## Re: Request for Information – Freedom of Information Act 2000

I wish to confirm that the council has completed its search for the information which you requested.

The information requested and our findings are as follows: -

I am writing to request information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 regarding the Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) which I understand your Council operates. Please can you provide the following:

1. Does the Council exercise discretion in cases where homeowners developing their own homes for personal use (such as extensions, annex, self-build) have submitted a CIL form late (e.g. an exemption form or commencement notice), and not charged the the full CIL?

We do not currently use the Community Infrastructure Levy CIL/CIL forms. In Barnsley.

S106 is the mechanism used for obtaining financial contributions. Generally, S106 contributions are not required for extensions, annex, or self-build developments.
