To realise this vision, Wellspring Academy Trust and Barnsley Council are proposing the following:


- 1. We are proposing that the number on roll at Springwell Special School be extended to 132.
- 2. We are proposing that 16 pupils be based at a newly refurbished satellite in Kendray.



### **Springwell Special Academy**

Part of Wellspring Academy Trust Springwell Special Academy procross-phase education for chilwith complex and enduring semotional and mental heal difficulties (SEMH).



### The Kendray Centre

To facilitate growth, Barnsley Council are investing in a significant refurbishment of a site in Kendray.

The site is currently used by pupils who attend Springwell Alternative Academy.

Once complete, the centre will also be equipped to accommodate two groups of eight pupils with an Education, Health and Care Plan. The accommodation available to pupils at the centre will include:

- Nurture classrooms, including a dedicated work area and quiet area for each group of pupils.
- A fully equipped food tech room to support vocational training.
- A multi-skills room to facilitate arts, crafts and other activities.
- A dedicated break / lunchtime area.
- Dedicated toilets.
- Meeting spaces for staff, professionals and parents.



### **Admissions Process**

We are not proposing to change the school's admissions process. Children will continue to be admitted to the Academy via statutory consultation in line with the school's existing policy.

### Safeguarding

The Kendray site has been used by Springwell Learning Community for many years. The site has a secure boundary with pupils entering and leaving through a designated gate. Once on site, pupils have a dedicated entrance where they are met by staff members. Visitors are greeted at a staffed reception where visitors are required to sign in and out of the building. The school will complete a range of risk assessments to ensure the safety of children and other users.

### **Local Area Impact**

The vast majority of pupils travel to school via taxis and minibuses, which will drop them on the main road. Start and finish times will be staggered with the neighbouring primary school. The additional staff members will park their cars in the nearby industrial estate where the school has allocated parking.

### **Timescales**

If all approvals are given, pupils will start transitioning to the site later in the term. This will be a phased process agreed between the school and parents.
