Managing infectious diseases in education and childcare settings

This document explains the reporting process for notifiable diseases. A notifiable disease is any disease that is required by law to be reported to government authorities.



All outbreaks of notifiable diseases in education and childcare settings must be reported to the UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA).

In the first instance, please refer to the <u>UKHSA Managing Specific</u> <u>Infectious Diseases A to Z</u> to identify if the disease is notifiable.

Please then follow the reporting process if:

- There is a higher than previously experienced and/or rapidly increasing number of staff or child absence due to an infectious disease.
- There is evidence of a severe infectious disease e.g. if a child or staff member is admitted to hospital.
