Issues Considered by the Barnsley Schools Forum During 2022/2023

As part of its role both as a consultee and decision-taker in matters concerning education and school funding, the Forum considered the following:

- Regular monitoring of Schools and Early Years Education Budgets (2023/2023) including variations in expenditure; school balances and reserves.
- High Needs Block funding, including Barnsley Council's management plan for tackling the deficit and bringing expenditure to within the agreed resource envelope by the end of the 2024/25 financial year. This included consideration of the Council's involvement in the Department for Education's 'Safety Valve' intervention programme, aimed at closing the current deficit in the High Needs Block budget and to help develop a more sustainable system for meeting the education needs of vulnerable young people in accordance with the Government's national Special Educational Needs and Alternative Provision Improvement Plan and Road Map, published earlier this year.
- As part of this, quarterly reports continued to be considered on the sufficiency of education provision for children and young people with special educational needs, together with the measures taken to ensure more school places are created within local mainstream and special settings as well as to support their wellbeing whilst at school and improve attainment.
- The outcome of Barnsley Council's consultation with schools on proposed changes to the local schools funding formula, including the criteria for awarding funding to schools and settings which operated from multiple or split sites.
- The Borough's funding settlement for schools during the period 2023/2024, including allocations to the Schools Block; Early Years Block and High Needs Block, together with arrangements for the continued funding of school improvement activity and both statutory and historic commitments including school admissions, education welfare, eligibility for free school meals, pension costs and teaching staff cover.

Performance and Critical Success Factors

Whilst the Barnsley School Forum does not have a specific set of its own critical success factors or indicators of its own performance, the Forum does perform a valuable role in supporting the following outcomes within the Council Plan:

Learning Barnsley (LB07): Secondary School Attendance.	Amber (at 90.0% we remain in step with the National and Regional Average, but just below our local target
Learning Barnsley (LB07): The percentage of primary, secondary and special schools/settings within Barnsley that are judged 'Good' or 'Outstanding' by Ofsted	Green ((81.1% of our schools are judged to be either 'Good' or 'Outstanding'. This equates to 81.1% of primary schools and 70% of our secondary schools. Our special provision is judged to be 'Outstanding'
Learning Barnsley (LB12): Percentage of Young People Aged 16-18 not in education, employment or training	Green (at 4.1% this is better than the local target and both the National and Regional Average)
Learning Barnsley (LB11): Number of fixed-term exclusions or suspensions in all schools	Red (a total of 1,941 suspensions were recorded during this period)
Healthy Barnsley (HB12): Free School Meals	Amber (take-up during this period equated to 75%)
