 Outcomes: how many were found in favour of the parent/guardian vs. the Council.

For the period August 2024 to August 2025, 21 outcomes are recorded. 3 were in favour of parent, 2 were conceded, 13 were agreed via consent order, and 3 were vacated.

The council did not collate statistics prior to 2024 so it would require a manual search through all final order documents to determine and record the outcome. It is envisaged that to do this would exceed the cost limit of £450, equivalent to 18 hours of staff time and as such Section 12(1) of the Freedom of Information Act is applied.

To provide the outcomes in a statistical format it would require each pupil file to be looked into, identify relevant final orders and then read through this order to determine the outcome and record this. For each file this may take 15-20 minutes. As the request covers multiple years this would add up to exceed 18 hours of staff time. If you were to reduce the scope of your request, selecting a smaller time period, then this may make the request manageable within the cost limit.

• Total legal costs incurred by Barnsley MBC in defending these tribunals (annual breakdown).

No legal costs are incurred as tribunals are managed by the EHC Team staff.

4. School Placement

As at the end of August 2025, 101 children and young people were awaiting a specialist placement. All either remained on the roll of a mainstream setting or had alternative

At the end of August 2025, 39 children and young people were awaiting provision in comparison to 18 in August 2024,14 in August 2023 and 9 in August 2022. The majority of these cases are recent transfers into the area. Where a specialist place is required, these cases are also included in the number provided above. Data is not available prior to August 2022.
