

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Introduction and Purpose

Barnsley Council is continuing to change how we work together for a 'Better Barnsley'. We have ambitious plans to improve and grow as identified in our Corporate Plan for 2017-2020. This sets out what we aim to achieve over the next three years to improve outcomes for our customers and the community as we strive to become more customer focused, modern, efficient and business minded.

This profile compares the Ward with the overall Barnsley figure and that of England where possible.


Demographics

Overall Population



Barnsley's population has been growing constantly since 2001. Since the 2011 Census, the resident population in Worsbrough has increased by 1.3% compared to 4.9% in Barnsley overall. The increase in population is mainly due to more births than deaths and international migration. There are slightly more females than males within the ward.




Age Profile and % of Total Population


Main Language is not English

Barnsley's ethnic diversity continues to change. In the 2011 Census, 4 out of 100 people in Worsbrough were from a Black and Minority Ethnic (BME) group; the same as Barnsley overall. The 2011 Census is the most up to date national data available on ethnicity.



This is calculated based on seven domains of deprivation, which in turn are composed of a number of indicators that are scored and ranked to produce an overall domain score.


Proportion of Worsbrough Lower Super Output Areas (LSOAs) in 10% Most Deprived in England

 ■ LSOAs not in 10% Most Deprived in England




The Seven Domains of Deprivation and how Worsbrough Performs


Percentage of Worsbrough LSOAs in the Bottom 10% in England by Domain



Index of Multiple Deprivation 2015 Worsbrough LSOAs Relative to England (DCLG, 2015)











The percentage of pupils resident in Worsbrough ward achieving a good level of development increased slightly in 2018 although outcomes remained below both the Barnsley and national averages.


% of Pupils Achieving the Expected Standard in the Phonics Screening Check at the End of Year 1 2015 - 2018



The percentage of pupils resident in Worsbrough ward achieving the expected standard in phonics screening increased in 2018 with outcomes now above both the Barnsley and national averages.



% of Key Stage 1 Pupils Achieving the Expected Standard 2016 - 2018




The percentage of pupils resident in Worsbrough ward achieving the expected standard at the end of key stage 1 decreased slightly in reading but increased in writing and mathematics in 2018. However, outcomes in all three subjects remained below both the Barnsley and national averages.

Average Progress 8 Score at the End of Key Stage 4 2016 - 2018








Life Expectancy at Birth

Life expectancy at birth for males in Worsbrough is 2.8 years lower than for men in Barnsley. The current rate of 75.3 years is the lowest since 2012-2014.


Female



Life expectancy at birth for women in Worsbrough is 1.3 years lower than for women in Barnsley and the current rate of 80.6 years is the lowest since 2012-2014.

Rate per 1,000 Population Aged 15-17 Years








Under 75 Mortality (rate per 100,000 population)



Worsbrough's under 75 cancer mortality rate is lower than that of Barnsley overall. The current rate of 151.9 per 100,000 is the lowest during the period 2010-2012 to 2015-2017.



Under 75 mortality rates from respiratory diseases in Worsbrough have been consistently higher than the rates for Barnsley and England at each time point during the period 2010-2012 to 2015-2017. However, the current rate of 43.7 per 100,000 is the lowest during the period.




Worsbrough's under 75 mortality rates from cardiovascular diseases have increased at each time point during the period 2010-2012 through to 2015-2017. The current rate of 120.6 per 100,000 is higher than the Barnsley rate of 87.0.


Excess weight

The proportion of 4-5 year olds in Worsbrough who are overweight or obese (30.4%) is higher than the proportion in Barnsley overall (18.0%). The current rate is the highest since 2012-2013.


10-11 Year Olds



Worsbrough's rates for 10-11 year olds who are overweight or obese have been consistently higher than the rates for Barnsley and England at each time point during the period 2012-2013 to 2017-2018. However, the current rate is the lowest since 2012-2013.

Over half of women in Worsbrough (54.2%) breastfeed their babies at birth; lower than the Barnsley rate of 55.6%.



Prevalence - Adults (over 18's)




No England data available for smoking prevalence as the Ward and Barnsley data has been calculated locally from GP records.

More than a quarter of adults in Worsbrough are smokers. Rates have been consistently higher than the Barnsley rates at each time point during the period 2013 to 2016. However, the current rate of 26.4% is the lowest since 2013.


Related Deaths per 100,000 (Over 35's)



Worsbrough's smoking related deaths rate (334.6 per 100,000 aged 35+) is lower than the Barnsley rate of 353.0 and is the second lowest during the period 2011-2013 to 2014-2016.

The proportion of women who smoke during pregnancy in Worsbrough (15.3%) is lower than the proportion in Barnsley (16.8%) and higher than the England rate (10.8%).

Households

Residents Living Alone and Aged 65+ Years



The 2011 Census showed that 14.2% of households in Worsbrough contained residents aged 65+ years that were living alone and could be at risk of social isolation.

Housing Tenure

Owned



Almost 6 in every 10 properties are owned with a mortgage or owned outright in Worsbrough. Ownership is lower than both the Barnsley and England rates.

Social Rented



Three in 10 properties in Worsbrough are social rented; this is higher than both Barnsley and England.

Private Rented




Worsbrough has fewer private rented properties than both Barnsley and England.

Properties are banded into one of eight valuation bands (A to H, with A being properties of lowest value to H being the highest). These are decided by the government's Valuation Office which determines the amount of council tax to be paid. The chart shows that there are more Worsbrough households in Band A compared to Barnsley and England.



There has been a continual notable reduction in the rate of Anti Social Behaviour (ASB) in Barnsley, as changes in crime recording practices implemented by South Yorkshire Police in October 2016 have steadily reduced the number of ASB incidents. Offences that would have previously been recorded as ASB are now recorded as criminal offences where applicable.


The ASB rate for Worsbrough is higher than the England rate and similar to the Barnsley rate.




Average Speed by Ward (Mbps)



More recent figures are not available at ward level.




No Cars or Vans in Household
