The Coronation Ceremony takes place on Saturday 6 May at Westminster Abbey, followed by a weekend of special events and celebrations – nationally and locally.

# What's on and how to get involved



## National celebrations

The coronation is a time for celebration across the nation and the Commonwealth. There's a weekend of special events taking place in London which will be televised for us all to enjoy:

### **Saturday 6 May 2023**

The Coronation Ceremony takes place at Westminster Abbey, London. The solemn religious ceremony is conducted by the Archbishop of Canterbury. It will feature twelve newly commissioned pieces of music, showcasing musical talent from across the United Kingdom and the Commonwealth.

### **Sunday 7 May 2023**

A spectacular Coronation Concert will be performed at Windsor Castle. Iconic locations across the UK will be lit up using projections, lasers, drone displays and illuminations. The concert will be broadcast live from the grounds of Windsor Castle. It will bring together music icons, current stars, a world-class orchestra and art performances.

### **Monday 8 May 2023**

A special bank holiday has been proclaimed by the Prime Minister in honour of the coronation. This gives everyone the chance to join others in their area and good causes through Big Help Out activities.

As you'd expect, along with our amazing residents and communities, we are pulling out all the stops as we come together to celebrate The King's Coronation here in Barnsley!

**Saturday 6 May 2023 10am to 4pm**

### **Barnsley's Coronation Family Event, Glass Works Square**

Join us for our free, one-day event which promises to be a day fit for a king. It will feature a whole programme of entertainment, performances, crafts and activities for all the family to enjoy.

A highlight will be welcoming Charles the T-Rex, a large-scale willow dinosaur in honour of the King. The T-Rex is a nod to the monarch's new cypher which includes CR III, where 'C' is for Charles and 'R' is for Rex which means King in Latin.

The coronation event will also feature performances, entertainers and royal crafts for all the family.



### **Join the BIG SCREEN celebrations**

Fancy watching the coronation on the big screen? come along to our event from 10am, take a seat, sit back and soak up the atmosphere, whilst watching the historical moment on the big screen.

