What Matters to Me, Now

A catalogue of children and young people's artwork, created as part of the Barnsley 2021 Director of Public Health Annual Report





Introduction

In 2019, children and young people were asked to create artwork around the theme 'What Matters to Me?' to inform the Director of Public Health Annual Report 2019. However, due to the Covid-19 pandemic, this work had to be put on hold.

In 2021, the project was able to be reinstated, and children and young people were then asked to create artwork with the theme of 'What Matters to Me, Now' to provide a comparison of what is important to children and young people in Barnsley pre-and post-pandemic.

This catalogue accompanies an in-person exhibition that showcases the artwork (at the Library @The Lightbox 23rd - 30th May), to provide information about the creators and their interpretation. The artwork is listed in the order that it was received. The number of pieces created for 2021 are fewer due to the increased demand on services, and in some cases reduced capacity, because of the ongoing and ever-changing nature of the Covid-19 pandemic.

A write up of the findings from all the engagement work is included in the Director of Public Health Annual Report 2021.





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Service: Healthwatch and Barnardo's Young Carers Council

Description of the Service: A Young Carers Service, provided by Barnardo's, who are based at Priory Campus. We work directly with children and young people who have a caring role in their family. By providing the right help, Barnardo's make sure that the young person doesn't become responsible for inappropriate caring responsibilities.

Age of children and young people involved in creating the artwork: Ages 13-17



Description of the artwork:

Healthwatch Barnsley worked with the Young Carers' Council at Barnardo's to create a piece of colourful artwork that highlighted:

- What a young carer is
- What support is available
- How Barnardos supports young people

This piece of work shows what the young carers would like to see in the future within Barnsley for young carers with points raised being:

- More support is needed for young carers.
- More social activities are needed for young carers.





Service: YMCA Barnsley After School Clubs at Ward Green Primary / Queen's Road Academy

Please note: Unfortunately, we are unable to display this artwork in the exhibition due to damage that has occurred to the plasticine models since it was produced in 2019.



Description of the artwork: A very descriptive, insightful painted canvas by young people who considered 'what matters to me' is changing how beauty is portrayed in the media. The image of the girl on the left with dark hair and dark skin contrasts with the more westernised 'ideal' of blonde hair and blue eyes, which they feel is portrayed in the media as being the definition of beauty. It's important that children and young people of all ethnicities are made to feel like they are beautiful.

The use of shadows behind the figures really draws attention to the difficult subject of "Hidden Harm", whereby children can appear 'fine' but may be experiencing harmful behaviours behind closed doors, sometimes due to parental drug and alcohol use.

Description of the artwork: This eye-catching painted canvas shows the young people have many hard-hitting issues on their minds. 'What matters to me' is tackling war, religious conflict, animal abuse, poverty, gun violence, bullying, obesity, discrimination, prostitution, lack of school mental health provision, abortion and domestic abuse. The knotted wire acts as a symbol of the issues that need to be untangled, indicating that we have made progress in tackling these issues but there is still work to be done.



Description of the artwork:

Junior YC have a lot of young people attending who like to participate in sport, so they began their piece by painting large MDF boards and then donning full overalls and creating the backdrop to their artwork by using different size footballs covered in paint to create the blue and yellow background. The young people then worked in smaller groups to create what is important to them and they focused on their community, family and friends. The young people talked about what is important to them, such as, recognising disabilities and where you come from. They also talked about Barnsley and how having things to do and living a clean safe environment is important to them.






Exhibit Number: E006 **Service:** Targeted Youth Support - Early Intervention and Prevention Service

Description of the Service: In Barnsley we want all young people to fulfil their true potential and to have a bright future. Our Targeted Youth Support Service works with young people aged 11-19 years (and those up to 25 with additional needs) to provide targeted support either on a one-to-one basis or as part of a group or project. Through early help or the early identification of an issue, we can offer a range of universal and targeted support to reduce or prevent problems or issues from getting worse and bring in the right support at the right time to meet young people's needs.

Age of young person who created the artwork: Age 13



Description of the artwork: A collection of drawings expressing unhappy feelings. 'What matters to me' is for Barnsley services to support young people with their emotional health and wellbeing.





Service: Targeted Youth Support - Early Intervention and Prevention Service

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Age of child who created the artwork: Age 12

Description of the artwork: This is a photography piece rooted in nature and the countryside and wildlife that Barnsley has to offer. It explores the natural resources of Barnsley and how these can be used to bring calm and wellbeing to the people who live here. It is what this young person has chosen as being most important to them and where they find their creativity and passion for photography is best explored.





