

Market Gate Bridge

We're pleased to say we're in the final stages of the construction of Market Gate Bridge, which will be opening very soon.

It's a little later than we'd hoped, and we understand it's been frustrating for some. A project of this size is always likely to encounter a few hitches along the way. It's very nearly there now and we know it will have been worth the wait – it certainly looks the part!

The bridge is a landmark feature on the Barnsley skyline and the first thing people see when arriving by bus or train, giving the wow factor our outstanding town centre deserves.

It will provide easy access directly into The Glass Works Square to encourage even more people to access our vibrant town centre through active travel, whether on foot, by bike, wheelchair or scooter. The bridge will be fully accessible with lifts at both ends and cyclists will also be able to take their bikes into the lifts or walk them up the steps using a dedicated cycle wheel groove built into the bridge.

The majority of the funding has come from external sources, including £7.3m from South Yorkshire Mayoral Combined Authority and £2m from Network Rail. This was part of Network Rail's programme of replacing level crossings with safer alternatives.

Goldthorpe's exciting new town square now open

A new town square bringing hope of a bright future to the heart of Goldthorpe is now open.

The Heart of Goldthorpe hosts a market every Thursday from 9am to 3pm with a variety of stalls ranging from sweets and baked goods to household items.

The square, which will also be a venue for public events, has, winding paths, curved planting beds, informal seating, an area for reflection and contrasting paving patterns where children might play.

The Horse and Groom pub had become disused and was demolished to make way for the new square. Its memory is preserved in the square with a specially-designed mosaic artwork inspired by the pub sign. The Heart of Goldthorpe is one of five projects in Goldthorpe shaped through public consultation, which are being funded through the £23.1m awarded to Goldthorpe from the UK Government's Towns Fund.

The projects also include:

- the regeneration of traditional terraced streets
- developing land to encourage businesses to invest
- the renovation of the Dearne Playhouse
- creation of a new cultural hub at the Welfare Park
- improvements to play facilities and a new visitor hub at Phoenix Park

Towns Fund investment in Goldthorpe, Thurnscoe and Bolton upon Dearne supports our investment work in the main high streets and local areas across the borough, helping them to thrive.



Family Hubs
and Start for
Life launches
in Barnsley

A brand-new, dynamic service to help support families recently launched in Barnsley.

The Family Hubs and Start for Life programme is a £3.4 million investment to make sure families flourish in Barnsley. From conception right the way through to young adulthood, families will be supported through Family Hubs with a strong Start For Life offer at their core, which will be easily accessible throughout the borough.

Family Hubs will build on the success of Family Centres, providing additional services that are easy to access.

The first pilot Family Hub was successfully launched in August at the Kendray and Worsborough Family Centre, with an action packed, fun-filled day out for the local community.

Following a ribbon cutting ceremony by Mayor of Barnsley, Councillor James Michael Stowe, families were welcomed in to meet a wide range of services who can offer guidance, help and support in the local community whenever they need it.

As well as the activities provided at the Hub, including a sensory garden, messy play area

and outdoor activities,
a children's entertainer
provided lots of fun,
including singing,
dancing and a

dancing singing, dancing and a foam party.

Early Start, Families
Strategy and
Service Manager
at Barnsley Council,
Laura Hammerton,
said: "The Family
Hubs and Start for
Life programme is a
brilliant opportunity
in Barnsley. It's a way
of bringing together

different services and support for families across the borough.

"Our Family Hubs will allow people to share their needs, and our amazing team of professionals work together like never before to address any challenges families might be facing."

Following feedback from families in the Family Hubs public consultation in September 2023, the service will look to develop to give families the support they need over the coming months.

Further Family Hubs will open across Barnsley with online services being continuously reviewed and improved to help provide the best service and support possible for families who need it the most.

The proposed model will provide more services and support for families across Barnsley. Families will be able to access support faceto-face in a Family Hub, face-toface in the community and online.

The Magic of Middle-Earth has arrived in Barnsley

Museum visitors in Barnsley will be transported to a magical world which promises dragons, elves, and haunting soundscapes.

The Magic of Middle-Earth exhibition is dedicated to the incredible work of J.R.R Tolkien and the generations of writers, artists, musicians, filmmakers, environmentalists, creators, and game designers he influenced.

The exhibition, which runs until April 2024 at Experience Barnsley Museum, situated in Barnsley Town Hall, allows visitors to go beyond 'The Hobbit' and 'The Lord of the Rings' epic fantasy novels to discover the artistic legacy of Tolkien's incredible fantasy world.

