Veterans need to be able to advocate for themselves, more promotion of 'Say You Served' needed to expand the current scheme. Example given of a system in West Yorkshire where GP surgeries send out a text message asking patients if they have got a military service history. ICB supporting and signing the Armed Forces Covenant would be of huge benefit and would also be good evidence against Barnsley's Armed Forces Covenant gold status revalidation. SSAFA Service Offer Overview (AH / RW) Comprehensive overview of the origins of SSAFA and the current operation provided. Original values still stand today, focusing on the wellbeing of soldiers. SSAFA conducts the majority of the case work for military charities across the country and all case workers are volunteers. Trial ongoing in the East Midlands and Wales to test out the future operational structure of SSAFA. All cases will be controlled centrally at 'the hub' and then allocated to case workers. Currently case workers start the process of a case and see it through. The purpose of the changes is to establish a consistent service across the country and streamline processes. The new process will be in place within the next 12 months. Anyone can complete a SSAFA referral form online. Challenges include gathering all necessary information from clients, not having named contacts to gain information from specific organisations and managing cases when debt problems are involved. MK confirmed housing and welfare support is now located at Wellington House, previously The Civic, and is there to support as it is well known that debt drives homelessness. The local authority has a legal responsibility to provide support if the treat of homelessness is imminent within 56 days. Citizens Advice Bureau (CAB) can offer immediate support relating to fuel and food poverty, not just debt support. Online referral is still the quickest way to access support. Opportunities to link SSAFA with More Money In Your Pocket. Provide of brief overview and contact details. Add to forward plan. Share stuff with SSAFA. **ERS Gold Status Revalidation (AA)** Barnsley Council are revalidating the ERS Gold Status in 2025, the current gold status is valid until the end of 2025. Work is ongoing to compile information and evidence needed for the revalidation. Armed Forces lead from the Healthier Communities team will reach out to organisations if anything is required from them to support the revalidation. Pauline King offered a one to one meeting if necessary to support this. Armed Forces Walkway Improvement Programme update (CC / EF) 6 Comprehensive update provided on the Armed Forces Walkway Improvement Programme. New benches will replace the existing ones which are now worse for wear and no longer looked after by BMBC.

BMBC is buying the first bench, up to 4 more can then be purchased. All come with a customisable plaque and sides and are long wearing due to the coating. All benches should be replaced within 12 months.

Conversation ongoing with parks as to where to locate the first bench for it to be best seen.

- The new flag pole cannot go directly on the walkway due to it not being structural sound so it will be placed on the side. There is a meeting with planning next week (w/c 10 February 2025) to discuss details.
- Local suppliers have been found for the production of new stones and initial discussions have been held. Next step is quotes and agreeing the SLA. We note that the new ones will be more expensive as the previous ones were sold to us at cost price. New suppliers guarantee better supply of stones and higher quality. Sale of stones has been paused due to staffing levels in Healthier Communities, but this will be restarting imminently.
- Issues around the new planter have been expensive quotes, in the region of £4-5k, currently exploring more options.
- Intention is the improve the commerciality and the aesthetic of the walkway, recognising it is many families place to remember and commemorate their loved ones, and to raise awareness as a lot of people do not realise what it is.

7 Armed Forces Celebrations 2025 (HI / AA)

- Update provided on the plans for celebrating Armed forces day 2025. Date for the event confirmed as 14th June 2025.
- Planning is in creation stages, working with events team, the libraries team, and external organisations.
- Plans for the day include a Veterans breakfast hosted by the Mayor, a military parade ending outside the Lightbox, speeches, and sporting events.
- Big focus on inclusion of veterans and encouraging them to get involved. No road closures planned, this is to keep the march route small and ensure interaction with the public is strong.
- Paul Buttery. SYFR, expressed interest in using the event to publicise their drive to recruit serving and former Armed Forces personnel.
- Verbal update on the plans to celebrate the centenary of the War Memorial. Date for the event confirmed as 11th October 2025.
- Late afternoon/early evening event led by Cllr Leach to include; a rededication of the memorial with a religious service, a VIP tea in the Town Hall reception rooms, an exhibition of photos, interviews with veterans to hear what the commemoration of the memorial means to them, a children's artwork competition focused on peace, and a range of video projections being cascade onto the Town Hall.
- Projections will include archived video footage of the Barnsley Pals training and marching, archived photos, and imagery such as poppies.
 - Interview recordings of veterans will overlay on top of the video projections, and the winners of the children's competition will be projected onto the Town Hall too.

Housing Regulations Update (AA)
 Verbal update regarding the legislative change removing local connection for Veterans in relation to social housing. Email was received 18th December 2024 informing Council's that the law around this had changed. The change was in force before Council's were notified. It is not clear in the legislation whether all social housing providers are included or whether this only applies to social housing provided through local authorities. Social housing as a sector is broad, causing ambiguity in the legislation. Sarah Barnes, Berneslai Homes, confirmed the published Berneslai Homes policy will be updated so it is fully compliant with the legislation, including the addition of commitments to divorced or separate partners of Armed Forces veterans.
AOB (ALL)
 Paul Buttery, SYFR, advised Doncaster are including the question 'are you a veteran' as part of routine visits into families homes and properties, and providing a leaflet with relevant advice/information tailored if the answer is yes. Opportunity to explore this in Barnsley, SYFR committed to distributing on behalf of Barnsley Council if the leaflets/cards exist or can be produced.
 Susan Womack, Barnsley CVS, extended an offer to support SSAFA in recruiting volunteers from CVS. Ross Waterlow and SW to connect around volunteers.
- Ian Bailey advised there is potential for more representation from SYMCA at the Armed Forces Covenant Board meetings and advise he will forward meeting invites on to relevant SYMCA colleagues.
- Luke Lancaster highlighted this year is the 80 th anniversary of the end of WW2. The Royal British Legion weblink was shared to allow colleagues to complete the form via the link to learn more or attend the events RBL are promoting.
- Possibility of next meeting date being amended depending on chair and new HOS availability. Business support will keep membersh updated.
