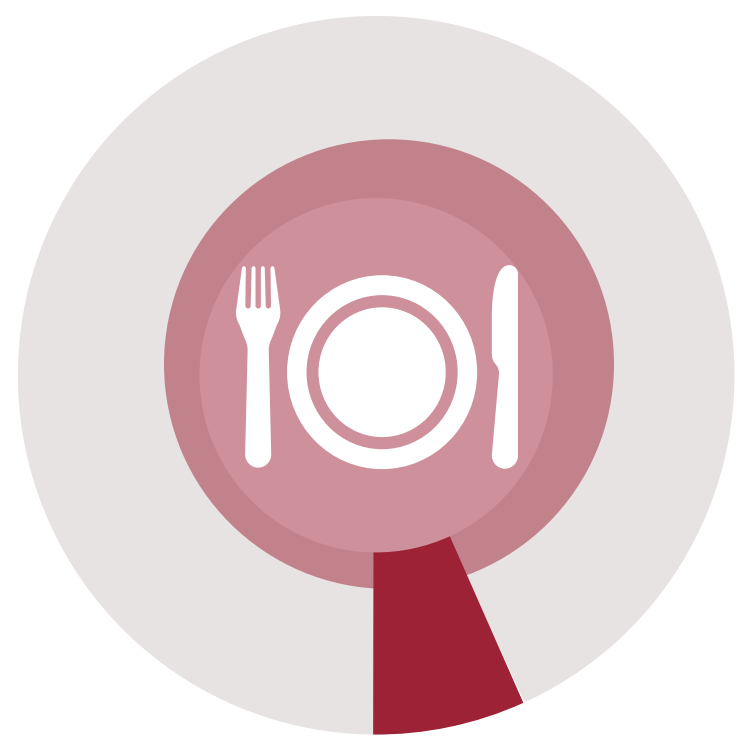

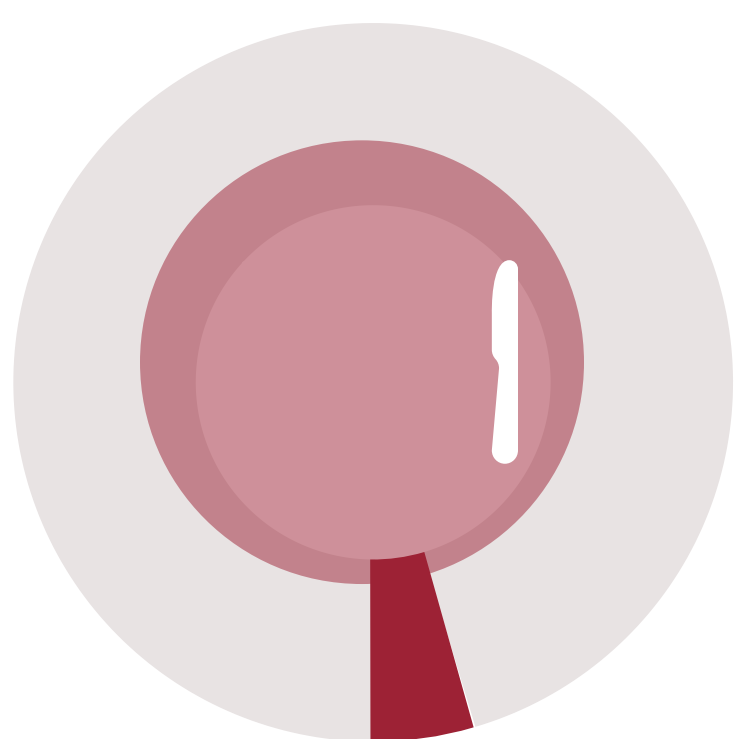

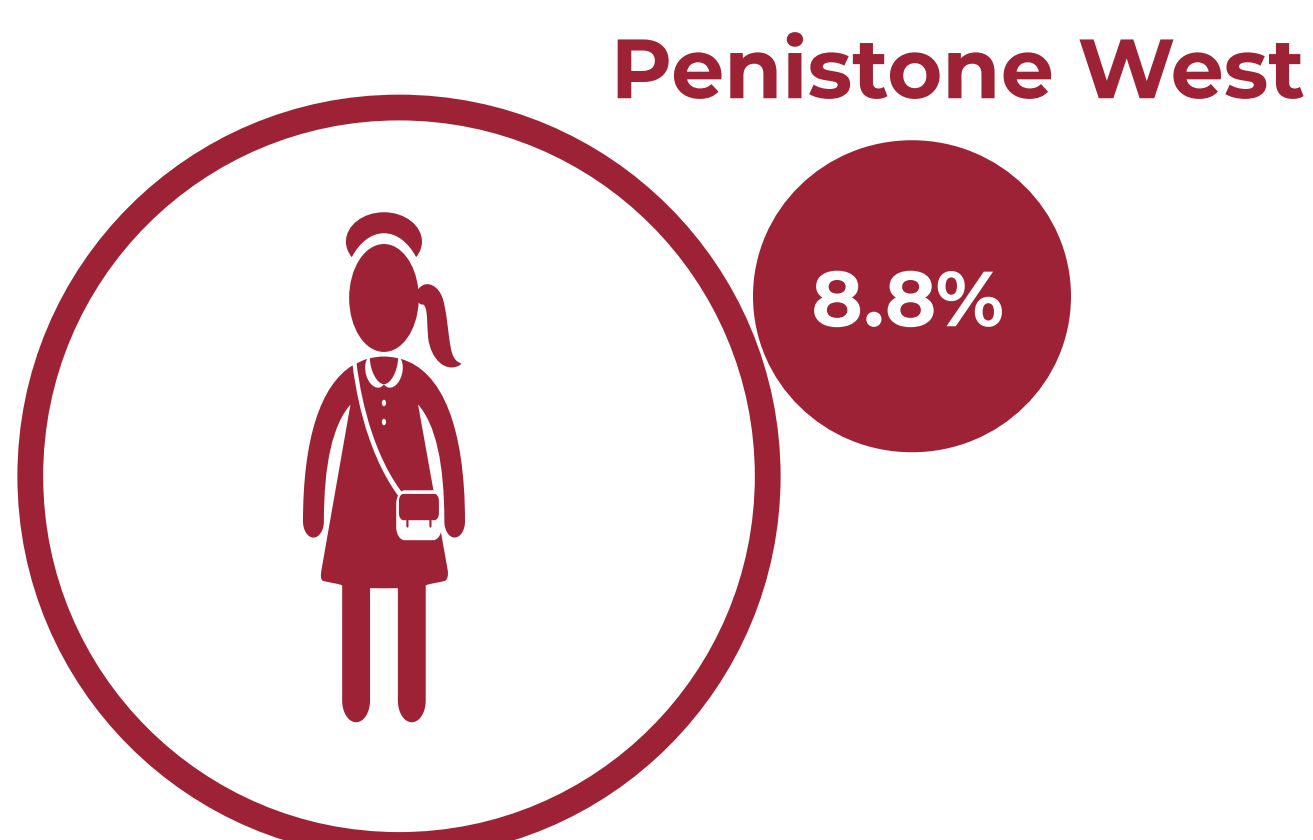