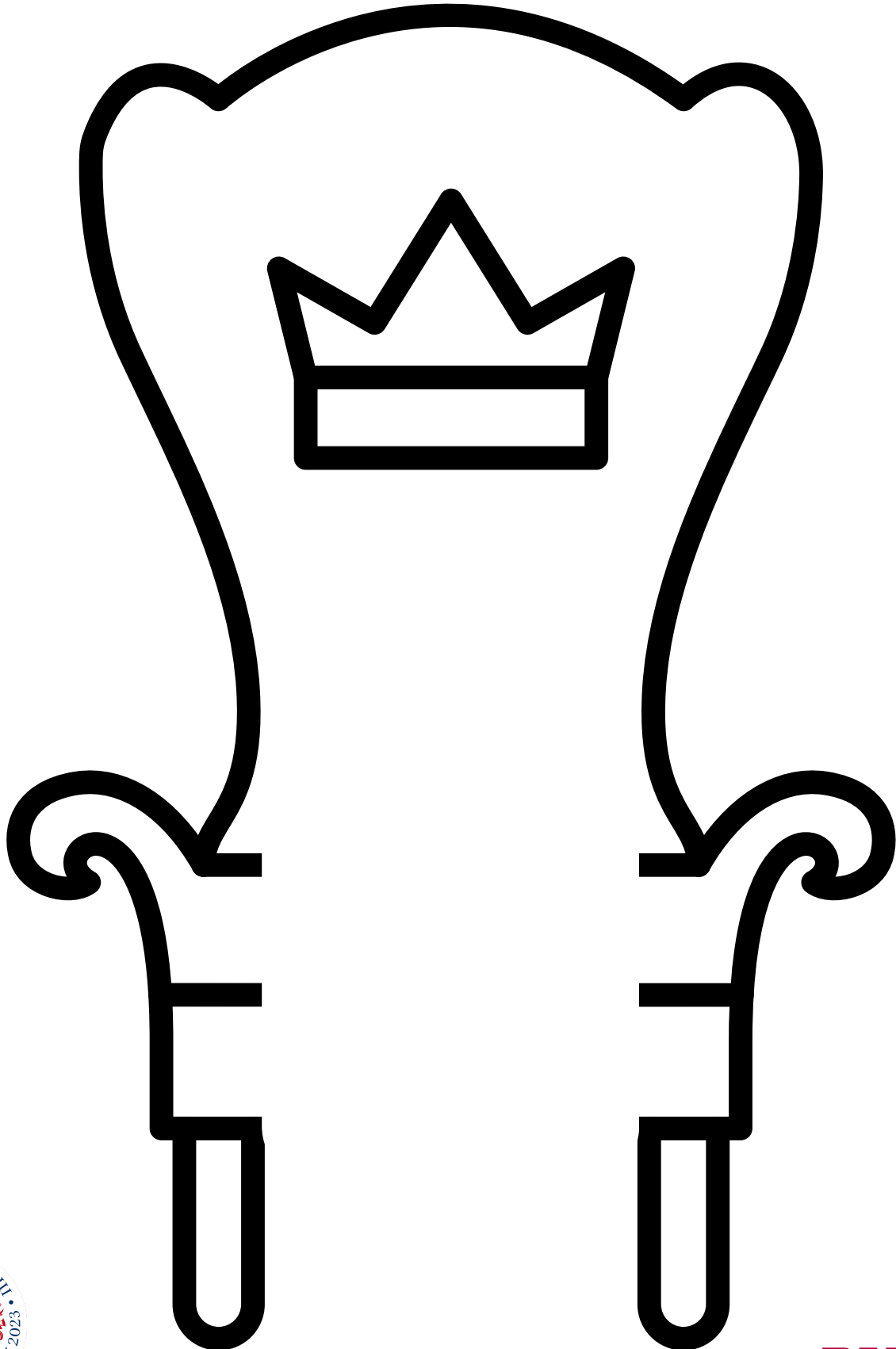

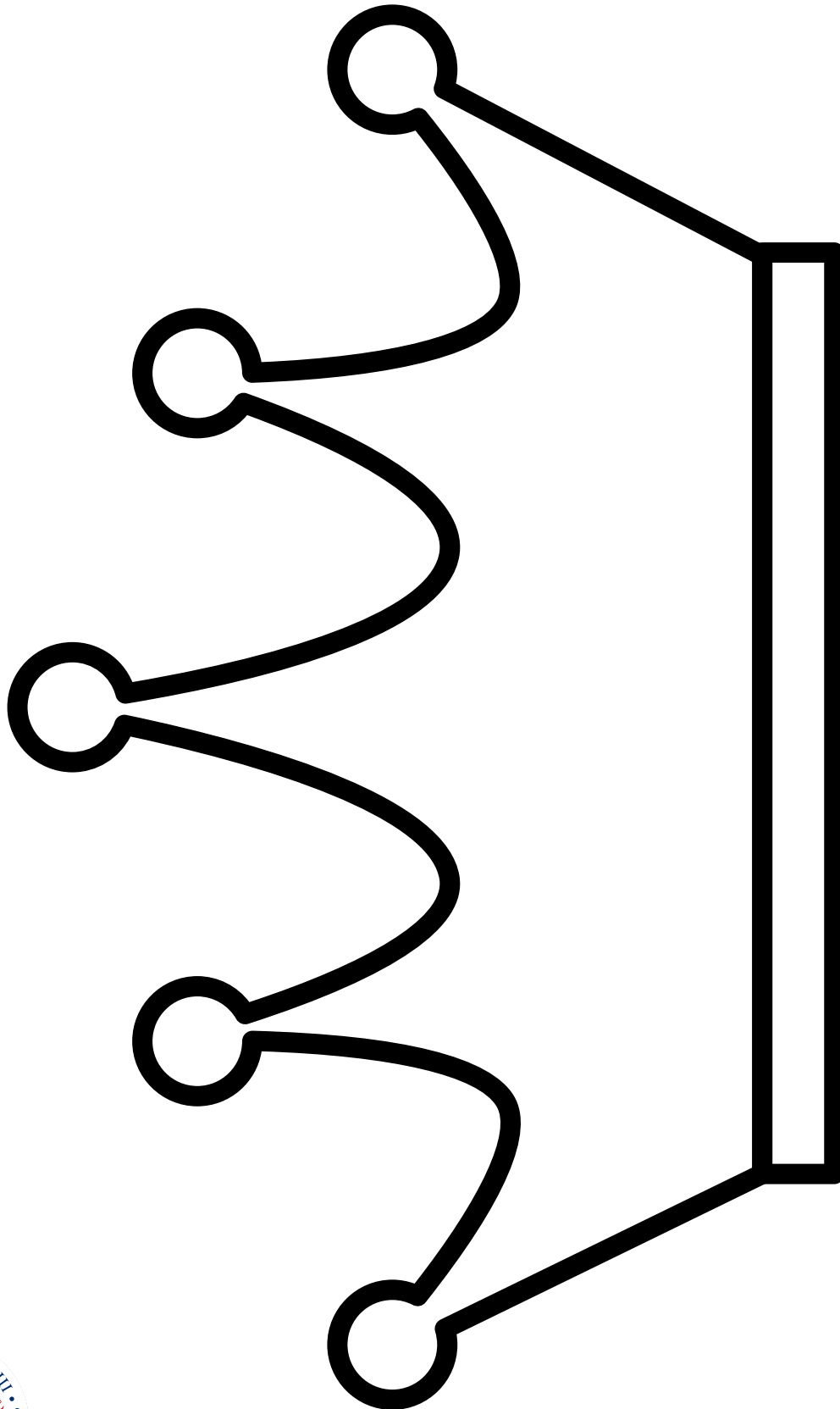