Exhibit Number: E008 Service: Central Family Centre

Description of the Service: Family centres deliver joined-up early help services for children from prebirth up to 19 years (or 25 years if the young person has a disability). They bring together practitioners from a range of universal, targeted and specialist services in each local area, including schools, police, social care, private and voluntary sector and some adult services. Services for adults play an essential role in our early help approach as these can impact on adults' parenting capacity and family life. Some adults have additional needs, which can impact negatively on family life if not supported. Services that predominantly work with either children and young people or adults need to adopt a 'think family' approach, coordinating the support they provide, to secure better outcomes for children, young people and families with additional needs.

Age of children involved in creating the artwork: Ages 0-8



Description of the artwork: Photo collage and children's drawings showing 'what matters to me' is play and children having the opportunity to use their imaginations with real resources to fuel their dreams of what they want to be in future.

Please note: Unfortunately, this artwork is not displayed as part of the exhibition as it was dismantled by the service in 2020.





Service: Barnsley Young People's Substance Misuse Service

Description of the Service: The Young People's Substance Misuse Service provides help and support to young people - and their families - who might be using drugs and alcohol.

We will listen to you without judging. We will encourage you to be honest with yourself and give you a safe and confidential space to go over your issues.

We can then also put you in touch with other services who can help you.

Age of children and young people involved in creating the artwork: Ages 10-18



Description of the artwork: The idea was to create a "Lo-Fi" piece of artwork that does not represent the digital age, reflecting on historic games/engagement/interaction between young people before the smart phone phenomena that has captured modern everyday living for young people. The "Fanzines" that hang on the board, showed a tremendous amount of black and white thinking from the participants, which influenced the creation of the background drawing on images from a bygone age before smart phone technology. The individual fanzines can be read to explore 'what matters' to these children and young people.





Exhibit Number: E010 Service: Barnsley Youth Council

Description of the Service: Barnsley Youth Council are a group of local young people, elected by their peers to represent the views of young people who live in Barnsley. We represent our town's young people, no matter what their background. Everyone is entitled to their say in what happens, whatever their age.

Age of children and young people involved in creating the artwork: Ages 12-19



Description of the artwork: A collage of newspaper articles around the 2019 Make Your Mark consultation results and the top local issues in the Barnsley area. The portrait is of the founder of the Barnsley Suffragette movement Celia Wray, who was born in Cudworth. The contents of the portrait links into democracy and youth voice because this of course matters to us as it's important for young people to have a voice in their community and that is what Barnsley Youth Council proudly represents. In addition, we have added words from our consultation work as a result of the work (or drop-ins) done with young people from around Barnsley about what they would like and want to see for Barnsley in 2030. The words contained represent the past, present and future of Barnsley. We have written these around the artwork because we represent the voices of all young people not just of our Youth Council.





Service: Targeted Youth Support - Early Intervention and Prevention Service

Description of the Service: In Barnsley we want all young people to fulfil their true potential and to have a bright future. Our Targeted Youth Support Service works with young people aged 11-19 years (and those up to 25 with additional needs) to provide targeted support either on a one-to-one basis or as part of a group or project. Through early help or the early identification of an issue, we can offer a range of universal and targeted support to reduce or prevent problems or issues from getting worse and bring in the right support at the right time to meet young people's needs.



Age of children and young people involved in creating the artwork: Ages 11-19

Description of the artwork: The two canvases were done at a youth summit in Penistone on the 16th November 2019, where young people were asked about what they think about their lives now and where they would like to be in 2030. The blue half of the canvases represents their current selves and situations and the orange halves represent their future hopes and dreams for themselves and Barnsley.





Exhibit Number: E012 Service: Care4Us Council

Description of the Service: The Care4Us Council is made up of young people aged 8 to 25 who are either in care or have left the care system and are part of the leaving care service. The purpose of the Care4Us Council is to work with young people's corporate parents and other services to make a difference, by speaking to children who are in care and other care-experienced young people. Care4Us Council members also have the opportunity to take part in activities such as residential gatherings, regional work and fun events like bowling and eating out.



Age of children and young people involved in creating the artwork: Ages 8-25

Description of the artwork: 'What matters' to the Care4Us Council is the importance of their family and friends because they are the people who support them and raise their aspirations to have a good education and job, which prepares them for a brighter future in Barnsley.