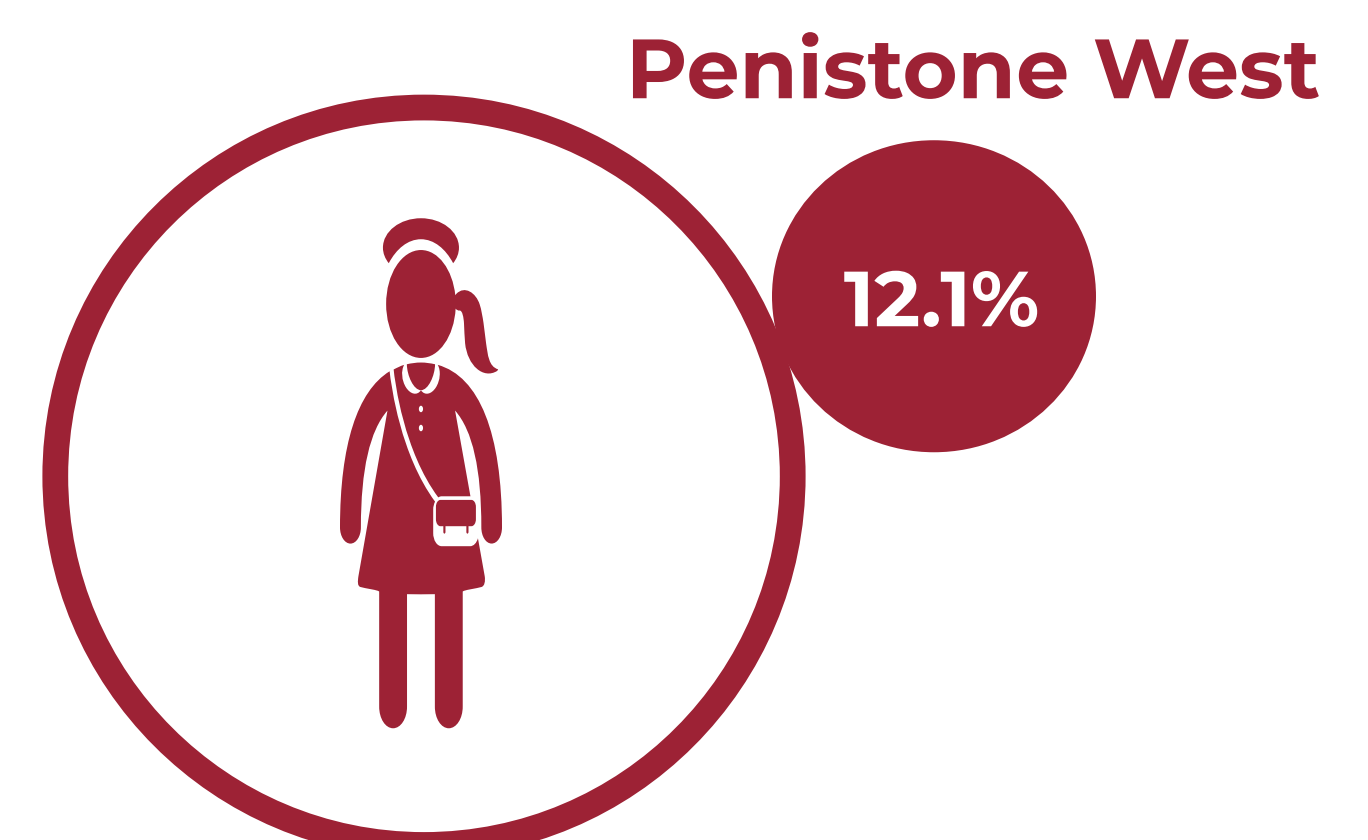

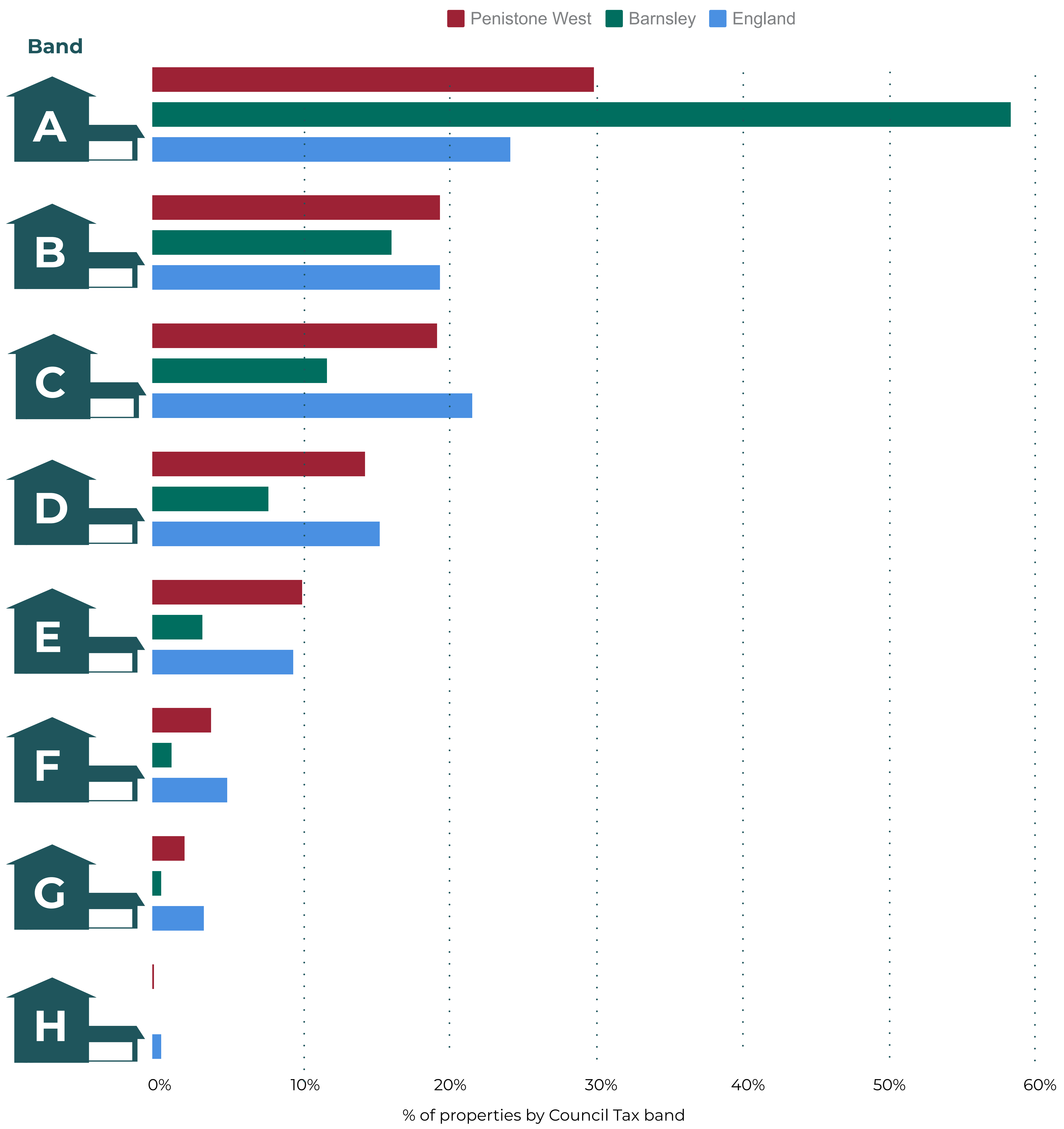
The percentage of secondary school pupils with special educational needs and disabilities increased in the Penistone West ward in 2018 and is similar to the national average and just below the Barnsley average.

