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


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
#### 1. Tin Oyle, Sackville Street

Named in a nod to the former tin factory which once stood on the site, the Tin Oyle is a favourite post-work haunt. Inside the decor is industrial, with one wall dedicated to the history of the Barnsley Canister Company. The bar sells everything from cask ales to gins.



#### 2. Tipsy Cow Microbar, Gateway Plaza, Sackville Street

All the best ideas start in the pub... so it was with the Tipsy Cow, known for its rotating, fresh local real ales. The family owners, who thought of the venture while in a micropub and whose daughter chose the name, also offer plenty of gins, rums and regular live music.



#### 4. The Courthouse, Regent Street

An 'informal waiting room' is the best way to describe a grand old pub steeped in local history. Passengers using the adjacent railway station, Barnsley football fans and dog owners are among regular customers, with everyone welcomed. Madrí lager and Atlantic Pale Ale are the more unusual beers on offer.



#### 5. The Garrison, Hanson Street

When it comes to sports bars, The Garrison hits the back of the net. Enjoy a friendly fever pitch atmosphere when Barnsley FC play and catch the biggest sports fixtures. It's a family-run bar, serving up quality draught beers, craft IPAs and that critical post-match debrief.



#### 3. The Old No 7, Market Hill

The best collection of cask ales in Barnsley with nine hand pulls - tick. A proper 'olde worlde' pub with welcoming and friendly staff - tick again. The Old No 7 is now independently run and has many CAMRA awards to its name, making it a real ale lover's dream destination.

Beer sommeliers with extensive knowledge are on hand at The Old No 7, whether it's German craft ale or Belgian specialities you desire.



#### 6. Spiral City, The Arcade


Big city vibes without leaving Barnsley are found at this late 2021 opening. The design is art deco style - in homage to the artist owners - while craft ale is the focus through its wide selection of kegs and colourful cans. Speciality snacks and a focus on local brews feature, naturally.

Browse records before enjoying a beer at Spiral City, which is located right next to a vinyl store.



### 7. Jolly Tap, The Victorian Arcade

Ambience is hard to get just right. They've mastered it at the Jolly Tap, which combines community spirit, a cosy atmosphere and 100 per cent locally produced beer in an award-winning independent package. Fans say the porter is worth a visit alone, and visitors come from across Yorkshire and beyond.



### 8. Peakys Bar, The Victorian Arcade

It's a step up from Tommy Shelby's favourite watering hole... Peakys microbar has a Peaky Blinders theme; think whiskey barrels, memorabilia from the hit TV series and even a specially named cocktail. The owners offer a personal welcome to create a pub simply brimming with personality.

Every flavour of unconventional Dean Man's Fingers rum can be tried at Peakys Bar - even the impossible to find varieties!




#### 9. The Silkstone Inn, Market Street

There's a nod to proud local history here, as the rich Silkstone seam of coal was worked at several local pits. This pub offers the great value and variety fans of Wetherspoon have come to expect, as well as regional beers, outdoor seating and a relaxed, friendly atmosphere.
