# Introduction and Purpose



Barnsley Council is continuing to change how we work together for a 'Better Barnsley'. We have ambitious plans to improve and grow as identified in our Corporate Plan for 2017-2020. This sets out what we aim to achieve over the next three years to improve outcomes for our customers and the community as we strive to become more customer focused, modern, efficient and business minded.

We're still focused on achieving our three key priorities:

- People achieving their potential
- Strong and resilient communities

We still feel that these areas warrant greater attention, emphasis, and possibly resources, to influence other areas of activity and make the greatest impact overall.

To do this, we need a solid evidence base to develop effective interventions which will help to achieve a 'Better Barnsley'.

The data within this report are from the latest available as of May 2018. This information is intended to stimulate discussion, debate and action to support Area Councils and Ward Alliances to identify some of their strategic priorities on an area basis and commission services to meet these challenges.

This profile compares the Ward with the overall Barnsley figure and that of England where possible.

In 2011, 1 in every 100 Wombwell residents' main language was not English; equal to the rate for Barnsley overall.

Barnsley's ethnic diversity continues to change. In the 2011 Census, 3 out of 100 people in Wombwell were from a Black and Minority Ethnic (BME) group compared to 4 in every 100 people in Barnsley overall. The 2011 Census is the most up to date national data available on ethnicity.

## Demographics **Indices of Multiple Deprivation 2015**

This is calculated based on seven domains of deprivation, which in turn are composed of a number of indicators that are scored and ranked to produce an overall domain score.

#### % of Pupils Achieving a Good Level of Development 2013 - 2018









The percentage of pupils resident in the Wombwell ward achieving a good level of development increased in 2018. However, outcomes remained below both the Barnsley and national averages.

#### % of Pupils Achieving the Expected Standard in the Phonics Screening Check at the End of Year 1 2015 - 2018



The percentage of pupils resident in the Wombwell ward achieving the expected standard increased slightly in 2018. However, outcomes remained below the national average and just above the Barnsley average.



% of Key Stage 1 Pupils Achieving the Expected Standard 2016 - 2018



Attainment at the expected standard for pupils resident in the Wombwell ward increased in all three subjects in 2018 but remained below the national average in reading and writing. However, outcomes in all three subjects are now above the Barnsley average.

In 2018 pupils resident in the Wombwell ward made less progress than pupils with similar starting points in Barnsley and nationally. However the progress score was higher than the 2017 score.

## % of Pupils with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities 2018



The percentage of primary school pupils with special educational needs and disabilities decreased slightly in the Wombwell ward in 2018 but remained above both the Barnsley and national averages. The percentage of secondary school pupils with special educational needs and disabilities
increased in the Wombwell ward but remained
below both the Barnsley and national averages.

## Life Expectancy at Birth



Life expectancy at birth for males in Wombwell is 0.8 years lower than for men in Barnsley.

Life expectancy at birth for women in Wombwell is 2.3 years lower than for women in Barnsley. The current rate of 79.6 years is the highest during the period 2012-2014 to 2015-2017.

#### **Under 18's Conceptions**



Under 18 conception rates in Wombwell have been consistently higher than the rates in Barnsley and England during the period 2011 to 2015. However, the current rate is the lowest during the period.

#### Under 75 Mortality (rate per 100,000 population)



Wombwell's under 75 cancer mortality rates have been consistently higher than the rates for Barnsley and England at each time point during the period 2010-2012 through to 2015-2017. The current rate of 181.6 per 100,000 is the lowest during the period.



Wombwell's under 75 mortality rate from respiratory diseases (37.1 per 100,000) is lower than the Barnsley rate of 41.8 and is the second lowest rate during the period 2010-2012 to 2015-2017.



Wombwell's under 75 mortality rates from cardiovascular diseases have been consistently higher than the rates for Barnsley and England at each time point during the period 2010-2012 to 2015-2017. However, the current rate of 89.6 per 100,000 is the lowest during the period.

## **Excess weight**



The proportion of 4-5 year olds in Wombwell who are overweight or obese (17.7%) is slightly lower than the proportion in Barnsley overall (18.0%). The current rate is the lowest since 2012-2013.



The proportion of 10-11 year olds in Wombwell who are overweight or obese (31.4%) is lower than the proportion in Barnsley overall (32.1%).

#### Breastfeeding

Just over half of women in Wombwell (51.2%) breastfeed their babies at birth; lower than the Barnsley rate of 55.6%.

## Smoking

Almost a quarter of adults in Wombwell are smokers. Rates have been consistently higher than the Barnsley rates at each time point during the period 2013 to 2016. However, the current rate of 24.3% is the lowest since 2013.

#### Related Deaths per 100,000 (Over 35's)



Wombwell's smoking related deaths rate (334.1 per 100,000 aged 35+) is lower than the Barnsley rate of 353.0 and is the lowest during the period 2011-2013 to 2014-2016.

Almost one in five women in Wombwell smoke during pregnancy (19.7%); higher than the Barnsley rate of 16.8% and England rate of 10.8%.

## Households

### **Residents Living Alone and Aged 65+ Years**



The 2011 Census showed that 13.2% of households in Wombwell contained residents aged 65+ years that were living alone and could be at risk of social isolation.

#### **Housing Tenure**

Owned



Six in every 10 properties are owned with a mortgage or owned outright in Wombwell. Ownership is lower than the Barnsley and England rates.



Almost a quarter of properties in Wombwell are social rented; this is higher than both Barnsley and England.



Wombwell has more private rented properties than Barnsley but fewer than England.

Properties are banded into one of eight valuation bands (A to H, with A being properties of lowest value to H being the highest). These are decided by the government's Valuation Office which determines the amount of council tax to be paid. The chart shows that there are more Wombwell households in Band A compared to Barnsley and England.

#### Crime (rate per 1,000 population)







There has been a continual notable reduction in the rate of Anti Social Behaviour (ASB) in Barnsley, as changes in crime recording practices implemented by South Yorkshire Police in October 2016 have steadily reduced the number of ASB incidents. Offences that would have previously been recorded as ASB are now recorded as criminal offences where applicable.

The ASB rate for Wombwell is higher than the England rate and similar to the Barnsley rate.

All crime figures relate to the period January 2018 to December 2018.

Since 2011, the number of residents that identified their country of birth as part of the European Union (excluding United Kingdom and Ireland) has increased due to the number of migrants from mainly Romania and Poland.

More recent figures are not available at ward level.

In 2011, 29.9 % of households from Wombwell area reported that they did not have access to a car or van. This is higher than the rates across Barnsley and England.