Exhibit Number: E013 Service: SEND Youth Forum

Description of the Service: The SEND Youth Forum is a group of young people who experience Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND). We work on SEND specific topics as a group and the forum also work jointly with their fellow Youth Council and Care4us members. It's also a great chance to make friends, take part in fun activities and learn important life skills. With support from the Youth Voice and Participation team the young people have the opportunity to have their say and make positive changes to services that affect them.

Age of child/children or young person/young people involved in creating the artwork: Ages 11-25



Description of the artwork: A scrapbook displaying a collection of photographs taken by members of the SEND Youth Forum and the clubs that are represented on the Forum. The collages are individual answers and interpretations of the two questions – 'what matters to me?' and 'what are my hopes for my future in Barnsley?'. The scrapbook has been laminated to encourage people to look through the pages.





Exhibit Number: E014 Service: Vision Support Service

Description of the Service: Part of the Education Inclusion Services in Barnsley, our aim is to support children and young people with an identified visual need in order to remove barriers to learning. We support families and staff working in educational settings to ensure that children and young people have the same learning experience as their peers.

Age of children and young people involved in creating the artwork: Ages 5-18



Description of the artwork: The idea is of vision being about more than sight, that these children who are visually impaired have a strong vision of what the future should be like. The children wrote/ used braille to express their thoughts around 'what matters to me' on outlines of their hands (the future is in our hands), and all the hands create a collage of an eye to symbolise a shared vision.





Exhibit Number: E015 Service: Greenacre School

Description of the Service: Greenacre is a school for children and young people aged 3 to 19 with severe and complex needs and disabilities. We are extremely proud of our happy and successful school. Our key strengths include our vision and values, which shape our daily practice; our curriculum, which ensures all pupils learn the right things at the right time. Our model of social inclusion, which supports pupils to develop strong interpersonal relationships. Our staff team, who are utterly committed to the pupils they support; and, of course, our wonderful families and supporters.



Age of children and young people involved in creating the artwork: Ages 11-16

Description of the artwork: Just a selection of the many descriptive drawings. Many of the students interviewed said that they felt lonely daily and were feeling lonely for long periods of time. Many Greencare students said that what really mattered to them was being able to do activities and see their friends during holidays and weekends. This would help to tackle their loneliness.





Exhibit Number: E016 Service: YMCA Barnsley – THANK YOU IT'S FRIDAY Project

Description of the Service: TYI FRIDAY is part of the Targeted Youth Support Short Breaks Provision in Barnsley, for children and young people with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND). We provide a range of creative youth club type activities, including arts and crafts, sports and games, creative media and music, healthy living, seasonal activities, along with issue-based and independent skills projects. Plus, opportunities for social interaction, meeting and making new friends, personal and social development and learning new skills.



Age of children and young people involved in creating the artwork: Ages 11-22

Description of the artwork: The children and young people chose to do a tile mosaic to show what they love and like about Barnsley. They chose to depict areas they had visited and villages they live in but wanted to include all the areas of Barnsley to show the diversity and the inclusion of our town, as this is important to them.






2021 Artwork

Exhibit Number: E017 Service: Exodus

Description of the Service: We work with children and young people, many from the most disadvantaged communities. Our aim is to divert them from destructive lifestyles and we work in partnership with families and others within the communities. We have activity clubs in the heart of the community and offer weekend camps combining fun and educational activities. Our aims are to build trusting relationships and grow aspirations.



Age of children and young people involved in creating the artwork: Ages 8-15

Description of the artwork:

The children and young people all wanted to bring their ideas to the canvas. A lot of them had the idea to draw the foundation of exodus, hence the building. This is our activity centre, a home from home, where all our children and young people matter. We wanted them to know they matter to us just as much as we matter to them. They wanted to draw things, such as, family or worldly possessions, feelings and beliefs.





Service: Athersley Family Centre

Description of the Service: We offer childcare for 2–4-year-olds with our main aims to improve outcomes for all children who attend and develop their self-help and interaction skills in preparation for school. We have outdoor play areas that provide exciting experiences for children to explore and enjoy and are equipped with resources to ensure children are stimulated in a safe environment. We encourage children to be independent and allow them to develop at their own pace by learning through play.

Age of child/children or young person/young people involved in creating the artwork: Ages 2-4



Description of the artwork: The artwork depicts the journey in which the children have taken since the beginning of the pandemic to now. The journey begins with the Covid-19 cloud and the children experiencing a mixture of emotions. The children were small seeds but by still having the familiar routine of nursery life they were able to blossom and thrive. In the eyes of the children nursery staff were heroes as they enabled them to have some normality in a scary world. The children that were Home Learning started returning to nursery and were once again able to socialise with their friends. 'What matters' to the nursery children are the happy and vibrant nursery staff and a safe setting, which is like a little family unit.