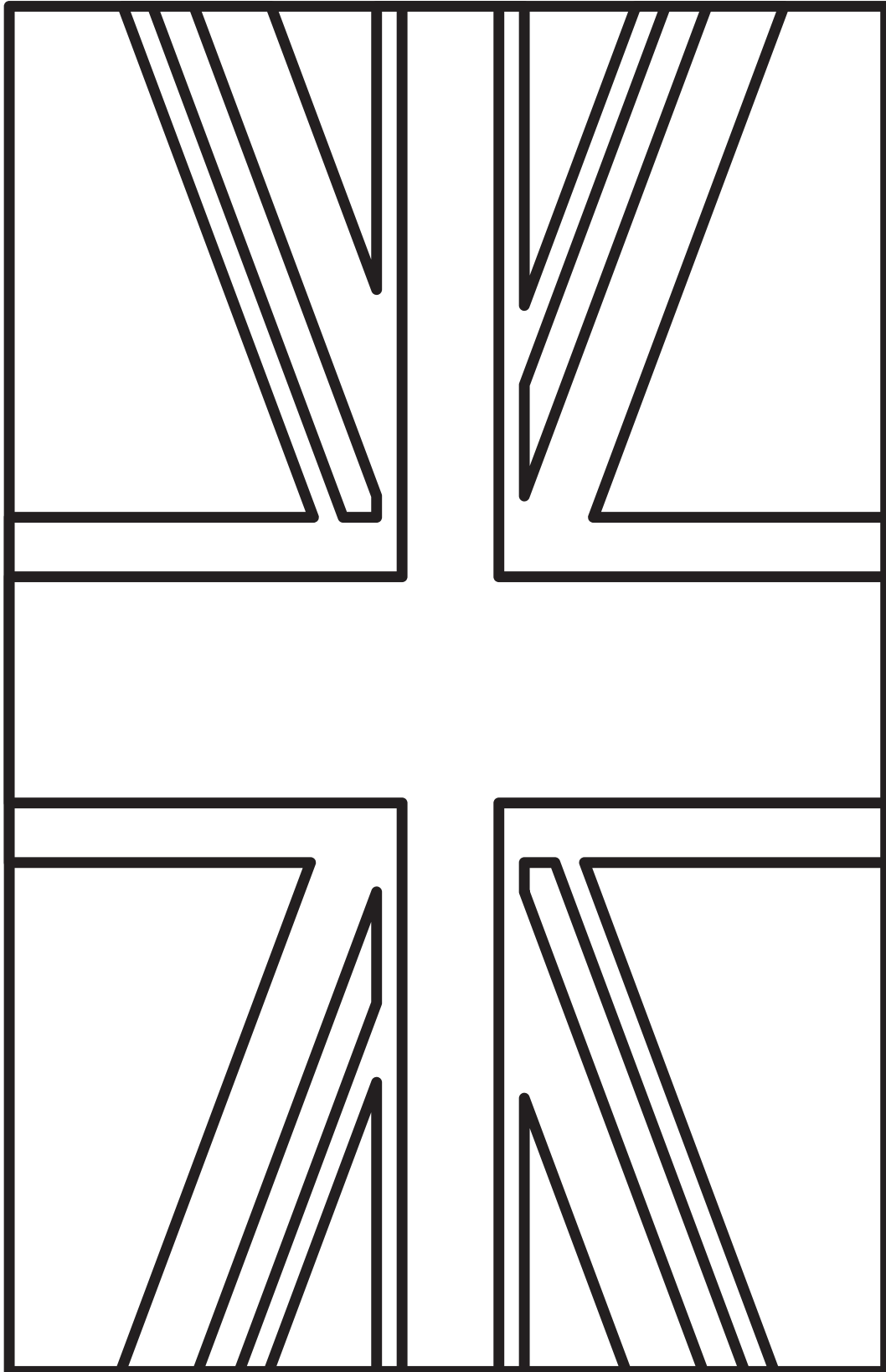

