1. Cooper Gallery Coffee House, Church Street

Visit for the art and stay for the home-made quiche at this family-run cafe inside The Cooper Gallery. Loyal customers rave about their beautifully presented takeaway afternoon teas and fresh food. It also has a garden terrace and occasional multi-course meals for special occasions sell out fast.

The Mayor of Barnsley regularly orders takeaway afternoon teas from the Cooper Gallery Coffee House.



The Old George team make around 4,000 chocolate brownies a week and have their own on-site bakery.


2. Old George, Market Hill

The owners of this trailblazing venture got into business to create the coffee shop they craved in their home town. Now they employ 27 local people, have their own Old George speciality coffee blend made from beans produced at female-run plantations and are a popular brunch and lunch destination too.




3. The Victorian Tea Rooms, The Arcade

Stalwart Barnsley business owner Diane Rushforth has spent over 20 years perfecting her scone recipe - and the proof is in the pudding. Customers travel from far and wide to sample her traditional English menu while enjoying a social chat. Steak pies and afternoon teas are also popular, all served at affordable prices.



4. Courtyard Cafe, Albert Street

A lifelong love of baking is behind this welcoming cafe run by two friends - who start cooking as early as 5.30am! Treats on offer include everything from marble cake to their popular blueberry scones, sharing pies to take home and roast dinners. The courtyard eating area has weather-proof shelters.



5. Falco Lounge, The Glass Works

Curl up with a good book and house blend coffee at a homely lounge, which even connects to the library next door for reading inspiration. The bright atmosphere changes hourly, whether visitors fancy brunch or cocktails, taking the kids for lunch or a day out with their dog.

The house blend coffee at Falco Lounge has hints of milk chocolate, hazelnut and caramel.



6. Daddy Beanz, Market Kitchen

Serious coffee drinkers need look no further. Cool and funky Daddy Beanz offers guest single origin coffees as well as its own house blend, which has been created with Recent Beans in Castleford. Kickstart a busy day with their dirty chai latte - a cinnamon-scented, powerfully-cafeinated twist on the classic.

7. Caffè Botanico, The Glass Works

Step into the Mediterranean at airy Caffè Botanico, which opened in 2021. Start your journey with a smooth Italian coffee or their unique Nutella hot chocolate with cream and a flake. Pick up a cannoli pastry or sit down for smashed avocado on toast. Who needs to go on holiday?



The Coffee Boy speciality features coffee, vanilla and brown sugar. It's described as 'crème brûlée in a cup'.


8. Coffee Boy, The Glass Works

Stop what you're doing. This is the coffee that dreams are made of. Coffee Boy is serving up a house blend of five ethically sourced coffees alongside insta worthy DoBoy Donuts. This is a relaxed one-stop shop to meet, eat and work. The friendly staff give the warmest welcome and top-notch recommendations.



9. Massarella's, Alhambra Shopping Centre

'Meet me at Massarella's' has been a common local refrain for over quarter of a century. Expect a warm welcome for customers, many who visit no matter the weather, in this family-run staple. Speciality teas, coffee and hearty lunches such as scampi or paninis are on offer, plus kids' options.



10. Blackburns Cafe, Market Street

Keeping a cafe going for almost three decades is no mean feat. Staff at Blackburns say their top service is what customers praise, as well as the traditional feel and wide range of hot drinks. Special dishes change daily and rib-sticking meals include stews, pies and classic liver and onions.
