

Key information about the highway improvements

We've appointed the contractor, NMCN, to deliver the improvement works. Construction works are likely to begin in February 2020 and be completed in March 2021.

To allow this to be completed safely for our residents and staff, we'll be placing temporary traffic management around the area which will cause some delays.

We'll install signage before the start of the highway improvements to show what date the works will start and the expected duration.

Every effort will be made by the contractor to minimise any disruption.

When complete, the scheme will:

- Reduce existing traffic congestion and journey times during peak hours along the A6195/A635 leading to the three roundabout areas of Cathill, Broomhill and Wath Road
- Ensure the road network can accommodate any future traffic growth from the local plan developments off the A635 at Goldthorpe
- Help to create more and better jobs and increase opportunities for residents
- Strengthen our economic growth and attract more businesses to the area
- Help grow opportunities for existing Barnsley businesses and increase opportunities for residents
- Improve the quality of the environment for all by reducing the amount of standing traffic
- Improve pedestrian and cycling safety by providing shared-use routes and designated crossing facilities



Dearne Valley Economic Highway Improvements

Goldthorpe, Cathill, Broomhill and Wath Road roundabouts M1 Junction 36, A6195/A635

We're making improvements to your local highway as part of the Dearne Valley Economic Growth Corridor scheme. We've successfully completed phase one of the improvements at the M1 Junction 36 Hoyland highway, and we're now working on phase two of the development.



Sheffield City Region Investment Fund (SCRIF)

We've received a grant of £7.32 million from Sheffield City Region's Local Growth Fund that will be used alongside our own investment to deliver the scheme.

As part of the second phase, you'll see improvement works at the Cathill, Broomhill and Wath Road roundabouts. The works will increase the sizes of the three existing roundabouts and will widen the entrance and exit lanes.