These are decided by the government's Valuation Office which determines the amount of council tax to be paid. The chart shows that there are more Penistone West households in Bands B to H compared to Barnsley. These figures are similar to England's.

Total Crime (rate per 1,000 population)



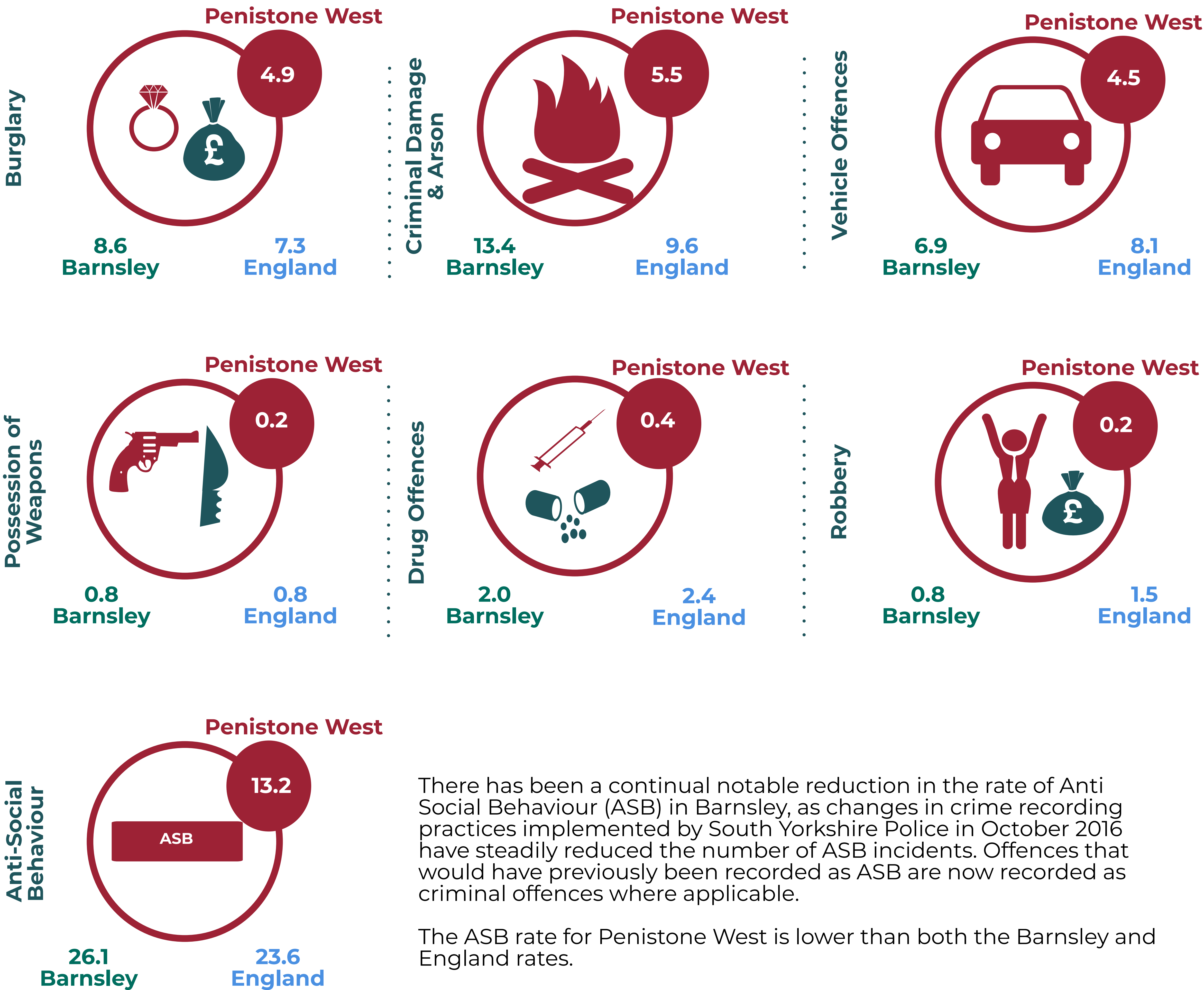

There has been a continual notable reduction in the rate of Anti Social