




















There are public and disabled toilets in the same building as the library – I can ask a member of library staff to direct me if I'm unsure.




I will talk to someone who works there to become a member of the

I will show them identification. This can be a driving licence, bank statement or household bill. It should have my name and address on it.














The person I am talking to will type all the details I give them into a computer and I will be given a library card













It's okay to borrow and read a children's book if you're an adult. There are also large print books, comic books and books about local history. I can sit in a chair to read a book. I can borrow a book and take it home with me.
