- 3. Have your staff and councillors been trained in disability awareness, including the social model of disability?

Yes, Barnsley Council has provided disability awareness training to staff and councillors, which includes reference to the social model of disability. This is embedded within our Equality, Diversity and Inclusion (EDI) e-learning offer and is further supported by guidance and training materials across services.

- 4. Do your equality impact assessments include reference to the social model of disability and its implications for policy decisions?
 - The EIA toolkit and guidance notes both reflect the principles of the social model, even if the term itself is not always used. They emphasise:
- The need to treat people differently to achieve equality of outcome.
- The importance of recognising and removing barriers that individuals may face.
- The role of policy in creating a level playing field
