SEND co-production survey highlights

In May 2023 Barnsley council published a survey to find out how parents and carers of children and young people with SEND in Barnsley want to work together with the local authority and partners to shape decisions made about SEND services.

The questions for the survey were put together with help from

- parents and carers of children and young people with SEND
- SEND colleagues from across the local area.


The survey was advertised:

- through the Barnsley Schools Alliance
- in local press
- at school and community parent and carer groups and events.

Local SEND groups and schools also supported the survey by sharing it with their networks. We really appreciate the support that was given to making sure the survey was well shared.


A total of 249 people responded with 218 of those responses from parents and carers. This report looks at the highlights from the survey.

The survey results can be seen below.




Have you been involved in co production activity in Barnsley before?


From the survey it became apparent that the word co-production isn't always very well understood. Parents and carers who have been involved in work previously did not associate their involvement with the word co-production. With this in, mind we will be asking what parents and carers in Barnsley want co-production to be called, if it is going to be changed.




25% of people who engaged with the survey said they do not want to be involved with coproduction. This has highlighted to us the need to make sure we get better at sharing information about what is going on and how to get involved. However, 75% do. Do you think that an agreed plan for co production (a document that will help us achieve a consistent approach) would help us all understand what co production is and how we work together.




94.01% of parents and carers said that a plan would help us to achieve a consistent approach to how we work together and co-produce.







Our next steps

Now that we have the results of this survey we will begin moving forward with creating a plan for how we all work together to shape SEND services in Barnsley.

To do this we will:

- Meet with local SEND parent/carer groups to discuss how they would like to be involved.
- Create a mechanism to enable members of different groups to come together.
- Use a mix of day time, evening and online options when we put on public sessions for people who are not part of parent/carer groups.

To make sure that people know what is going on and how they can get involved we will:

- Use the results of this survey to create a dedicated Co-Production Facebook page so you
 can see what is going on and how to get involved.
- Ask parents and carers about their understanding and opinions on the word co-production.
 We will be asking you if we should call it something else or use the word co-production and explain it more.
- Continue to book sessions in schools and settings to make sure parents and carers of children and young people with SEND know how they can be involved.
- Expand the monthly participation drop in sessions to more areas from September 2023.
- Improve the co-production page on the SEND Local Offer.
- Roll out a registration form to allow individuals to sign up to receive information about how to get involved in co-production.

We want to take this opportunity to thank everyone who took part in the survey and all those who shared it. We are looking forward to this exciting opportunity to design how we work together to shape SEND in Barnsley.