Behaviour (ASB) in Barnsley, as changes in crime recording practices implemented by South Yorkshire Police in October 2016 have steadily reduced the number of ASB incidents. Offences that would have previously been recorded as ASB are now recorded as criminal offences where applicable.

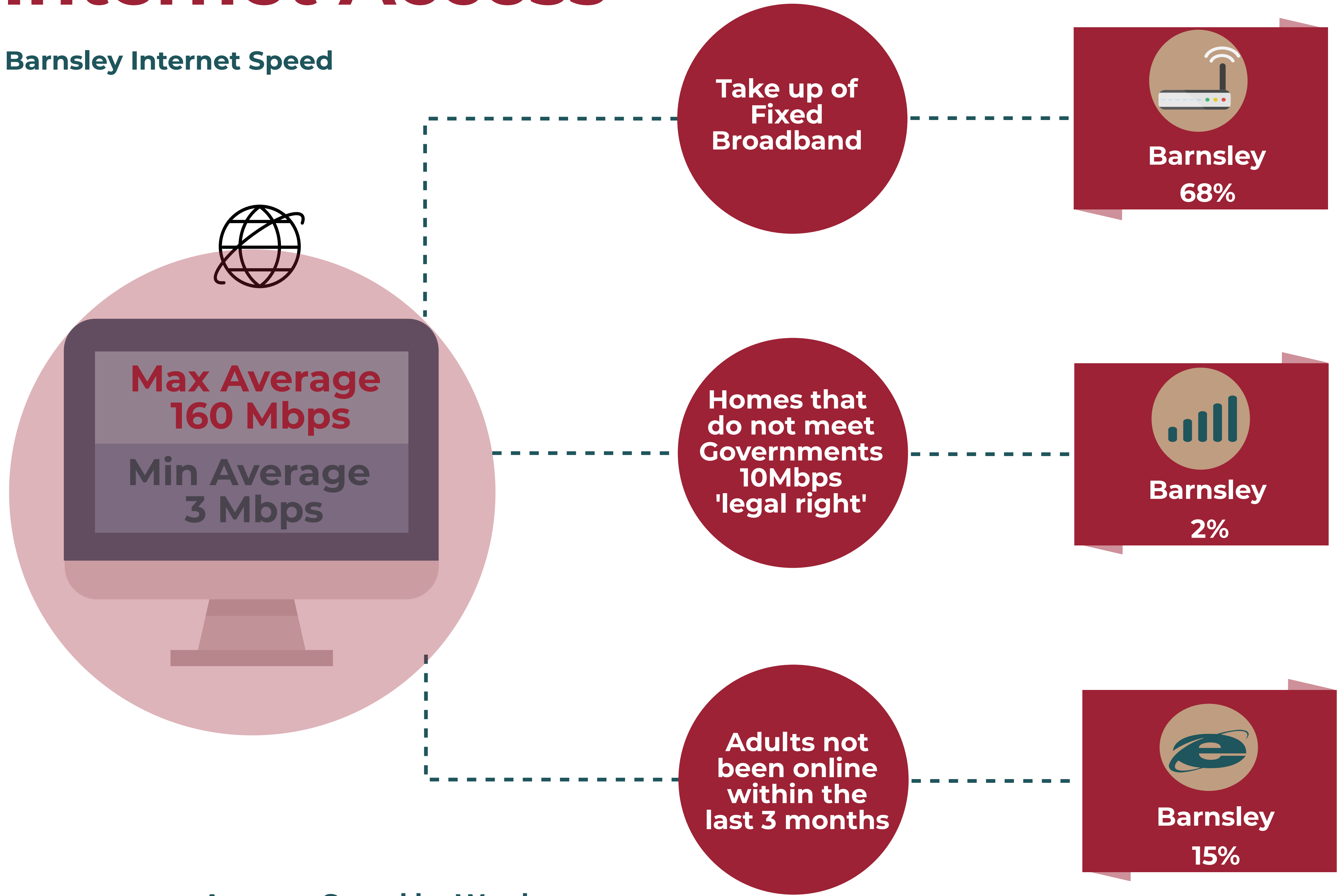
The ASB rate for Penistone West is lower than both the Barnsley and England rates.