Presenting a magical treasure trove of over 200 rare objects and artworks, The Magic of Middle-Earth exhibition will showcase a rare first edition copy of 'The Hobbit' from 1937, dramatic models and dioramas including The Battle of Helms Deep, concept artwork, as well as theatre, music and movie-inspired memorabilia and prop replicas.

The free exhibition, with donations welcomed, also includes stunning paintings illustrating Tolkien's deep passion for the natural world, Middle-Earth inspired video games and LEGO sets, and a soundscape including music by Howard Shore, who composed, orchestrated, conducted, and produced the music of 'The Lord of the Rings' and 'The Hobbit' films.

Tolkien was an English writer and a professional colleague and friend of Barnsley-born educationalist and Cooper Gallery benefactor Sir Michael Sadler in the 1920s. During that time, as Vice-Chancellor at The University of Leeds, Sadler created the position of Professor of English Language especially for Tolkien. They would work together in Oxford over the next two decades, during which period Tolkien would write his famed novels.

The Magic of Middle-Earth will also involve handson activities including Dungeons and Dragonsesque gaming sessions, a clay-making 'Dragon Eyes' session activities during Barnsley Bright Night's festivities, and much more.

Healthy relationships are kind, equal and trusting, free from fear, harm, violence and abuse. Abusive relationships can take many different forms; the abuse can be physical, emotional, sexual, economic or financial, as well as controlling or coercive behaviour.

Our partners, IDAS, provide support and accommodation to victims and survivors of domestic abuse and sexual violence in Barnsley. As well as one-to-one support, IDAS can support people to rebuild their lives and recover from abuse alongside others who have had similar experiences. They can also provide support virtually through online video support sessions, WhatsApp, online live chat, or over email.

There are currently around 60 children across South Yorkshire who are waiting for permanent, loving adoptive homes. Nearly half of these need to be adopted with their brothers or sisters.

Lots of people want to adopt, but unfortunately, children in sibling groups often wait much longer to find a loving family. That's why our regional adoption agency, One Adoption South Yorkshire, is hoping to find people who can meet the needs of these children.

Significant events like Christmas and birthdays can be difficult for children who are adopted as it can bring back memories of their life before adoption. Being able to share these times with a sibling can make it a lot easier; sharing happy memories and as well as being able to make new ones together is important.

You may have seen our friendly team out and about countless times as we've been popping up all over the borough, from community centres to local businesses.

We've helped shoppers browsing our markets, book lovers in their local library and guys looking to freshen up their look at their favourite barbers.

By going out to our communities, we've been able to perform more than 5,000 free blood pressure

checks and have really important conversations about looking after your heart.

By working with local pharmacies and the NHS, we've been able to help people with high blood pressure readings get the support they need.

We've had some great feedback along the way, including from Timothy, who we recently spoke to at Penistone Market.

He told us the sessions helped him to continue focusing on healthy lifestyle choices, thanks to our "professional, approachable, helpful and friendly" team.

So, if you see the team out and about this winter, come say hi and get your blood pressure checked for free. It's quick, painless and could save your life.

Meet Barnsley Hospital's Healthy Lives team

The Healthy Lives Team at Barnsley
Hospital provide advice and treatment
on ways to keep healthy and reduce
illness. Our work includes asking
patients about things that can harm
health (such as smoking, alcohol
and poor housing), giving treatment
and support during a hospital stay,
and arranging help from community
services when people go home.



Treating tobacco addiction

To help protect people's health, Barnsley Hospital is smokefree, meaning that staff, patients and visitors cannot smoke anywhere on site. To prevent patients getting unpleasant withdrawal symptoms, we give free nicotine replacement therapy (NRT) and friendly support to everyone admitted to hospital who smokes. We also arrange ongoing support in local communities if patients choose to continue to stop smoking after discharge.

Early help for children and families

Our Early Help Navigator team work with children, young people and families at the hospital who may benefit from extra support. They identify issues that may harm children's health and wellbeing, such as money, housing, and mental health concerns, and support families to access services across Barnsley that can help.

Supporting people who drink high amounts of alcohol

Our specially trained Alcohol Care Nurses care for people who drink high amounts of alcohol that may harm their health. They work closely with patients, families, carers, hospital staff, and community services to treat people during and after a hospital stay. They also help people to make changes that encourage safer alcohol consumption.

Barnsley Hospital's Veteran Aware plaque was officially unveiled last month by Barnsley Central MP Dan Jarvis, a former Major in the British Army.