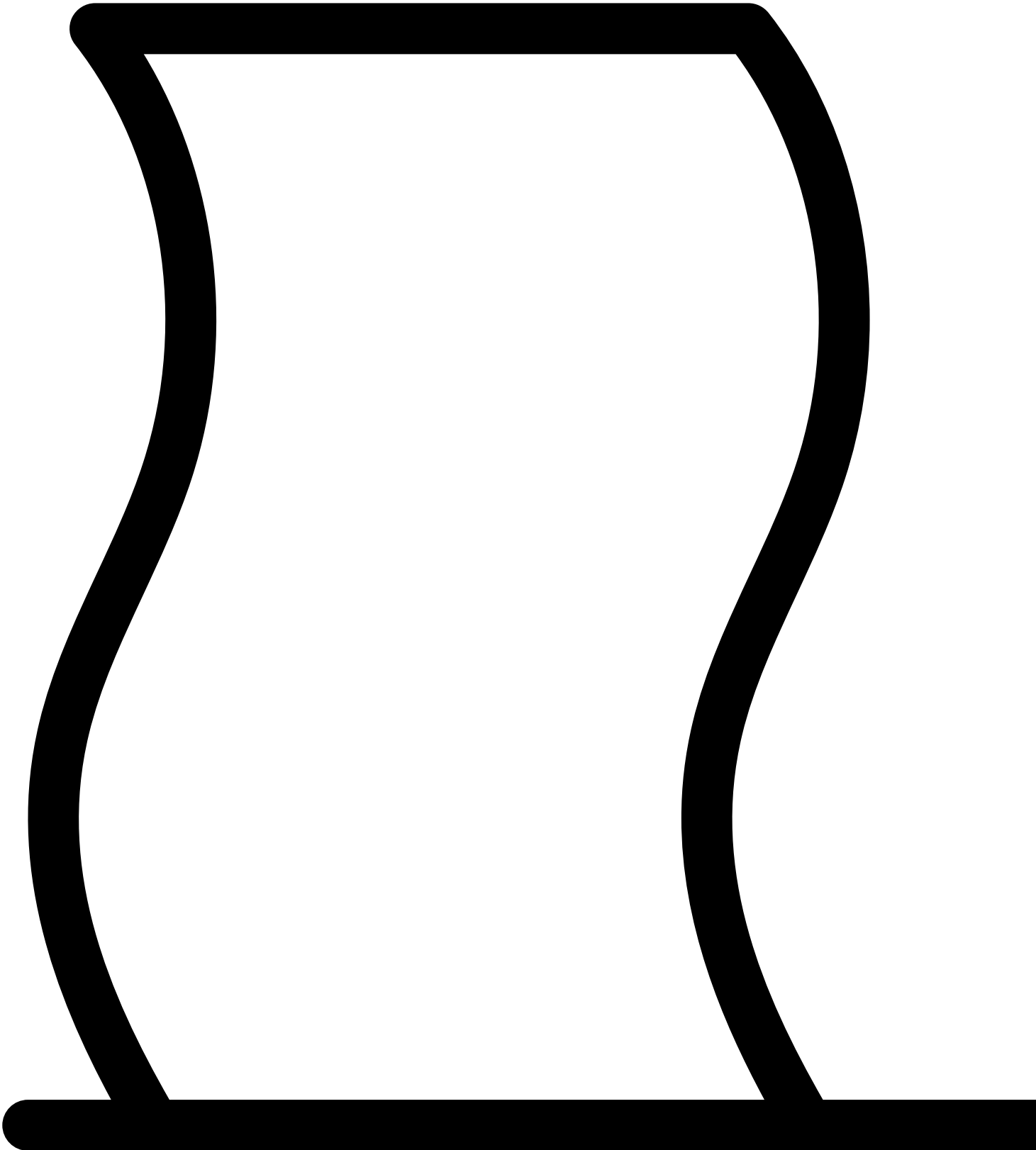

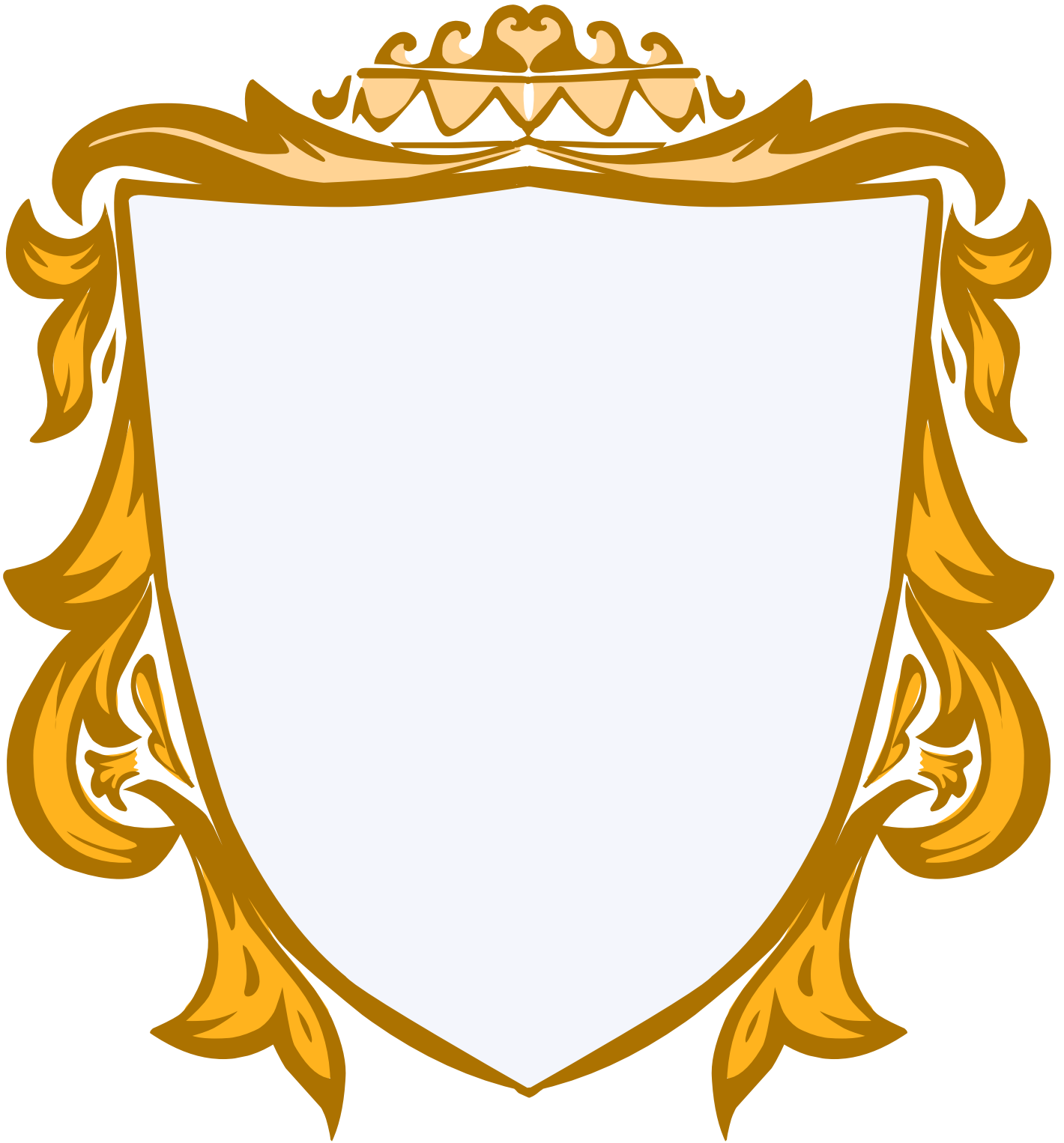

Design your own coronation-themed coat of arms .