All crime figures relate to the period January 2018 to December 2018.

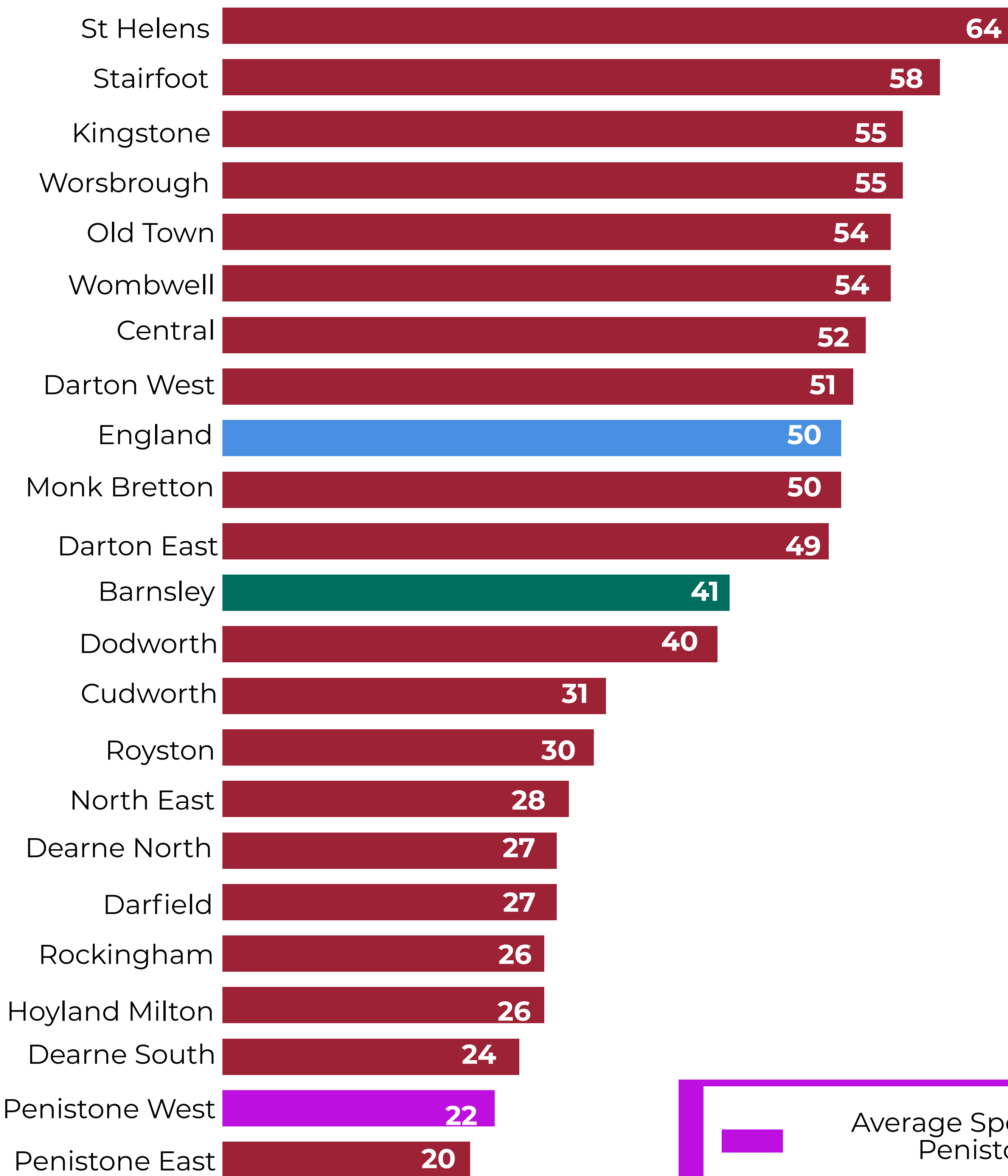