Personal hygiene and care bank empowers local families

The cost of living has affected many households since the pandemic and significantly changed the Dearne Area's priorities.

In response, our Dearne Area Team started talking to people in the Dearne community to learn about their needs and develop projects helping families who need support. One of these projects is a personal hygiene and care bank that gives families access to everyday household items.

Councillor Wendy Cain had spoken to many families in the community during local summer events about how they were struggling financially and approached the Dearne Area Team to discuss what support could be provided. With advice and support from the Dearne North and South Ward Alliances, a plan was drawn up to create a local hygiene and personal care bank. Here, hygiene and care items - as well as household cleaning products - could be handed out for free to the families that need them, freeing up money for them to buy other essentials.

The project was made possible through funding from the Household Support Grant. Finding an appropriate location to establish the bank was a crucial step, and it was Emma, a dedicated volunteer at the Renaissance Centre, who proposed it as an ideal spot. The Renaissance Centre, housed within a historic

school building on Priory Road in Bolton on Dearne, demonstrated immense generosity by waiving the rental fee, enabling the project to continue for a longer time.

In a commendable show of support, Tesco in Wath placed a substantial order for hygiene products and guaranteed their timely delivery.

Our partnership with multiple Dearne-based organisations, bolstered by the support of our local elected representatives, has proven to be immensely beneficial. Thanks to the collective contributions of children's centres, the Salvation Army, Station House, and Berneslai Homes, we have extended our support to a wide range of residents who require assistance.

As the bank began receiving referrals, it became evident how essential this support was. Positive comments poured in from families who have benefited from the support. One resident shared, "It's a huge relief to not worry about missing out on some food items. My family will always be thankful to those behind this project."

Councillor Wendy Cain, Cabinet Spokesperson for Public Health and Communities, said: "Helping our families and local people is integral to what we do as a council, and I'm so proud of the work we've done in the Dearne Area to support those in our communities who need it most. If you're struggling with the rising cost of living, please know that support is available for you.

In September, many of you came along to celebrate Worsbrough's heritage with us at our Worsbrough Local History Days.

Back in 2021, the Worsbrough Industrial and Social History group (WISH) got in touch with the Central Area Team for support in securing permissions and funding to install a new mining memorial in the area.

National recognition for EXOCUS

Exodus has been working in the communities of Barnsley for 23 years, with the North East Area Council supporting them for nearly a decade. They work with children and young people, their families, and communities to support happy, thriving lifestyles. Exodus run 16 clubs in total, four taking place in the local area, and are proudly supported by the Area Council and Ward Alliances.

"Our unique approach has been working for over 20 years," says Martin Sawdon, Co-Founder and Development Manager for the charity. "We don't just get the kids off the street and out of trouble for a couple of hours a week... that's the easy part. We build long-term trusting relationships that mean when the young people get to their challenging teenage years; they are among trusted adults and alongside peers doing positive and affirming things, as opposed to hanging about outside the bus station or the corner shop."

Exodus and its impact have been recognised in many ways. They were finalists some years back in the Proud of Barnsley Awards and more recently were celebrated on the national stage at the Weston Charity Awards. Co-Founders Martin and his wife Jackie were awarded an MBE in the King's Birthday Honours list.

Jackie said, "We've been overwhelmed by the response from our family and friends to the award. It's the kind of thing that happens to other people, not us. I can't believe the number of people who have encouraged us and said how deserving we are. It doesn't feel like we've done anything that special, but if it helps us get support for Exodus for another 20 years, that is fantastic. Of course, it will

be a great day when we get to visit Buckingham Palace and receive our medals, too."

Exodus has been a valuable partner to the North East Area Council. They've been actively involved in events like Cudworth Tea in the Park and have supported summer activities in the area. They've also collaborated with local schools and churches.

You might have noticed that Exodus has taken over the old Methodist Church on Barnsley Road. Alongside running one of their charity shops there, they've made sure the building remains accessible to other community groups, preserving it as a resource for the wider community.


"So many people locally have a connection with this building," said Martin. "We really wanted to make sure it didn't fall into disrepair or be converted into alternative uses that didn't benefit the local community. Our hope is that it will remain an important local hub and resource for many years to come."

Partnership is what the charity is all about. Over the years, they have supported many community groups in the region, from Brownies in Monk Bretton to Community Organisers in Shafton, delivering galas and events to improve the community and build cohesion.

Exodus's headquarters are right on our doorstep in South Hiendley. They have frequent open days and events, and readers of Barnsley Spotlight are warmly invited to come and see first-hand what the charity is all about.