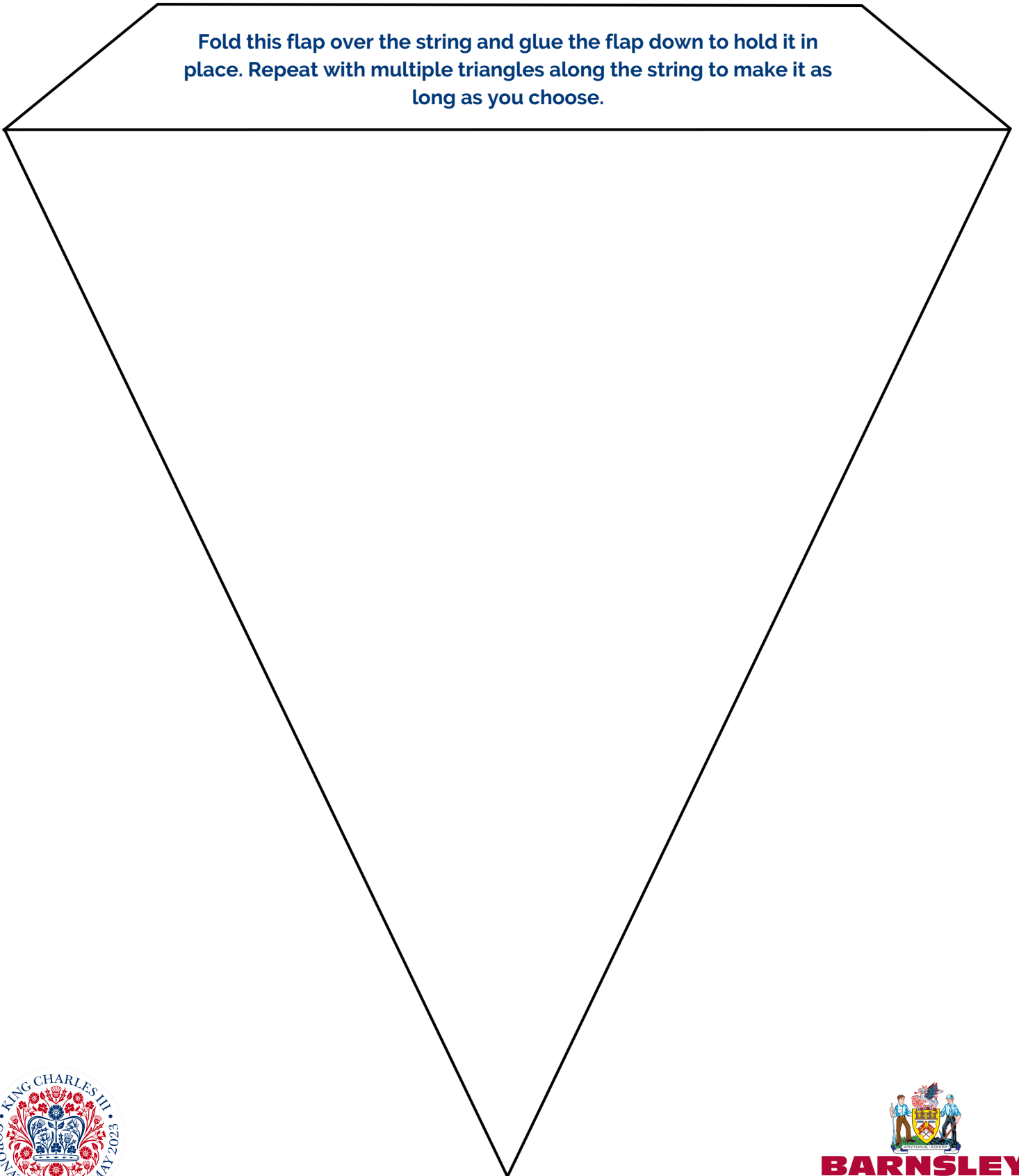




# Coronation Bunting

**Fold this flap over the string and glue the flap down to hold it in place. Repeat with multiple triangles along the string to make it as long as you choose.**





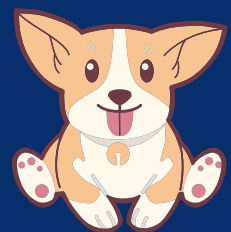

# Coronation Crafts and ideas

## King Charles mascot

# Royal Recipes

## Coronation Chicken

You can't have a royal coronation without the chicken kind!



### What you need


- 6 tbsp mayo
- 2-3 tsp mild curry powder
- Half a tsp of ground cinnamon
- 2 tbsp of mango chutney
- 1-3 tbsp of sultanas
- 500g of chopped or shredded cooked chicken

1. Mix the mayo, curry powder, cinnamon, chutney and sultanas together and season with black pepper.
2. Add the chicken and stir to coat in the sauce.
3. If the mixture is too thick, add 2 tbsp of water and mix.
4. Serve with salad or in royal sandwiches.