Barnsley Internet Speed



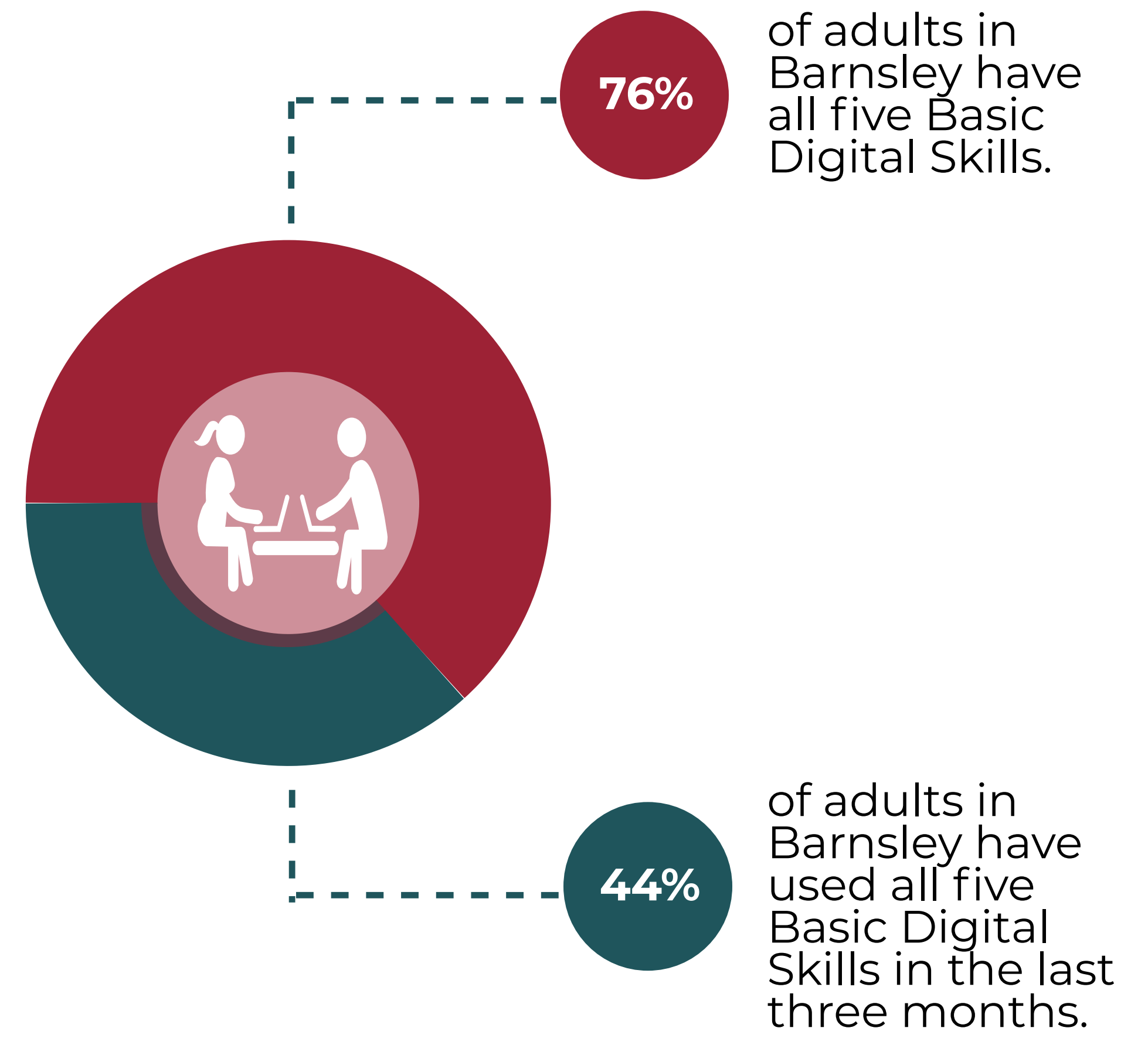
Average Speed by Ward (Mbps)