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Pedaling progress

Mapplewell's new cycle track



put to great use by a long-standing community group. Greenspace Group were awarded Stronger **Communities Grant funding** following a panel meeting in early 2022. Greenspace's Treasurer Carl Snowdon, who spearheaded the project, couldn't wait to get started, having also secured funding from Co-op's Community Fund.

The group set out to make good use of the area where the tennis courts used to be situated in Mapplewell Park, a place that was looking a little neglected. The Greenspace Group engaged with the local community to make sure their plans resonated with the neighbourhood's wishes. A standout idea emerged from these discussions: creating a cycle track for young children. This initiative aimed to improve the health and well-being of our youngsters, encourage physical activity and instill early cycling skills and road safety awareness.

Once funding was agreed, visioning quickly morphed into structured site plans. Barnsley Council Parks colleagues granted permission, and before we knew it, contractors had been identified, and the groundwork was underway. It was

North Area Council funding has been very exciting when the track itself was installed. It didn't take long for the project to take shape and by September, the Greenspace Group were on hand to plant the feature roundabout with perennial shrubs.

> In May 2023, Ed Clancy, OBE, Olympic gold medallist, officially opened the cycle track in his role as South Yorkshire Active Travel Commissioner. It was a fantastic opportunity for Ed to address the children from Mapplewell Primary School, promoting the benefits of cycling for health, wellbeing, active travel and recreation.

> North Area Council Chair, Councillor Dave Leech, said: "The opening was great. The Area Council is delighted that the funding has contributed to installing a brilliant community asset. The cycle track will encourage children to be more active. The track is only a short distance from the new active travel route at the bottom of Bar Lane, and this facility will hopefully encourage more young people to cycle for recreation in their early years and continue to do so subsequently to access education and employment opportunities."

Greenspace Group has always been ambitious, and we think you will

agree that they have triumphed with this project. The cycle track is a haven for young cyclists to practise their skills and an excellent place for families to spend time together. Head over to Mapplewell Park to

When we spoke to Carl about the project, he told us: "The cycle track was a Greenspace long-term idea to encourage children at a young age to take part in cycling and gain confidence in a safe environment. It's great to see so many children enjoying the cycle path, using bikes, scooters and go-carts. The usage has been beyond our wildest dreams. The park is such a great place for children."

Jon has lived in Penistone all his life. Having been born here, he has seen Penistone grow from being a small market town to what it is today - a constantly growing and developing location bustling with lots of activity.

"It is an ever-evolving environment. There is always something different coming up," he said about being a town councillor for 17 years.

He is also keen to get involved with the wider work of the Area Team, having recently sat on the Supporting Young People Grant Panel – a Penistone Area Council grant pot for projects supporting the health and wellbeing of young people across the Penistone area.

Supporting young people is a priority Jon encourages. He felt that the summer Sports Van funded by Penistone Ward Alliance and the RampUp activity delivered in partnership with Barnsley Council's Sport and Active Recreation team earlier this year were both worthwhile projects, and he would love to see more like this offered across the Penistone area. Being involved in his local community gives Jon a feeling of satisfaction. "It feels good being part of the community," he says.

For those of you thinking about getting involved, Jon recommends that you "just give it a go. Allow yourself a good few months before deciding whether it is for you and test the water."

"I originally started a small mental health support group, which has expanded vastly over the past six months.

I'm the Chairperson, Simon Davies, and I've previously experienced problems with mental health, battling my demons with addiction. Since my recovery, I've wanted to help and support others to become better versions of themselves.

I'm passionate about building a positive local community that provides a safe space for all with opportunities to improve physical and mental health. These are what drove me to start the group, to begin with. Since then, many volunteers have joined forces to create the Hoyland Social and Support Group with a wide range of activities for all.

The group has recently achieved success in their funding applications to two Barnsleybased funding sources: £1,612.60 from Barnsley Better Bonds and

£1,500 from the Hoyland Milton and Rockingham Ward Alliance. This funding will be used for various purposes, including sustaining their weekly activities, supporting their newly established support hub, and organising additional community events, such as the Family Fun Day held in July.

We're also working alongside Barnsley Council's Community Development Officer and receiving one-to-one support from South Yorkshire Funding Advice Bureau to look at how they can expand and become more sustainable.

We currently see around 80-100 attendees at our activities each week, and I see us helping so many more people in the future. It's nice to see so many experiencing so much happiness through our group and know we are slowly combatting loneliness and isolation across our community."