Service: Thurnscoe and Dearne Family Centres

Description of the Service: Thurnscoe Family Centre is a purpose-built building, which provides a variety of services to the local community with children aged 0-19 (or age 25 if they have an additional need). Within the family centre we provide sessional term-time only childcare, for funded children aged 2 to 4.

Age of children involved in creating the artwork: Ages 7-11



Description of the artwork: A collage of individual pieces. 'What matters now' is doing things with family like walking, exploring the outdoors and playing in the garden (like during the lockdowns) and continuing to do these things more, as everyday life returns to normal. Some of the children got a family pet during lockdown and highlight how much they love them and how important they are to them now. The children also highlighted how much they missed their friends when they were not allowed to see them and that now they are back at school they feel happier as they can see and play with their friends again. At the beginning of the first lockdown some were quite excited about not being able to go to school but after a while they began to miss going and hope that the schools do not close again. When discussing Covid-19 with the children during the creation of the artwork it became apparent that some had more awareness of the impact the pandemic has had on their lives than others.





Service: Healthwatch - Barnsley Young Carers' Service

Description of the Service: A Young Carers Service, provided by Barnardo's, who are based at Priory Campus. We work directly with children and young people who have a caring role in their family. By providing the right help, the service makes sure that the child or young person does not become responsible for inappropriate caring responsibilities.

Age of children and young people involved in creating the artwork: Ages 4-14



Description of the artwork: When we spoke to the children and young people and asked them "what matters to you now?" there was an overwhelming feeling of friends and family, making sure everyone was safe and having a sense of belonging. We decided to build our own community in the form of a street full of houses and small pockets of green spaces. Each child/young person decorated a house in a theme or design of their choosing. The houses all have removable roofs and inside the child/young person has written a short sentence or two on what matters to them now.





Service: Barnsley Youth Justice Service - Remedi

Description of the Service: Barnsley Youth Justice Service recognises the power of restorative practice. This means every child will have the opportunity to repair the harm they caused in some form; with an aspiration that they can engage in direct restorative intervention with the victim(s) of their offending where possible. This service is provided by Remedi on behalf of Barnsley Youth Justice Service.

Age of young people involved in creating the artwork: Ages 14-17


Description of the artwork: The young people have painted jigsaw pieces representing their moods. The photographs are of places in Barnsley that are important to them, where they feel safe. One young person explained, "I can see Barnsley and the world from here, and I always wonder what's beyond those houses and hills". On the back of the jigsaw pieces are the young peoples' reflections of childhood, and explanations of why these places matter to the; mainly because they remind them of friends, family or local history. Each piece can be taken out and turned around to reveal an expression from the young people or thoughts and feelings about their pictures and places, so people are able to understand there are two sides to young people we work with.

Description of the Service: YMCA Barnsley deliver a wide range of children's and youth work, extended services and members activities. Age of child or young person involved in creating the artwork: Age 13

Description of the artwork:

After being given the criteria of 'What matters to me, now' the young person decided to produce artwork including a poem around mental health as it is something they consider very important. The poem illustrates how for some children and young people, lockdown was a blessing and the return to normality and face-to-face education brings about feelings of anxiety. This highlights how it is important that this is considered, and pupils are supported in school.

Description of the artwork:

'What matters to me, now' is doing art. During the Covid-19 lockdown, this young person enjoyed doing more artwork which made them feel relaxed. Covid really affected the way they thought about things and people; what they had concerns about or worried about before seemed trivial. Focusing their mind on art improved their mental wellbeing, which is why they chose to create a piece depicting just a few of the things they used to draw during the pandemic to ground them.






Exhibit Number: E024 Service: YMCA Barnsley – ACE Club

Description of the artwork:

'What matters to me, now' is that we are not alone! Covid-19 separated us from our families and friends and made us feel that we were alone and had no one to turn to. This piece of artwork illustrates how you can be surrounded by people, and you can still feel alone for a variety of reasons and that it is important to create opportunities for children and young people to spend time building friendships with others.






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Age of children or young people involved in creating the artwork: Age 13

'What matters to us, now' has been changed because of our experiences during the Covid-19 lockdown. It made children and young people realise how the simplest items turned out to be the most precious ones; family and friendships, our environment and feeling safe.