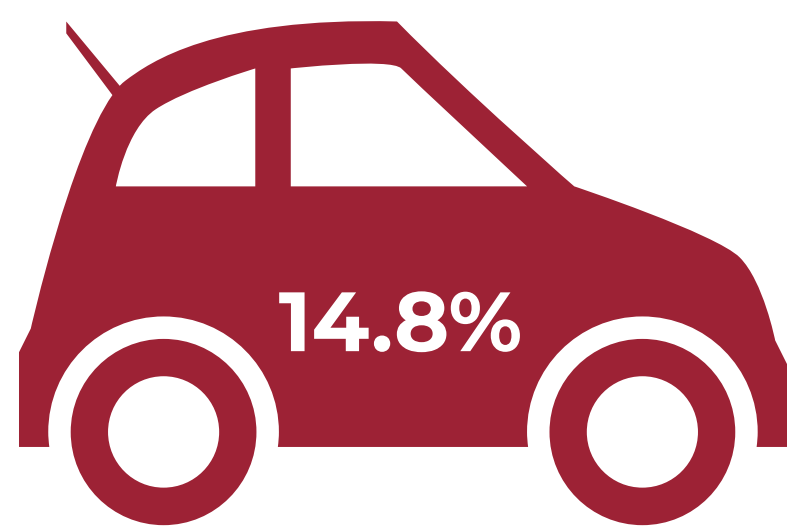

More recent figures are not available at ward level.

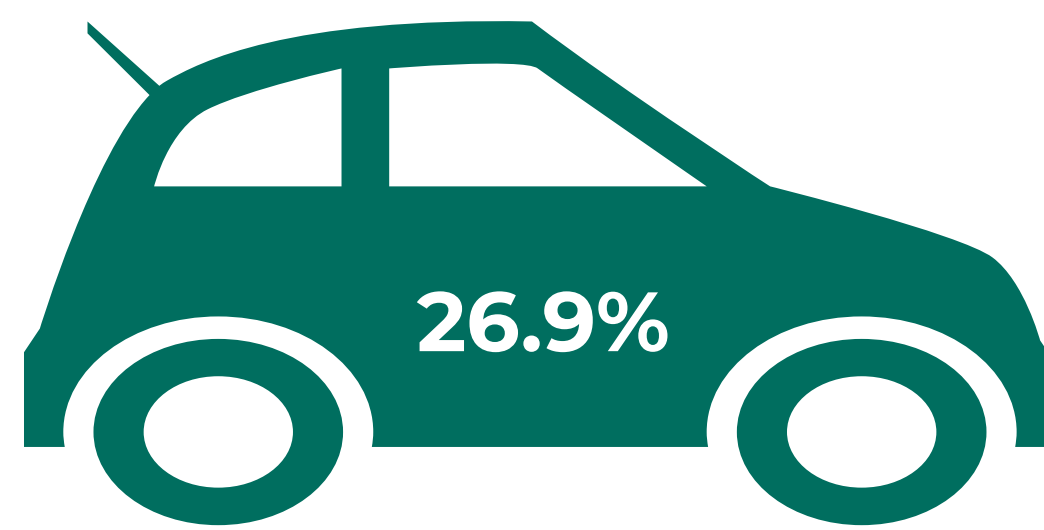

Access to a Car or Van

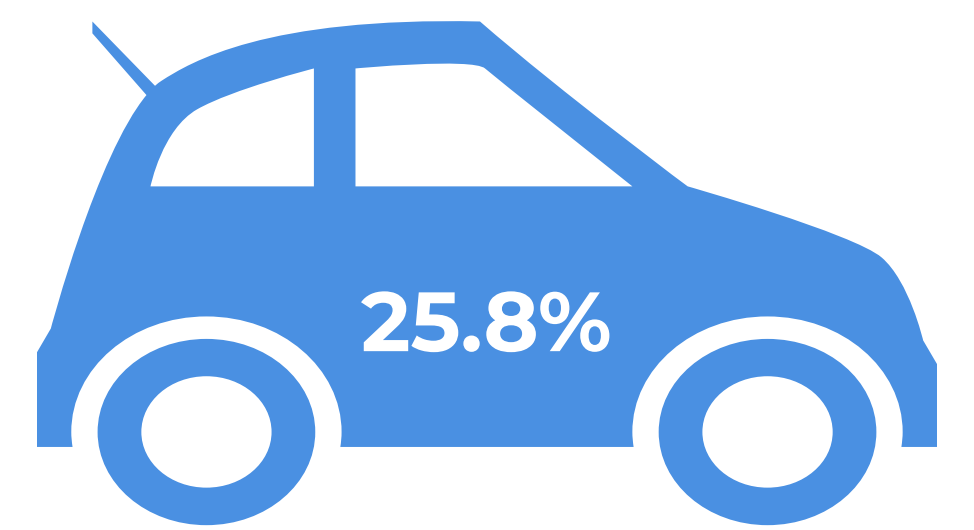
No Cars or Vans in Household
